# UMPIRES REPORT.

Ladies.

Once again I can report that most Clubs honoured their obligations in respect of umpires listed each week.

However, the Association is still faced with a shortage of badged umpires. During the last season, Clubs were asked for the names of those desiring tests but few were submitted, and quite often when an umpire was listed for testing she was not available. Again, lectures were arranged but no one attended. In respect of lectures, I feel that the perhaps the individual feels freer to ask questions amongst her own team-mates than in an Association group. Last season I did take three Clubs privately and each had a good attendance and some interesting discussions took place. I will readily lecture any Club but would appreciate early applications so that I may fit lectures in with my other commitments.

To those who would wish to try for higher honours I recommend that you umpire every Saturday. Actual umpiring is the best teacher. You will make mistakes, problems will arise but make a note of these after each game and then bring them along to me. Discussion will help iron out such a lot. You may even query a higher umpire a decision during a game - you must accept that during the match but come along later and talk it over, but do remember that the umpire on the spot, concentrating on the game and applying the advantage rule will most probably be right. No umpire is perfect but I feel sure all our Hadged umpires will readily assist you if approached in the right spirit. There is no short cut to higher grade honours, it means years of umpiring to reach the top. Remember umpiring is an integral part of your sport, you could not play without umpires and the better the umpires the more enjoyable the game. Then again if you umpire you must get a better insight into the rules, you will wonder why a player continually fouls or gets offside and this should make an impression on your own play.

The 1965 All Australia Theory Examination saw 106 candidates sit (one less than last year) but again over half were from the Teachers' Colleges. Passes dropped slightly despite a relatively easy paper.
