PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I started my fifth year as President on a fairly poor note by not turning up to the AGM for my election. This of course was not by choice, and I thank Jenny Tidey for filling in to chair the 1996 AGM with the shortest possible notice. Jenny deputised for me on a couple of other occasions during the year, and I thank her very sincerely for helping me out so capably.

It was my expressed intention to make 1997 my last year as BWA President. I advised both Management and Council of this at the beginning of the year. I have always believed that five years is the ideal term for a President. I served five years as Junior President, and felt happy when I left that I had achieved the goals I had set for myself and the association in my term. Because of the time I have had to devote to help achieve a State Hockey Centre during my term as BWA President, I find I am about six months short of being able to leave office satisfied with my work, and consequently will stand again at this AGM. I am able to do this because of the recommendations which came from the "Beyond 2000" workshop which was held in August this year. This strategic planning workshop was facilitated by specialist consultant Jane Keating, and recommended that a new structure be put in place to run BWA, as the tasks and functions of the association have changed markedly since the present constitution was written, and a new structure was required to allow the association to run efficiently. It is intended that a completely new Constitution and By-Laws be written by the Constitution Committee in the off-season, and that this document be presented at the first Council Meeting of 1998 for comment by the clubs, and a final version with necessary amendments be adopted at the March general meeting. This being so, all positions will be declared vacant, and a new election held immediately. The outcome of this process of restructure will have a large bearing on my continued involvement with BWA.

The Secretary Sue McLean has chronicled the various happenings of BWA for the past year in her report, so I do not intend to duplicate that process here. I do wish however to personally thank my executive members Sue McLean and Mary Cockings, the BWA

Management Committee, Junior Association, sub-committees, officials, coaches, umpires, and staff of BWA, for the amount of time given to the work of the association. These people along with other members who volunteer for the many tasks which have to be done, give many hours of work to the association which could it never afford if it had to pay them. Even though we have some paid staff, these people also put in many many hours in voluntary capacities, and their dedication to the game is to be admired and commended. The Management Committee has put in a superhuman effort fulfilling many roles, doing all sorts of tasks, and giving many hours to planning and meetings. The Junior Association, all of the sub-committees and officials, both junior and senior, has done an amazing job to keep this very large association well organised.

Many people worked in multiple roles. The new Junior President Tracey O'Connor took on an enormous task to oversee the ever expanding Junior Association with a fairly new committee and did the job very well even though I know there were times when she found the going fairly hard. She also managed Brisbane teams as well as being the Queensland Under 18 Manager. The Treasurer Mary Cockings acted as convenor of the State Hockey Centre canteen as well as officiating on the technical bench for many of the matches on the turf. Lyn Thomas, not only, did the vital job of Match Secretary, but also was Downey Park Umpires Steward, officiated on the technical bench for the League, State Championships, and fixtures, and even assisted in the SHC canteen when needed. I will not go on, as it is impossible to mention and thank everyone individually. If you read this report you will see some names popping up in the various sections again and again. There is no doubt BWA has some of the most experienced and dedicated volunteers in any sporting organisation, and I thank you all on behalf of the players whose enjoyment of the game you make possible.

I would be remiss however if I did not mention the retirement of our longest serving Management member Jenny Tidey. Jeanette Alyson Tidey has been on the Management Committee of BWA for over twenty years. She has been the President of BWA, and President of the Junior Association. At various times Jenny has been in charge of the House Committee and the Grounds Committee, and has served on many of the other sub-committees of BWA. In fact, when we talk about BWA fixtures, some people think we are talking about Jenny. Jenny Tidey and Downey Park are synonymous. She has served as a delegate and committee member on the Queensland Women's Amateur Sports Council, which is responsible for the Downey Park lease. She was the Management member in charge of the Grounds Committee during the time when the sprinkler system was initially expanded to all fields, when Fields 7 and 8 were built up and returfed and leveled, (Field 7 by some 18 inches or 45 cm - a major undertaking), when fields 10 and 11 were realigned to run North-South instead of East-West, and when drainage installed under fields 11 and 12 to make them playable. Prior to this the smallest amount of rain would put them out of commission. A little known fact is that Jenny is also the Licencee of the clubhouse bar. She has been a player here since the beginning, and has never missed a season. She was a member of that great legendary club of the past, Taxation, and has been instrumental in the creation of what I believe will be one of the great clubs of the future Kedron Wavell. To Jenny Tidey, Life Member, past President, administrator, committee member, player, umpire, worker, and friend, thank you for all your time as a member of the BWA Management Committee. I know your involvement with BWA has not ended, but an era has passed with your retirement from the Management Committee of BWA. Your contribution to BWA over the years has been immeasurable, and all members both past and future are in your debt.

To all the Brisbane players who have achieved representative honours in the last twelve months congratulations. BWA is particularly proud our newest Australian representative Kelly Free who has represented Australia at various tournaments both in Australia and overseas. To the umpires who have been awarded badges, congratulations also. Michele Arnold continues to achieve at international level, and once again a Brisbane umpire was awarded an Australian badge when Alyson Aleksic gained her badge at the national Under 21 tournament this year. To all those many members, who have become engaged, married, welcomed a new addition to their family, my congratulations. To those who have suffered illness and bereavement, our sincere best wishes and sympathy. In conclusion I wish everyone a Happy Christmas. Have a restful festive season so that you can come back ready and full of energy for what I hope will be an interesting and enjoyable 1998.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

My third year as secretary and to re-iterate every volunteer in sports' lament - "it doesn't get any easier". The 1996 Annual General Meeting went ahead on schedule minus the President and Secretary. Ronda Nix was unfortunately not well and I was enjoying the hardest day of my Nepalese trek (9 hours of walking in the rain and mud - all uphill). Thank you to Jenny Tidey who ably stepped in and did a great job.

Each and every year as we seek to improve, expand and do things better more "work" is created. On the other side of the coin the number of volunteers to do this "work" has declined drastically. This creates an imbalance, which has led to the payment of administrators, coaches, trainers' etc. to do the "work". This in turn has caused a cash flow situation where the "cost of the game" has increased. How do we pay for everything - gather corporate monies? From whom and how much? - a challenging task! The other alternative is to have a user pay system whereby the costs are passed directly onto players. I could quote a current developing players parent's estimate that the cost in one year could be as much as \$10,000 (inclusive of representative team costs).

Nevertheless the game of hockey in Brisbane is growing and again we have had some great highs and a few lows in 1997.

New and noteworthy happenings in 1997

- Divisions 3, 8 and 9 were expanded to include 10 teams (normally 8 teams per division). Division 3 had a five-way play-off at the end of the season. There was no Division 10 this season.
- Introduction of a Monday Masters competition at the SHC, for players over 35 years of age. Six teams were registered this year.

- The "Drop Off Rule" was used for the first time in finals. At the completion of full time an extra 6 minutes each way is played. Sudden death applies for the following 6 minutes with nine players, then 6 minutes with seven players. If a decision is not reached then a series of shootouts occur (5 per team), whereby the attacker starts with the ball on the 25 yd line, the goalkeeper on the goal line. The striker then has 15 seconds to get the ball in the net, or the goalkeeper clears from the circle, or the ball goes out of play. I feel it is a very successful situation, having watched teams in the President's Cup go right down to the shoot outs and I was fortunate (!) to have to play in the situation for the grand final - we Vets got a result with seven players each on the field. An exhausting but satisfying occasion.
- Griffith University 1 (Division 6) was the only undefeated team in the Competition this season.
- BWA hosted a wet Qld Open Championship at the SHC over the May long weekend, winning the title for the 36th consecutive time.
- The SHC was the venue for the final of the International Series between Australia, New Zealand, China and the Australian Senior Youth Team. Australia defeated China 6 - 0 in the final.
- The Brisbane Satellites (Development Team) won the Bronze Medal at the Arafura Games held in Darwin in May.
- The Southern Cross competition was extended to veterans in 1997. Two separate days were used in May to complete the two divisions of this competition. The Halley family of Ipswich donated the trophies. They were very appropriate trophies being old hockey sticks stripped and polished up with winning plaques for the winners on the flat side of the stick.
- BWA sent a team to the Under 16 Invitational Tournament - Division 2 in Melbourne. This is the first occasion that BWA has sent a team to this tournament.
- Potchefstroom University from Johannesburg South Africa toured here in July and played against four club sides - Kedron Wavell, Ascot, Valley and Easts.
- New BWA representative uniform was designed by Jodi Kohn (Easts) and produced by our sponsor Rixon Clothing. It is cherry coloured skorts with a cherry shirt with Brisbane written across the bust (in yellow) with royal blue on the shoulder. The alternative strip has a white shoulder. The open Brisbane 1 team had their surname across the back of the shoulder and they were able to keep the shirt at the conclusion of the Open Championship.
- BWA produced a monthly newsletter this year. Five editions were printed and distributed to all players and personnel. General comments about the newsletter were positive and hopefully this can be continued and be expanded.
- BWA held a forum in August to workshop the changes, which need to occur, and the directions BWA needs to take after the Year 2000.
- The Junior Development Program Fundraising Committee hosted a dinner. This successful event was held in August for the first time. The Under 16 team for Melbourne tournament was announced at this dinner.
- Jim Northcott ran the Hockey Shop for the Juniors - this year aligning with Amart Sports Store for stock.
- Amber Worth designed a database program, which will assist in the collation of information. It is now up and running thanks to Trisha Doolan who did the data entry and to Rose Pappalardo, who as Registration Officer assisted, in the checking.
- Ronda Nix equalled Kelly Free's number of stamps in her passport this year. Ronda completing trips to England in May and New Zealand in October.

- Gail Austen OAM, BWA Patron, was named Telstra's Australian and Queensland Businesswoman of the Year.
- Renita Garard (Valley) played with the Telstra Hockeyroos winning the Champions Trophy in Germany in June.
- Kelly Free (St Andrews) played in the Telstra Hockeyroos when they won the Indira Gandhi Trophy in India and the Korea Cup in Seoul and the International Series held in Melbourne and Brisbane. Kelly also played against Germany in March.
- Tammy Cole (AIS/Valley) played in the Telstra Hockeyroos against Germany in March.
- Australian Under 18 Representatives who played in the Rose Quaid Trophy in New Zealand were Wendy Alcorn (Easts), Nicole Patton (St Andrews), Hope Brown (Valley), Vicki Perna (Easts) and Angie Skirving (Valley).
- Robyn Andersen (Easts) and Noreen Walton (Commercial) were Australian Veteran Representatives coming second at the tournament in Hong Kong.
- Kerrie Schmidt (Valley) named "Player of the Series" at the Australian Under 21 Championship in Sydney.
- Vicky Perna (Easts) named "Player of the Series" at the Australian Under 18 Championships in Launceston.
- Anne-Marie Callow (Commercial) received the Presidents 1997 Division 1 Best and Fairest Medal - for the second year in succession.
- Michele Arnold (Ascot) was named the "1996 Umpire of the Year" at Hockey Queensland's inaugural Awards Dinner held in March. Michele also umpired at the Olympic Qualifying Tournament held in Zimbabwe in August.
- Alyson Aleksic (Kedron Wavell) gained her Australian Umpiring Badge at the Australian Under 21 Championships in Sydney in June.
- Mary Cockings, BWA Treasurer and Easts President, received Life Membership of Queensland Women's Amateur Sports Council.
- Daphne Pirie was elected as Vice President of the Queensland Olympic Council in April

1997 SYNOPSIS

PRE - SEASON

- Summer competitions were run at the SHC for 6-a-side (men & women), veterans women and mixed from October to mid February.
- The AGM of the State Hockey Centre was finally completed in December with Ronda Nix elected Treasurer and Ros Julien on the Board.
- Again the off season was spent on hockey administration and organisation. The correspondence continues to arrive all year round.
- The Southern Cross Hockey League was again administered by BWA and held during February and March for a third season, showcasing elite and talented players in South- East Queensland. The Toowoomba *Chill* defeated the Gold Coast *Gypsies* 2 - 0 in the final. Brisbane *Swifts* finished 3rd, Sunshine Coast *Warriors* 4th, Ipswich *Top Guns* 5th and Brisbane *Scorpions* 6th. Player of the Series was Anne-Marie Callow (Commercial) who was drafted and played with the Gold Coast *Gypsies*.
- Due to hockey's sole use of Field 1 at Downey Park the Grounds Committee was able to tend to its needs in the summer growing season and at the beginning of the

season it was looking a picture. Players were appreciative of the better surface. It's a pity more fields cannot undergo the same procedure, but with softball on the park in the summer months we are unable to do ground maintenance in the summer season.

- The first management meeting for 1997 - an all day saga was held Saturday 18 January, concluding the agenda on the following Tuesday evening.
- The first Council meeting was held on Tuesday 28 January where the BWA Hockey Administrators "Bible" was distributed. The club secretaries and club delegates are the unsung heroes who volunteer to be the communication link between BWA and the players. I thank you for the job you do so effectively. Keep that communication flowing.
- In February BWA members enjoyed the Joyce Lester testimonial dinner held at the Park Royal. Joyce, who is retiring from representative softball, was a Valley hockey player.

MARCH

- The Satellite Squad of development players continued to train at the SHC in February & March under the guidance of Kerrie Richards and Greg Richards.
- The turf fixtures for Divisions 1, 2 & 3 commenced at the SHC and Redcliffe on the weekend commencing 21 March.
- The initial planning meeting was held in preparation for hosting the Queensland Open Championship in May.

APRIL

- Downey Park fixtures for Divisions 4 - 9 and Veterans commenced on Saturday 5 April. The Monday Masters (Veterans Competition) at the SHC commenced on Monday 14 April.
- The Brisbane Blades held a dinner at the Convention Centre on 19 April at which BWA was represented.
- The inaugural 1st Veteran's Southern Cross was held in Ipswich on Sunday 20 April. Three Brisbane teams were entered.
- The players Familiarisation Examination paper commencement date was Saturday 26 April - see the players results further in this report.
- Players in the Queensland U18 which finished 2nd at the Australian Championship in Launceston were Vicky Perna (Easts), named "Player of the Series", Wendy Alcorn (Easts), Jean Brown (Commercial), Therese Gates (Ascot), Nicole Patton (St Andrews) with coach Jill Smith (Easts) and manager Tracey O'Connor (Kedron Wavell).

MAY

- BWA had waited 14 years to host the Open Championship and the weather did not come to the party! Nevertheless two days of matches were played without cancellations. A memorable time was had standing under one of the many tents with the Ipswich ladies late on Sunday evening, the raining pouring down commiserating with them on their defeat by Gladstone - placing them in the relegation final!
Monday morning dawned with very wet turfs and unplayable grass fields. What to do? It was imperative that the relegation finals in Divisions 1 and 2 were played,

plus the final of Division 2 and it would be fitting to have a winner of Division 1. Brisbane 3 by results of their early matches had an unbeatable lead in Division 3, thereby claiming the crown and promotion to Division 2 for next year.

Congratulations team, it was a pity you did not get your chance to show 'em on the turf!!! Well done Coach Trevor Sunderland (Valley) and captain Kea Pardon (Commercial) and congratulations to Michelle Irwin (Easts) being named "Player of Division 3". At about 10.30am the hoped for break in the weather appeared, let's get on with the hockey! Teams were rightfully disappointed that they didn't get to play their final game. Congratulations to Sunshine Coast winners of Division 2.

Miraculously the Division 1 final started on time (Toowoomba v Brisbane 1).

Brisbane 1 were hoping to continue the winning way of past teams. Brisbane 1 has won this championship consecutively since 1962 a total of 35 years (sharing the title on three occasions), and the team did not wish to lose in front of a home crowd. Neil Hawgood (Valley), coach, had his team firing well. An added boost on the bench for the final was Kelly Free (St Andrews) returning from her duty with the Hockeyroos on Sunday evening. Not a bad sub to have! Thankfully the team combined and displayed some great skill to defeat Toowoomba 3 - 0. Player of the final was Meagan "Wedgie" Thomas (St Andrews) and Division 1 Player of the Tournament Anne-Marie "Ammo" Callow (Commercial). Plaudits to these two players who were respectively the vice captain and captain of the successful Brisbane 1 team.

Brisbane 2 coached by Lesley Schoenwald (Ascot), who appeared from her sick bed at match time played admirably to finish equal 5th, notably retaining their place in Division 1. Captain Sharon Wagner (Easts) and Vice Captain Narelle Baker (Valley) were pleased with the team's efforts. Brisbane 4 coached by Kym Roberson (Commercial) and captained by Liz Pike (Kedron Wavell) finished 2nd in Division 4, only being defeated by Brisbane 3.

The efforts of the hospitality team at this championship cannot go unmentioned, with flimsy tents, water on electrical cords and a quagmire underfoot Joyce Proctor ably led the troops. Food, crockery and cutlery 'were a flying' in the tent as great delicacies were presented to the visitors. I am sure Joyce would like me to thank the clubs who provided the wonderful food and to the dedicated helpers who probably wrecked their footwear in the mud but didn't mind.

- The final of the Telstra International Series was held at the SHC. What a joy to watch the spectacular Hockeyroos in action against China, New Zealand and the Senior Youth Team. Who will ever forget the astounding Alyson Annan's play in the second half of the final against China. To watch her incredible skills performed at amazing speeds. Keep on dreaming.... we would all love to be able to do that!!!! Women's Hockey Australia gave the crowds a commentator. His performance and interpretation of play were interesting! Nevertheless it added another feature to the competition. Australia soundly defeated the Chinese 6 - 0 in the final.
- The Brisbane Satellites (junior development team) travelled to Darwin for the Arafura Games where they took out the Bronze Medal by defeating Brunei 1 - 0
- Brisbane 1 took out the Division 1 Veterans Southern Cross. The 2nd round of matches was held at the SHC on 25 May.
- The fixture book re-emerged this year (at the end of May) and will continue to be produced. Sorry it was a bit late and hopefully it can be published earlier next year.
- The State Hockey Centre underwent a restructure and the new board took over the reins in May. The board consists of Gerry Garard (Chairman), Robert Lockhart (Deputy Chairman), Jim Quaitte (Secretary), Andrew Young (Treasurer) and board

members Anita Cross, Don Hicks, Phil McAlpine, Denise McManus and Ronda Nix. Tony Clarke was appointed Manager of the SHC.

- Hockey Queensland did not send a team to the Trans Tasman tournament this year, however Meagan Thomas, Nikki Taylor and Nicole McMahon were invited to play with the New Zealand team in New Zealand.

JUNE

- Four teams were entered in the Queensland Veteran Championship in Rockhampton over the June long weekend. Players enjoyed the country hospitality. Results were a little disappointing but with Brisbane hosting this event in 1998, there is room for improvement. Brisbane 1 finished 5th in Division 1, Brisbane 2 - 6th in Div 2, Brisbane 3 - 2nd in Div 3 (goal difference decided the two teams), Brisbane 4 - 6th in Div 3. Wendy Offer (Redcliffe) playing with Brisbane 3, was named "Player of Division 3". Players selected in QLD teams: 35+ team - Robyn Andersen (Easts) captain, Judy Blyth (St Andrews), Noreen Walton (Commercial); 40+ team - Sue Mott (Redcliffe) and Melda Dunning (Valley); 45+ team - Diana Petrey (St Andrews) vice captain, Donna Smith (St Andrews), Ros Julien (South West United).
- Lucy Moxon (University) received her 'State B' umpiring Badge at the Veterans in Rockhampton.
- The Queensland Under 21 team finished third in the Australian Championship held in Sydney. Brisbane players in this side being Kerrie Schmidt (Valley) named "Player of the Series", Laretta Roebuck (Easts), Hope Brown (Valley), Jean Brown (Commercial), Kirsten Barney (Easts), Suzie Faulkner (Commercial), Nicole Patton (St Andrews), Jo Piccolo (Valley), Rebecca Richard-Preston (Valley), Laine Usher (Easts), Renae van Schagen (St Andrews), Erin Smyth (Easts) and Angie Skirving (Valley). The team was coached by Lesley Schoenwald from Ascot and managed by Cathy Taylor (St Andrews).
- BWA clubs were issued with Hockey Queensland Raffle tickets (65 books in total) and most clubs sold their quota and received their small financial reward for selling the tickets.
- Rosanna Pappalardo, BWA's Administration Assistant completed her traineeship with the successful completion of her Certificate II in Sports Administration and Recreation Course. Well done Rosanna.

JULY

- Due to the number of representative players away on rep duties, and divisions consisting of 10 teams, the President's Cup competition had to be delayed until Sunday 13 July. Sunday morning, Downey Park was the venue for Divisions 4 - Veterans, whilst Sunday afternoon the SHC was the venue for Divisions 1, 2 & 3. St Andrews were victorious over Valley (3-1) in the Division 1 final.
- Potchefstroom University near Johannesburg, South Africa played matches against Kedron Wavell (1-0), Ascot (4-2), Valley (2-2) and Easts (5-0). The Brisbane Clubs having the upper hand in all matches.
- Brisbane sent an Under 18 team to the International Challenge Games in Toowoomba in late July losing 3 - 0 to Potchefstroom in the final.
- The first Under 18 Southern Cross was held in Gympie with BWA sending three teams.

- A pleasant evening was had at the Downey Park Clubhouse on Saturday 16 August. The Junior Development Program Fundraising Committee held a dinner. Jim Northcott was MC, guest speakers included Craig McLatchey, the Secretary General of the Australian Olympic Committee and Robert Pearson, Secretary/Manager of the Metropolitan Harness Racing Club, Rocklea. The Junior Development Program Fundraising Committee deserves to be sincerely thanked for their efforts in 1997. The Roebuck, Sunderland, Kohn, Cameron and Hawthorne families can take a bow. A job well done!
- Late August saw the completion of fixtures and the awarding of minor Premiership trophies to teams at Downey Park. Congratulations to all winning teams.
- The Queensland *Scorchers* played in the Women's National Hockey League. Preliminary matches played in Hobart and Melbourne. The *Scorchers* had not been beaten and finished in third place (too many drawn matches). They qualified for the semi final against Western Australia on 24 October.

SEPTEMBER

- The traditional month for finals where efforts are rewarded and lack of effort is cursed.
- The BWA Awards dinner was held at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre on Saturday 6 September, a great venue. A full audited account of BWA's financial situation will be handed out at the Annual General Meeting, which will fully detail our current financial situation. I look forward to presenting same, and answering any questions members may have.

STATE HOCKEY CENTRE ASSOCIATION INC

Many changes have been made at the State Hockey Centre in the past twelve months. After a fairly difficult end of 1996 which saw the relationships between the Full Member Associations which make up the State Hockey Centre Association fairly strained, commonsense prevailed and a new structure was put in place to allow the Board of Management of the State Hockey Centre to be controlled independently of the Full Member Associations.

Previously the Board consisted of nine members, four from Hockey Queensland, two from Brisbane Women's Hockey Association, two from Brisbane Hockey Association, with one non aligned person of good standing in the business community. An executive was elected from these nine members of the Board, of which the Chairman and Deputy Chair were from Hockey Queensland and the Treasurer and Secretary from BHA and BWA.

While this structure was a good one when all associations were working together to lobby for the funding to build the centre, once the centre was built and operating, this format made it difficult for the Board to make independent business decisions for the benefit of the Centre, as the executive were all responsible to other Boards of Management. When deadlocks occurred and the non-aligned member's vote broke the deadlock, that person was put in an unenviable position, and became the subject of some very unfounded criticism if one of the associations did not agree with the Board's decision.

The State Hockey Centre Board of Management sought professional advice, and the Australian Institute of Management did a management audit, and presented a report which recommended a restructure. To the credit of the associations, the recommendations were implemented, and the State Hockey Centre now has a new constitution and a Board of Management with an independent Chairman and Deputy Chairman. The total Board comprises six independent members with particular business expertise, and one representative from each of the three Full Member Associations, i.e. Hockey Queensland, BHA, and BWA. This makes decisions on a purely business basis possible, and will ensure that the Centre is well run.

Progress is being made at the Centre. A full time Manager has been appointed. This was a recommendation of the original feasibility study, and was endorsed by the AIM report. Funding has been obtained to complete the clubhouse in 1998, and plans for further development are already in the pipeline. It is the aim of the current Board to make the Queensland State Hockey Centre the premier hockey venue in the country. There will be some initial pain for the associations as they come to grips with the realities of getting the State Hockey Centre on a sound financial footing, but in the long run the players in Brisbane and Queensland will have a Centre to be proud of, and which will be their own.

I am proud of the part I have played and continue to play in making this dream a reality. If you never put your hand up and try to achieve anything, you can protect yourself from the multitude of armchair critics who do nothing themselves, but are all equipped with 20-20 hindsight. I have never let a fear of failure stop me trying to do things, nor let setbacks and criticism stop me achieving the goals I set for myself. You cannot make an omelette unless you break a few eggs. The vision of a Hockey Centre has been achieved, and it will only get better.

SPONSORSHIP AND MARKETING REPORT

Under the current BWA constitutional structure, all management members are allocated a portfolio by the President after their election to the Management Committee. As alluded to, in my President's Report, this structure is less than ideal, and this is well and truly demonstrated by the way the portfolio of Promotion and Marketing had to be handled in 1997.

After the election of the Management Committee at the AGM in October 1996, it was apparent that there was no member of the Management Committee with either the time during working hours, or the necessary business and public relations skills, to take on this most important portfolio. As there was no sub-committee elected to do the job either, the portfolio thus became an adjunct role for the President, which was not the most effective

way to handle such a critical area of the business of the association. It is always desirable that the President be involved at certain times in this portfolio, as there are people who would rather meet and deal with the President than with committee members. As this portfolio has the major influence on the "face" the association presents to the outside world, the input and approval of the President is vital. This does not mean however that the President should handle the portfolio singlehandedly, without a properly functioning sub-committee chaired by the management member whose responsibility of this vital area should be. This leads to the job being done in an ad hoc manner, which does not achieve the best result for the association. While various people assisted me during the year, and much work was done in this area, it is true that had I been able to dedicate myself fully to this role and no other, with a sub-committee responsible for this area and no other, much more could have been done for the association. Lucy Moxon came onto the Management Committee during the year, and after discussion with me agreed to be allocated this portfolio. As this was not really her area of expertise, and as she was on a steep learning curve regarding the BWA Management Committee's work, Lucy felt unable to continue with the responsibility for the portfolio, but agreed to assist me whenever possible, as have all Management members.

Perhaps it is because it is not well understood what is expected of this sub-committee that there are not more takers for the positions. I do not for one moment believe that there is not the necessary talent amongst our members to do the job. Perhaps this report may demonstrate what areas the sub-committee should be covering and some of the tasks associated with it.

The first opportunity for promotion of the association and our sponsors arose with the Southern Cross Hockey League in February/March. Licences for two teams were paid from sponsorship monies provided by Schweppes and Streets Ice Cream. The Schweppes Scorpions were outfitted with new cherry *Dr Pepper* shirts and caps supplied by Schweppes. These were worn with navy skorts and navy socks. The Streets Swifts wore uniforms in the Streets Ice Cream colours of blue red and white with the Streets logo sewn on their shirts. The final of the Southern Cross Hockey League was held at the State Hockey Centre. As Schweppes are the major sponsors of the League, the ball girls and umpires were attired in Schweppes shirts and caps for the final. The umpires were outfitted in navy Schweppes *Sport* + shirts with grey skirts and navy socks. The *Sport* + logo was very visible to the crowd at all times, and was a good promotion for our sponsors. Advertisements for all our sponsors were placed in the Southern Cross League program which was sold during the five weeks of the round games in Gympie, Ipswich, Toowoomba, and the State Hockey Centre and announcements at the venues acknowledged the team sponsors at all games. Hospitality for all League sponsors was provided at the Final at the State Hockey Centre on 24th March, where the State Manager of Schweppes, Mr Geoff Harris presented the Southern Cross Cup and medals to the winning team.

The BWA Fixture Book was published at the beginning of the season with many advertisements from BWA and club sponsors. This publication was a combined senior and junior fixture book, with a potential readership of four thousand (4000) adults per week for twenty-one fixture weeks. Advertisements were charged at the rate of \$100/page and \$50/half page. At the top rate of \$100/page over twenty-one (21) weeks, the cost to advertisers worked out at less than \$5 per week for an advertisement reaching up to 4000 people each and every week during that period. This is a very low cost to any business, and it would be difficult to obtain a better price in any other medium or

publication. As well there is the goodwill factor of being seen as a good corporate citizen for any firm advertising in this way. The BWA sponsors were of course given free advertisements and acknowledgments throughout the fixture book. Marilyn Chatfield assisted by contacting potential advertisers and offering a cut rate for placing advertisements in both the Fixture and Open Championship program books.

The BWA newsletter was reinstated in 1997 to allow not only better communication between the administrators and players, but also to help promote the top level events to our members, and to recognise and acknowledge our sponsors whenever possible. Sue McLean compiled and collected the articles for editing, design, and layout by Jacqui Nix. This publication was called the "*Hockey Net*", and was well received by members. It proved an effective way of promoting events, particularly those at the State Hockey Centre. The "*Hockey Net*" was published monthly throughout the season. It is a very worthwhile marketing tool for our association. It is hoped that the 1998 Management Committee will continue with this publication and endeavour to sell advertising space in it to businesses.

Over the long weekend in May we held the Queensland Open Championships at the State Hockey Centre. Though the rain dampened the event, and curtailed sales in the canteen and merchandise outlet, the Championship did proceed, and was attended by teams from all over Queensland. The Brisbane City Council provided a grant of \$1000 to assist with the hosting of the Championship, which proved a costly exercise for the association. The Championship was opened by our Patron Gail Austen OAM, who had just won the *Telstra* Businesswoman of the Year Award. Hospitality to sponsors and guests was provided for the opening of the Championship. The championship program book again allowed for promotion of the BWA sponsors, as well as club sponsors, by advertisements in this publication which was not only supplied to all players and officials from the many teams participating, but was also sold at the gate to spectators of the event. This publication also provided a cheap form of advertising for all firms that took advantage of the rates offered.

Prior to the Queensland Open Championships, a three year sponsorship agreement was negotiated with Rixon Clothing Pty Ltd for the supply of Brisbane team uniforms. A new design was sought, and a design developed by Jodi Kohn of Easts was approved for manufacture. The deal with Rixon Clothing allowed for the names of the Brisbane Division One Open Team to be printed on the backs of the players' shirts - something I have wanted to do for a very long time. This allows easy identification of players by the spectators, and greatly assists in the professional promotion of the game. Rixon supplied a range of off-field wear including caps, rugby tops, T-shirts, polo shirts, and shorts, all with the "*Hockey Net*" logo. These were offered for sale, along with a championship polo shirt.

President's Cup was held on 13th July. Schweppes sponsored the President's Eleven, and supplied each player chosen as Player of the Final in each division with a Schweppes *Sport+* sports bag. Umpires and ball girls on this occasion wore Schweppes *Dr Pepper* gear. This event was promoted through the newsletter and flyers. Invitations were sent to sponsors and guests, and hospitality was provided at a pre-match function before the Division 1 Finals.

At the end of the fixture rounds the BWA Awards Dinner was held at the Convention and Exhibition Centre at South Brisbane. It was well attended by sponsors representatives

who were invited as guests. AMart AllSports have become involved as suppliers to the BWA equipment shop this year, and donated a voucher for sporting goods to the winner of the Best & Fairest Medal at the Awards Dinner. Australian representative Kelly Free was the guest speaker at the event, and some video footage was shown demonstrating her goalscoring talents. A Microsoft PowerPoint slide presentation was compiled and used throughout the evening. This was particularly good for the run-down of the points for the President's Medal for Best & Fairest. It was decided by the Management Committee to rename the medal the President's Medal after Ricoh advised that they were amending their sponsorship policies for all sports, and did not wish to continue with the medal and their sponsorship of the dinner and trophies, though they may consider sponsorship along other lines in the future. Nixenco Pty Ltd donated a sponsorship, which assisted with this year's dinner and trophies, and provided the medal for the next ten years.

The preparation, organisation, and presentation of the BWA Awards Dinner are a major task, and one, which should be undertaken by the Promotion, Marketing, and Sponsorship Committee. It is an excellent vehicle for the promotion of the association, and a great way to service our corporate sponsorship. I am particularly thankful for the assistance of Rosanna Pappalardo and Kathy Duggan in the BWA office without which I could not have organised this event.

Streets Ice Cream provide the sponsorship for our finals. At the end of the season the Paddle Pop Lion distributed Streets ice blocks to the Minkey and Modified players at Rasey Park. All finals medals bore the BWA and Streets logos in accordance with our agreement with Streets. The Finals were again held jointly with the Brisbane mens' association (BHA Inc). A joint program was prepared by the BWA office, which promoted the sponsors of the two associations. Joint hospitality for invited sponsors and guests was provided prior to both the women and men's division 1 finals. As for all other events held this year, the "Hockey Net" was used to promote the finals to all our members throughout all divisions. The day was well attended, and was an excellent promotion of the game.

While not under the area of promotion, marketing, and sponsorship under our present constitutional sub-committee structure, publicity in the media is one area, which must be brought under this committee's umbrella when the new constitution is drawn up. Currently there is the position of Publicity Officer under our constitution, but this person is answerable to no one on the Management Committee, and is not required to report on their activities. This position must be part of the Promotion & Marketing Committee, as the various areas of promotion, marketing, sponsorship and media profile are dependent on one another and must be interconnected to be successful. Kerrie Alcorn at the beginning of the season, and Meagan Thomas at the end of the season, tried to gain us some media publicity. This however requires long and sustained effort to be successful, and neither person had sufficient time and resources to do the job alone. Kerrie is now in Sydney, but hopefully Meagan will continue to assist BWA in this area in 1998. I thank them both for their efforts.

The BWA database, which has been developed in 1997, will be a great asset in the future for the promotions, marketing, sponsorship, and media portfolio. It needs to be developed further, but its value to the association will prove immense in the years to come. I thank Amber Worth for the work she has done developing the database for BWA. Her expertise in this area has been invaluable.

In conclusion I thank the office staff, members of the Management Committee, and other BWA and club officials who assisted me with all of the tasks and events listed above. Many people contributed their time in some way to each of these events. They are too numerous to name individually, but they may be assured that their efforts have not gone unnoticed or unappreciated by either the wider association or myself.

This year, John Bigg (our groundsman) has replaced the deck on the Rasey Park clubhouse, replaced the steps, painted the whole building and stained the floor in the bar area. After the break-in through the canteen roll-a-doors, the old doors had to be replaced. Since the end of the season, our local youths have been practising their graffiti on the clubhouse, so we will have to put more security lights around the building before it is repainted. The toilets on Field 13 have been painted to brighten them up and will soon be painted on the outside to cover the graffiti on it.

With the Brisbane City Council mowing Downey Park only 11 times a year, John spends a lot of time mowing fields – a large area for a small mower. Fields get remarked about every 2 weeks. There are always small jobs around the clubhouse to be done and John does all these willingly. At the moment, Shade Sheds are being built near Field 8 and 11, with financial help coming from a Brisbane City Council grant, and shared with Softball.

We also marked 3 grass fields at Colmslie every month during the season, for our juniors to play on. Field 1 will be top-dressed and fertilized again this off-season, so hopefully it will be in better condition in 1998.

My thanks to John for all his hard work, willingness and friendliness during the season. Thanks also to Mary for her advice and to Kathy, Rosanna and Joyce for their help also.

As I am retiring from Management this season, I would like to thank all hockey players and officials for their help and friendship over the past 22 years. Hockey has become a big part of the Tidey family life and retirement seems strange. I will be still hitting a hockey ball around and Keith will still be umpiring the juniors.

After much consultation between our committee and BWA Management, it was decided to have a ten-team competition in Division 3, enabling Commercial to remain and University to bring in a new team thus using Division 3 as an avenue for clubs to get their younger players onto the turf. Ascot, after winning the challenge game has gone to win the Minor Premiership and Grand Final Trophies. Also, Commercial finished in the final four (very good for a team who could have been relegated).

This year BWA held a meeting with club officials, coaches and captains of turf teams to try and work out a solution to games being played when representative players were going to be absent. A solution was reached, and the only games to be addressed were the National League games. This made for a much smoother draw and not so many missed weeks in the season.

The President's Cup Day on the turf was a great day. Congratulations to all teams who played in these games. All Divisions played under the new rules for finals with extra time and then the sudden death drop-off ruling. A great game between Easts and Bulimba.

Thank you to Marilyn Chatfield and Lindy Fass for all their expertise and organisational skills to maintain an even flow at the State Hockey Centre.

The Downey Park teams affiliated in March with grading and challenge games being held mid-March on fields 11 and 12. Two challenge games were held at Downey Park and these were played on Field 1.

Saturday 5 April was the first Saturday at Downey Park. Division 4, 5, 6 and 7 had eight teams and Divisions 9 and 10 had six teams, Division 8 had eight teams and a bye, and the Veterans had six teams. The fixtures were done and ready to be typed and then one team withdrew leaving only five teams in Division 10. It was decided to join the Division 9 and 10 together and have a ten-team competition. One team needed to go up to Division 8 and then two new teams were affiliated. At this stage, it was decided to make another ten-team division. The major plus for having ten-team divisions is NO Sunday games, but the drawback is only 18 fixtures. Let hope next year has a smoother start.

This year BWA played the extra time, then sudden death drop-off for all finals. In the President's Cup at Downey Park, no games went to the drop-off system. Congratulations to all teams who reached the President's Cup. These rules were played for the Grand Final day and the only game that went the distance was the veterans – a marathon game, extra time, and two sets of drop-off. Congratulations to Easts for a great win, and also to Ascot for the best game of the season, in Veterans.

In nearly every grade the top six or seven teams were very close on points and our committee feels justified with the end results. Please remember that if you are Minor Premiers and wish to request a challenge match next year, submit as much information as possible when the 1998 Affiliations are due.

Congratulations to all Minor Premiers and Premiers for 1997.

Thank you to Lyn Thomas for all her tireless help and support throughout the year. Also, to Management for their support this season.

Also to Christine Blanchard and Pip Ahern, thank you for all your hard work. As I have not nominated for the Downey Park Fixture & Grading Committee, I wish the new Downey Park Fixture and Grading Committee all the best for the future seasons.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT REPORT

1997 was a year for evaluation of the Player Development area in BWAH. The rapid growth in junior numbers, the changing role of our Regional Coaching Director and the resultant demands placed on volunteers within the organisation to cater for all members, has been scrutinised.

The first notable change in the area was the removal of the CAPS scheme from the RCD to the control of Junior Management. This was done to allow greater emphasis to be placed on the CAPS scheme and I hope it will receive an even higher profile under Junior Management's guidance, and in the next few years BWAH will see even bigger benefits from this valuable scheme. Both Barb Northcott and Sue McLatchey must be congratulated for all their work in this area over past years, and I look forward to bigger and better things in the future.

The Regional Coaching Director for BWAH, Sue McLatchey, performs a super human task in BWAH. Her 50+ hour weeks, have ensured that we now have a fully functioning Coaches Association in BWAH, a high number of accredited coaches on our club teams, and accredited coaches for all our Representative Teams. BWAH, thanks to Sue, is highly regarded by Aussie Sports, the Queensland Department of Sport and the BCC Sport and Recreation Department. Sue attends many Forums, Sport Expos and meetings on behalf of BWAH, which shows to the outside community, our commitment to the development of young people through sport. Sue's report, following in this Annual Report, will fully show the huge workload she undertakes for BWAH and I thank her for her tireless work and commitment.

The development of BWAH's promising junior players has long been a high priority for BWAH. Under the direction of Dick Roebuck, BWAH now has a Player Development Program Fundraising Committee (PDPFC), whose role is to raise funds to enable more players to benefit from developmental opportunities. In 1997, BWAH sent a team to compete in the Arafura Games in Darwin, and for the first time, an Under 16 team competed in the Women's Hockey Australia, Under 16 Division II Tournament held in Melbourne. Reports on both these tournaments are presented later.

Feedback from both competitions showed the value to our promising young players. Thanks to Dick and his small band of workers, players who have attended these tournaments, have been financially assisted. We are currently investigating other opportunities for our young players, these opportunities may include a tour through northern NSW, sending a team to the

WHA Under 16 Division I Tournament and additional development squads - all of this, of course, takes time and money. All players selected in the Satellite and Development Squads for BWA benefit in some way from the PDPFC. The funds raised by this committee, not only help the touring teams, but pay for turf hire and special coaches fees and equipment, which is used by these squads. It is essential that all parents get behind the PDPFC, so all players can reap the benefits of our programs.

After discussions with many people from many different clubs, I have come to understand the great need for development opportunities not only for our talent identified players, but for players of varying standards and ages. This need was reinforced at the forum, held by BWA in August. The need to have a Player Development Committee is overdue. This committee I would envisage, would pull together the areas of selections, representative teams, development and satellite squads and open clinics. The ideas presented at the forum will be the starting point for a Player Development Workshop on 25 October 1997. All interested people have been asked to attend and we hope that a structure for the BWA Player Development Committee will come together on this day, so the Constitution Committee can fine tune it, ready for the new constitution that BWA so desperately needs.

BWA, apart from the developmental teams sent to Darwin and Melbourne, selected over 30 teams to compete in Intrastate and Southern Cross Tournaments in 1997. From Veterans to Under 11's many players, coaches, managers, umpires and support staff represented BWA. From uniforms to travel, every part of the representative experience is a showcase for the talented people we have in our association and I thank every person, who in some way played their part in keeping the show on the road. Unfortunately, for the volunteers, the representative year never really finishes anymore. Planning, booking, budgeting is year round, for tournaments that start in February and finish in October. For anyone who would like to help in some way, I am sure a small job could be organised for you. Please do not hesitate to ask.

As you can see from this very short report, the Player Development Portfolio is no longer (if it ever was) a job, in it's present form, for one person. The time commitment is huge and we cannot develop to our full potential, without the establishment of a large working Player Development Committee. If you are serious about the development of BWA's players, then now is the time to put up your hand to help.

REGIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR (RCD)

BWHA is growing and changing, which in itself is an extremely positive and encouraging trend. The challenge we've been facing for some time now is keeping pace with this growth and change, with limited personnel and resources. Our substantial achievements each year, under the current circumstances are only due to the constant hard work and dedication of far too few volunteers with the support of a few paid staff – all of who have been stretched to the limit of their capacity for too long.

As a result, the duties performed throughout the 5½ years in this position have varied to extremes and continues to do so. However, this must change to ensure we achieve real *"value for money"* from this position. We need to establish a much clearer picture of what we want a RCD to achieve and establish long term development plans, so we maintain our focus and achieve more for the money, time and effort expended.

The most frustrating aspect of my role as RCD is to see how much more needs to be done to be providing suitable and worthwhile experiences and opportunities for our members – in spite of the tremendous efforts of those involved. I acknowledge that we will always have more that could be done than people and money to do it, this could be said nearly anywhere. However, I am confident that by identifying key areas of concern and laying down realistic development plans in these key areas, we will utilise our scarce resources much more efficiently. The saying *"work smarter, not harder"* needs to be applied.

It was with this in mind that I began 1997. Rather than just operating from an annual plan, my intention was to establish a thorough 4-year development plan for the key areas of my role – player development and coach education/development. Although the ground work for these plans has been done for some time, due to the daily grind of just *"getting things done"*, it will take at least until the end of this year to finalise these.

It is vital to establish and revise these plans to ensure we waste less time on activities, which give us minimal outcomes and dedicate more time to those activities leading to increased benefits for our members.

I strongly believe this position could achieve greater outcomes if the role and duties of same were restricted to those which were of greatest benefit for BWHA members, rather than trying to achieve the impossible, resulting in limited outcomes over a broad range of areas.

Having said all this, our achievements for 1997 should not be overlooked.

Player Development

Our results in this area prove our programs are heading in the right direction. We have an increasing number of players selected in Queensland Squads. The results of our representative teams from our No.1 team to our No. 4 team (in Opens, Veterans, U18, U15 and U13) show we are developing our players fairly effectively at the 'top end' and maintaining a reasonable quality in our depth of talent. Only two of these fifteen teams finished out of the top four in their respective divisions at the State Championship. Our three U11 Teams all finished in the top four at their Southern Cross competition.

However, when the size of our association is considered, the number of players we have to choose from for these teams, we are far from reaching our potential. There is a lot more we can and should be doing.

Thanks to our Player Development Fundraising Committee, we were able to send a team (for the second time) to the Arafura Games in Darwin in May. I was fortunate to travel with the team as coach. Also for the second time, we came away from the tournament with a bronze medal and having learnt a lot about hockey, different cultures and enjoyed the experience immensely.

The purpose of attending this tournament is to expose our talented players to a tougher and higher level of competition than previously experienced. Playing teams who play different styles of hockey and who are more experienced and tougher competitors than our players, provides an excellent learning opportunity. The cultural exchange and friendly, but competitive atmosphere of these games are further advantages of this tournament. It's probably the closest to an Olympic Games that most of our players will get.

The only disappointment this time, was the reduced number of non-Australian teams participating in the Hockey Competition. The Games overall have grown and more countries are becoming involved, however the training this year was poor for some of the Hockey teams, who were involved in qualifying tournaments for the upcoming Commonwealth Games.

Many thanks to Bev Sunderland (Team Manager) for her excellent organisation prior to, during and after the trip. Thanks also to Rae Hawthorne for her expert video camera work and great driving!!! Thank goodness you both have a terrific sense of humour – would we have survived without it?!!

Currently our U16 Team is participating for the first time in the WHA U16 Invitational Tournament – Division 2 in Melbourne. As for the Arafura Games, the purpose of sending a team to this tournament is to expose players to this age group to a tougher level of hockey than they have experienced, in a tournament open to teams from throughout Australia.

Opportunities such as the Arafura Games and the U16 Tournament need to be assessed regularly to ensure they continue to be the best developmental opportunities available to us for the cost incurred.

As well as the benefits already mentioned, the value of the motivational aspects of sending players to tournaments such as these should not be overlooked.

Coach Education / Development

In 1996 and many years prior, we did not receive enough nominations to fill the representative team coaching roles. The highlight of the year in this area, was having a Coach and Assistant Coach for every under age representative team. This is the first time we have tried this and according to feedback from these coaches, it has proven to be a great success and will continued in 1998.

This year was our first at conducting our Coaching Scholarships and Apprenticeships. Every one of these coaches accepted either a coaching or assistant coaching role with a

Brisbane representative team. This scheme will also be continued in 1998 as it has already proven its worth in developing coaches.

Congratulations to the worthy recipients of the Junior Coach Award Scheme as follows: -

Once again, we are heading in the right direction with this area, however we have a very long way to go before we are giving our coaches the support required and giving all of our players the standard of coaching they deserve. Due to the size of our association, this area requires an enormous amount of time dedicated to its development.

Schools

As this area is so large and time consuming to develop (as are Player Development and Coach Education/Development Officer) and is more the role of a Development Officer (which we desperately need full time but don't have) this will not be a key area for my position in 1998.

Again in 1997, by dedicating so much time to developing hockey in schools with minimal results, the other areas already discussed suffered and overall our achievements were far below what was within our reach.

Until we are '*blessed*' with a full time RDO, responsibility for hockey development in schools will fall upon clubs' shoulders. My role will be to supply support for clubs in the form of resources, information and administration.

In our current situation, this is the only way we have any hope of establishing long-term links between schools and clubs, so that clubs can expect a continual flow of members from schools.

Resources

We have, at last, a new cupboard in which to store our resources and officially call it "*The Library*" (rather than tripping over everything else in the storeroom to get to it!).

Videos have proven to be the most popular item for coaches to borrow, so I'll be concentrating on expanding this area of "*The Library*" in the future.

Coaches are gradually utilising this service more, though a lot more promotion of its availability needs to be done.

Thank You!

There are many people who deserve sincere thanks. Without the enthusiasm and efforts of these people, working as RCD would be far less rewarding and our successes few.

Many thanks to the coaches in our Association who have given their time to coach club teams and representative teams throughout the year. Thanks to Kathy Duggan for your support and many discussions to *"bounce ideas around"*, so we can continue to improve our player development programs. To those on BWA Senior and Junior Management Committees, thanks for the enormous time and effort you contribute, which enables us to conduct our various programs.

Thanks to Rosanna Pappalardo for your administrative support.

Sincere thanks to the Coaches Association Board for your time and commitment throughout the year. You have been a pleasure to work with and have taken on various aspects of the Coach Education/Development program successfully and enthusiastically. Many thanks to Tanya Hoyle, Kym Roberson, Sue Brough, Julie Dwyer, Gary Keene, Maree Comerford, Kirsten Kent and Cathy Taylor. Special thanks to Gina Archer. As President of the Coaches Association this year, Gina dedicated endless hours to work with me on various aspects of the Coaches Association and has made a huge difference to the efficiency of same. 1998 promises to be a great year for this Association, as a result of Gina's efforts.

I will also take this opportunity to congratulate Kirsten Kent and her family on their new baby boy, and hope he finds himself in good health very soon.

1997 ARAFURA GAMES

In May this year another BWA team, 'Brisbane Satellites', competed in the Arafura Games, Darwin. This year saw a drop in hockey teams competing due to commitments in other Championships during this and next year, but also saw an increase of competitors in other sports. There were 25 countries (compared to 18 in 1995) competing this year with close to 5,000 competitors and officials. This year we had a five team competition with Brunei, Australian Country, Northern Territory, Papua New Guinea and ourselves with the men having a six team competition.

We started our 10 days with training and trying to climatise ourselves to the humid weather. On Saturday night, we had a great Opening Ceremony with all the girls meeting a lot of people from all over the Asian - Pacific region. Sunday, we played Northern Territory and we had a loss of 3-0 with the girls still trying to come to grips with hot and humid weather. Monday we didn't play. Tuesday found us playing Brunei and we had a win of 2-1 and found this a more pleasant game as we played at 8pm in the evening. Wednesday was a rest day for all women's teams. Our team headed off to Litchfield National Park for a swim and look at the beautiful waterfalls.

Thursday we played at 12.00pm against Papua New Guinea and we won this game 3-0. Friday we played against Australian Country Womens team and lost 6-0. Then on Saturday the finals began and we played off for Bronze Medals. We played Brunei and won 1-0 receiving the Bronze, with Australian Country Team playing Northern Territory in the major final, the Australian Country won. Saturday night found us at the Closing Party held for competitors and a good night was had by all.

Our accommodation was again at the Botanic Gardens Apartments, which were excellent, and with talking to other parties, I feel we should continue using these apartments for future tournaments. Not only were they very helpful, but also have all the facilities that are needed to make our stay enjoyable.

Having our own transport this year was very beneficial for training, playing and also catching some of the International sports. Again, I would recommend this next time, with maybe having two mini-buses instead of only one and a Tarago, as there was not quite enough room for all the girls plus their hockey gear.

I think the trip was again a great learning experience to our players, with feedback from parents, the girls having returned home, not only enjoying the mini Olympics atmosphere, but have become stronger and more committed on the hockey field. I personally would like to see this trip continue. I think the girls learn a great deal, not only with their hockey development, but also a lot about themselves in this level of competition.

As for myself, I thought it was a great trip, and I must thank Rae Hawthorne for her help as Assistant Manager, she not only helped to look after the girls and drove the other hire vehicle but also took a video of every game. One manager needs to be able to assist with the coaching as there is a need for developing coaches as well as players and this would give an inexperienced coach a perfect opportunity. Thus with the insight of this developing coach going to the next Arafura Games as head Coach, having had the experience of being there before, and therefore have knowledge of the arrangements of the games.

I sincerely hope that this trip will continue every second year, and I know that this competition will only grow with hockey becoming more acknowledged every year.

On behalf of our team 'Brisbane Satellites' we would like to thank our sponsors, Ansett Airlines, Broncos, and Puma, and also anyone who helped with the fundraising. Without their help the trip would have been very expensive for the players to participate. Also, a big 'Thank You' to Sue McLatchey as it is not an easy task to Coach a team with ages ranging from 15-21 years, but I think she did a great job.

WOMENS HOCKEY AUSTRALIA
UNDER 16 DIVISION II INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT
MELBOURNE SEPTEMBER 29 - OCTOBER 4, 1997

In 1997, BWA sent a team to the Under 16 Division II Tournament, this is fairly new tournament run by Women's Hockey Australia. The venue was Melbourne and after discussions in 1996, BWA accepted an invitation to send a team in 1997. Nominations were called for from under 15 players in the BWA Development Squads and players identified from the 1997 BWA Under 15 and Under 13 Representative Teams.

The team was selected by Kerrie Richards (Satellite Coach), Sue McLatchey (Regional Coaching Director), Sue Brough (BWA Under 13(1) Coach and U15 selector) and myself (Player Development Officer). The team was announced at the Player Development Fundraising Committee Dinner on the 16 August. The team selected contained nine Under 15 players and seven Under 13 players. The standard of competition, that the team would face, despite inquiries, was totally unknown. Four support personnel, were selected to travel with the team, Sue McLatchey (Coach), Cathy Taylor (Ass Coach/Manager), Sue Reid (Umpire) and myself as Manager.

The team trained five times before leaving for Melbourne and then had a further three training sessions in Melbourne to climatise to the conditions; the sand based turfs, and a new coach. Unfortunately, only days before departure, Sue McLatchey was unable to travel with the team. At short notice I took over the role of coach and Marg Tupper came on board as Manager. Although this wasn't a great prelude to the tournament, everything ran well and was an enjoyable and exhausting experience for all.

Staying in St Kilda with sixteen Under 16 girls is an experience only required once in a lifetime. Our accommodation was new, clean, tidy, very secure, on different floors and very small. Cooking for twenty people in a minute kitchen, with dwarf frying pans and saucepans, serving twenty people, cleaning after twenty people and ensuring the meal is fully nutritious was a masterpiece of movement to watch. Marg Tupper did a great job in this area and must be congratulated on keeping such good humour under difficult circumstances. And yes the players did help and while some didn't appear to have much experience, all (well nearly all) were willing helpers.

Driving two 12 seater minibuses in Melbourne is an experience. Narrow streets with cars with no indicators (well they never used them), trams which have total right of way, roads

that go round in circles, and the Westgate Bridge (which we crossed every day had the lowest guard rails I have ever seen and which seemed to entice you to the edge), were the minor hazards we met. Reading the Refidex was the greatest challenge. Cathy Taylor was the chief navigator and although she never admitted to getting lost, I believe some quick thinking on her behalf narrowly saved us from this fate on a number of occasions.

The tournament catered for twenty regional teams from the East coast of Australia and the Northern Territory. The twenty teams were in two pools of 10. On the first day of competition the BWA team faced the top two teams in our pool Cumberland and Bathurst. We drew 2 all with the eventual winner of the tournament, Cumberland, in our first game (they only equalised with 30 seconds left in the game). We lost to Bathurst and unfortunately this left us unable to finish higher than 3rd overall. In our pool Bathurst was the best team we played against. They were physically bigger (where were their birth certificates) stronger and quicker than our players, but to the BWA player's credit they never gave in. Our results for the week were:

Cumberland 2-2, Bathurst 0-3, SATAL II 1-1, Victoria White 2-0, Northern Territory 1-0, IGSSA 1-0, ISA 3-0. We finished 3rd in our pool and played the 3rd team in pool B SATAL I we lost 2-0 leaving us in 6th position overall. This was a great effort for our first time in the tournament and with a team that gave away many years in age and experience to their opposition.

It appeared to be a great experience for all players. Some revelled in the standard of competition. Some due to age and size did find the going a bit tough, but gave their best effort whenever they were on the field. As this was a development team all players were given equal time on the field. The only exceptions to this were through injury (Kim Gerrand) and illness (Bree Gallagher) who both missed a day of play. From the first trainings (with Sue McLatchey) the team worked to develop a style of game which revolved around three concepts H.I.P (Hunt in Packs), A.F.D (Attack from Defence) and E.E.P (Early Easy passes). Individually all players were asked to work on specific areas of their game. Some players improved dramatically in their area, others still have a way to go.

WHA supported the tournament well with Sharon Buchanan (Captain Gold Medal Team in Seoul) attending the first two days and speaking at the Tournament Dinner. An Australian Selector was in attendance during the week and spoke to all coaches about players in their team with potential for the future. Margaret Murray and Robyn Pascoe made sure the tournament was run smoothly and gave Sue Reid great feedback about her umpiring. Sue was the best umpire there and she is only a State C, many of the others were State A's. Maybe Queensland tests too hard or maybe it's time they started to realise Sue's talents and give her the badge she deserves. On a lighter note Sue had her first experience of interrupting a match due to hail - what a wimp ! The major concern with the tournament was the lack of First Aid/Sports Trainers at the venues - none were supplied. Thankfully Cathy Taylor is a Nurse and Level II Sports Trainer - the sand based turfs kept her very busy taping, strapping and icing. Well done, Cath !

The support given to this team from BWA and the Players Development Fundraising Committee was wonderful. All planning, booking and payment for the tour was handled by Bev Sunderland who did a great job - even if the Travel Agency gave us the wrong departure time and we nearly missed the plane home. The BWA equipment, balls, video, first aid were fully utilised and the uniforms were highly regarded by all our opposition. We could have

swapped or sold our playing shirts a 100 times over. We were certainly the best-dressed team there.

Two parents made the trip down south Pam Patteson and John Elliott. Both were a great asset to the team, supporting all players both on and off the field. Pam used the video on most of the games for us. Thank you Pam, with Cathy Taylor busy with first aid we needed the extra set of hands.

From a development point of view, the tournament is of great value and I will be recommending we continue to send a team in future years (1998 venue - Toowoomba) and after discussions with Robyn Pascoe sending a team to the Division I tournament would also be advantageous.

Apart from the hockey we were able to visit the Melbourne Zoo (by tram - we were not driving through the city again), the Vic Markets (by tram - boy can those girls shop), the Old Melbourne Gaol, the MCG, the city mall, the Casino (some of us saw the Casino) and the St Kilda markets and Luna Park.

On the whole the players got a feel for the next step in competition, the responsibility of being representatives of their city at an Australian Tournament and of being very small fish in a very big city. Their behaviour was very good, their enthusiasm high and their creativity for gifts (Cathy's 'Y front' jocks were a great hit on the plane) shows the high calibre of young people and players we have in BWA. I hope it has whetted their appetites to go on to bigger and better things in the future.

UMPIRES BOARD REPORT

The Umpires Board for 1997 really struggled to fulfil the commitment that would be expected of such a board. This was due to a number of reasons, but most importantly the lack of personnel to carry out the work expected and the time constraints brought about by other responsibilities the members had.

We started the year with grand plans and ideas, fresh from an enjoyable off-season. The Board consisted of three people at the turf and two at Downey Park. Needless to say the ratio of umpires to be tested was about ten to one. A decision was reached early on to send as many people to the State Championships as possible, this would enable them to be tested and badged in a short period of time. This did prove to be very beneficial for those umpires concerned who received badges and those who did not, received valuable feedback. The Board still offered assistance on the weekends of fixtures, but we were not able to offer the feedback that has been given in previous years.

The concept that was embraced a couple of years ago, that of having AA and State A umpires only on Division 1 games, State B on Division 2 games and State C on Division 3 games, is a good concept and one that we have to keep supporting. This will only be possible if clubs fulfil their duties to keep putting people forward for testing. There are a couple of clubs who are very obviously carrying the umpiring load, particularly in the top

divisions and more obviously there are those clubs, who are not doing anything to fulfil their commitments.

The relationship between coaches and umpires is another issue, which needs to be addressed and a closer relationship needs to be developed in this area. The umpires need to feel that the technical bench in regard to this matter supports them. The technical bench is there not only to take statistics and keep time; they are also there to protect the umpires! This is important at all levels of the game. If the coaches know what is expected of them, in regard to behaviour and this is enforced by the bench, then some of the nasty, spiteful incidents which occurred this year will be avoided in the future.

On a positive note, we again had a number of representatives at National and International Tournaments. Our highest ranked umpire, Michele Arnold, was overseas again as an independent umpire at the Olympics Qualifying Tournament in Zimbabwe. As a result of this, Michele was awarded the Heather Scraggs Shield for the "*Highest Umpiring Achievement*" for this year. Congratulations Michele! Julie Ashton-Lucy and myself were chosen to umpire at the National Hockey League Telstra Stix Series earlier in the year. Julie and Michele will be umpiring at the finals in October. Good luck to both Julie and Michele! Kerrie Chatfield, Alyson Aleksic and myself umpired at the U21 Championships in Sydney earlier in the year. Alyson was successful in being awarded her Australian Badge. Congratulations Alyson!

My special thanks to Lyn Thomas for keeping me on track with what needed to be done in regard to allocations at the turf and for her contribution to the allocation and testing of umpires at Downey Park. Also thanks to Cheryl Kann for her assistance to Lyn in the testing of umpires at Downey Park.

My largest debt of thanks must go to Kathy Duggan for all the phone calls to make sure everything that needed to be done and for picking up the slack when I missed things. Thank you very much Kathy, without your help I would hate to think what would have happened. Also to Rosanna Pappalardo for the numerous phone calls to remind me of things that needed to be done, without your efficiency I would not have got most things done.

Lastly to Michele Arnold, Sue Whatman, Alyson Aleksic and Lindy Fass thanks for your help throughout the year.

JUNIOR PRESIDENT REPORT

It was on the 7th September 1996, that I signed a form nominating for the position of President of BWA Juniors. The fact that I was in hospital connected to a drip at the time always gave me the feeling that I could get out - so to speak - on a plea of insanity. The thought often crossed my mind - very often.

Having held the positions of Treasurer and Secretary working with four previous Presidents did little to prepare me for "*The Top Job*" of what is one of - if not the largest Association in Queensland. While I freely admit that the Secretary carries the bulk of the load, I found the expectation to be all things to all people difficult to cope with.

BWA Juniors grew to 130 teams (including Minkey and Modified) in 1997 and while increasing participation in our sport must be one of our main aims, with this increase comes one of our major problems - FIELDS. Where do we play 51 full field games on a Saturday morning? During the 1997 season our fixtures were played at Downey Park, Rasey Park and the State Hockey Centre (turf and grass). Many suggestions have been made regarding playing location (only some printable), but to move from our base at Downey Park would be lunacy. Downey is the reason for our strength and growth. The Colmslie grass fields proved to be a bonus for us during the season and it is hoped that these fields will be available in 1998.

With the increase in numbers came an extra grade, J6, and an extra timeslot 12-30pm. Our 13C and 13D grades competed at this timeslot with what seemed to be a minimum of fuss. There were the usual hiccups once the GPS season started and while there is room for some compromise, BWA Junior fixtures cannot be dictated to by a competition, which runs for 9 weeks a season with less than half the number of teams competing. BWA Junior fixtures are compiled each year before Easter, and are published in a BWA fixture book.

Fields are not the only problem generated by an increase in teams. With each extra match comes the necessity to provide two (2) extra umpires. Whilst the Umpire's Board headed by Sue Reid does all it can to monitor, test and train our junior umpires, resources simply do not allow us to maintain the numbers required. Clubs must therefore take the initiative and provide their umpires with some training before sending them off with a whistle. It is hoped a coaching clinic for umpires can be organised prior to the 1998 season.

The Coaches Association was very active during the season and once again presented encouragement, recognition and long service awards to our junior coaches. We also saw assistant coaches appointed to our representative teams. This move will bolster the ranks and provide us with a pool of coaches to fill our needs in future years.

Once again our CAPS participants showed their organisational abilities by taking control of the Under 11 Southern Cross, held at Downey Park in August. Sitting back watching our administrators of the future in action makes all the time and effort worthwhile. The young ladies involved in this scheme are a credit to their families and clubs.

Thanks must go to Jim Northcott, who took over the running of the Hockey Shop this year and proved a force to be reckoned with. All profits from the shop are channeled directly back to the Junior Association and provide us with much needed funds.

To my Management Committee my sincere thanks for your time, your loyalty and your ability

to see the bright side of any situation. To those who have decided to stand down from positions this year, thank you for the contribution you have made to our Association, it has been greatly appreciated.

While it is not wise to single people out, I must make mention of my secretary, Robyn Ure and treasurer, Glenda Street, the two people I have leaned on most. Being three new kids on the block in our respective positions probably made us more aware of the problems we each faced. I can't thank you both enough for everything you have done this year.

To everyone who has assisted in the running of the Junior Association, in whatever capacity thank you so very much.

My best wishes to everyone for a happy and safe off-season.

JUNIOR SECRETARY REPORT

The 1997 season has certainly been a very busy and challenging season for me in my very first year on the Junior Management Committee.

The 1997 season commenced on Tuesday 19 November at our first Junior Management Committee meeting. Tracey O'Connor stepped into the Junior President's position with Glenda Street as treasurer. The three management members were Kathy Duggan, Louise Hollitt and Ros Costello. However, due to other commitments Ros had to resign from her position and Marg Tupper joined the team. A total of 20 clubs affiliated with 102 teams playing 13 divisions. We welcomed John Paul College to our ranks this year. It was an enormous job for our fixture and grading committee to place all these teams and we were limited as to how many teams could be changed because of the number of teams involved. We introduced a J6 division and a new 12.30pm time slot this year to accommodate all the new teams. A fourth team was able to be chosen a week before the U13 State Championship in Toowoomba. The four teams travelled to Toowoomba by coach and all teams seemed to enjoy the Championship. The U15 team travelled to Warwick by coach and they also had a very successful Championship with Brisbane 1 as Runners Up and Brisbane 2 - 4th and Brisbane 3 - 5th. Congratulations to Hayley Phipps on being named "Player of the Championship" and Tanya Hoswell, Jane Morgan, Carly Lennon, Leisa Dombrowski and Hayley Phipps in the "Best 16". Shauna Ure obtained her State Senior Umpires Badge and Katie Bullock and Casey Mitchell were awarded their State Junior Umpires Badge.

The U11 Southern Cross was held in Brisbane on Sunday 3 August. It was another successful day for Brisbane, with our first team being placed in 4th position, our second and third team in Division 2 played in the final - Brisbane 2 being the winner. This was a day, which was organised by our CAPS participants, and they did a wonderful job. All clubs should be very proud of these young people, as these young ones will be the future for your clubs.

I would like to congratulate the Coaches Association and the very professional way in which they are trying to encourage our young girls in the role of coaching and assisting those who already coach in more modern methods.

Congratulations to the winners of Minor Premierships and Grand Finals, to Kedron Wavell, as winners of the "Taxation Trophy" for the best club and to Mt Gravatt Eagles J4 and Valley U11A being joint winners of the "Ruby Robinson Shield" for the Best Team Performance.

To our junior umpires who were awarded their badges, congratulations. JUNIOR UMPIRES

This season was quite successful as far as umpiring in Brisbane is concerned. The splitting of the J1 and J2 timeslots made allocating and testing of umpires considerably easier.

The naming of umpires for the J1, J2 and U13 matches was reasonably successful. Most clubs supplied names to me. Some of these names, however, were not suitable for the grades.

There are still major concerns regarding the umpires being allocated by some clubs. There were quite a few instances of umpires being sent to do their first game with no support or given a game that was of too high a standard for them.

This is a problem that will not be easy to rectify. To solve it clubs attitudes towards umpiring will have to change.

I am planning, next season, to hold umpire co-ordinator meetings once a month to discuss issues raised, in particular comments on the backs of cards, as at present these usually go unanswered.
