GROUNDS COMMITTEE AND PUBLICITY OFFICER'S REPORT.

Ladies,

I hereby present the report on behalf of the Grounds Committee and also on Publicity.

With all twelve fields available last season it was back to a better time table. The fields are certainly not all that could be desired but we are fortunate to have them all in the one area and at a more than reasonable rental.

This coming season there will be two new fields available at the end of Noble Street. These will have to be marked with equipment provided. I'm hoping these two fields can be used by Secondary Schools mid-week.

All nets need attention and some back and front boards need attention. Once again we see shelter pavilions in need of paint and just who is to do this? I have requested the B.C.C. to paint the canteen and dressing room buildings.

I would still like to see the B.W.H.A. erect its own office in front of the Dressing room. Clubs, generally speaking, have co-operated as far as keeping off fields 5 and 6 for training, but every Saturday a number of players use these good areas for warming up purposes.

Night training is mainly for stickwork and physical training, and for these purposes the lightning is adequate - not for the playing of games - it then becomes dangerous.

I would like to see some form of organised car parking - here again it needs a person to be early on the job and after a time I feel players and patrons will become conscious of parking to enable the other person access or exit.

PUBLICITY.

Mid-week publicity was good as Women's hockey received 85% of headlines. It would be appreciated if A grade clubs would provide the christian as well as the surname of each player in the top team. With the continued changing of team personnel I cannot keep up with it - in consequence you see the same names appearing - it is good to write up matches for the following week if you have some names.

Sunday publicity or lack of space was a real headache and I must ask the Association President or Secretary, or all club secretaries to keep complaining to the Editor if it continues next year. Softball sent dozens of letters, clubs, spectators etc., and they really get space.



I can only write it - always three games - I do not have any influence, nor does any reporter.

COACHING

I would remind the Secretary of my recommendation re Brisbane training.

"Brisbane team members to be available for training prior to club training."
