PRESIDENT'S REPORT

If we thought that 2020 was a challenging and momentous year then 2021 and COVID gave us more of the same challenges and then some.

We were very fortunate that we managed to run the winter fixture competition like most other years, starting with a very successful Gala Day in early March to kick off the commencement of the turf competition.

Unfortunately, we had a forced break in the middle of the season when the Brisbane region had to go into lockdown – but with some juggling of fixture dates, times and finals formats we were able to give our players a full season of fixtures. Plans for a shared Grand Final Day with BHA for the turf Grand Finals were put on hold when season end dates did not line up for the two associations.

2021 player numbers returned to almost pre-COVID levels – with hockey fixture competitions for juniors, seniors and masters, at five turf venues and two grass venues, for over 3,000 registered players.

A sixth division for senior turf to accommodate club requests, with the availability of the second turf at Burringbar, was introduced, together with a renaming of Divisions 1-3 to Premier League (PL), and Divisions 4-6 to Metro League (ML). This renaming has not been particularly well embraced by the hockey community and will be reviewed before the start of the next season.

The amenities block on Field 10 has finally been completed, and was opened by the then Minister for Tourism, Industry Development and Innovation and Minister for Sport the Hon. Stirling Hinchliffe at the start of the Downey Park grass season. Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive and it is most pleasing to see that this women's sports reserve finally has a 21st century amenities block.

Of course, the earlier part of the year was consumed with much anguish and concern when Brisbane City Council released the (apparently) first draft of their Enoggera Creek Precinct Plan. This plan saw a hockey turf (with carpark underneath) in the 'cabbage patch', the grass hockey fields reduced in number to accommodate cricket moving in, and softball moving out. But it was the proposal to locate a hockey turf in the 'cabbage patch', on top of a carpark, that most disappointed us. Our planning and submissions to date have proposed two turfs, on either fields 1 and 9, or fields 1 and 2, as best fits for a sustainable competition. This has not enjoyed any support from council, but a turf tucked away in the far corner of the park does not meet our needs or wants. And the decision for Brisbane to host the Olympic games in Brisbane in 2032 does not fill us with any degree of confidence that any sort of turf at Downey Park will transpire. More lobbying will need to be done in this space and we will work with the other Downey Park sports to ensure the short and long term sporting needs of women and girls are addressed and met.

We continue to work with Brisbane Hockey Association (BHA) to administer Hockey Brisbane Inc, and with BHA and Kedron Wavell Services Hockey Club (KWSHC) to administer the Brisbane Hockey Management Group (BHMG), which manages the Burringbar turf facility. Work there to construct new change room facilities, together with a technical bench and

player benches, made possible by a State Government facilities grant, has now also finally been completed.

Planning for 2022 is underway, in conjunction with BHA and with input from Hockey Qld. Planning areas will include understanding impacts and opportunities arising out of Olympic Games in 2032, and more locally on ongoing behaviour management strategies at games, and increasing development opportunities for all our players and club personnel.

I would like to thank all the members of my board for their commitment, enthusiasm and, in particular, their resilience during the year. To all the dedicated volunteers at club and association level – thank you, because your workload this year was also substantially increased. And last but certainly not least, my sincere thanks to Kath Proctor and all the BWHA staff for their ongoing support and tremendous work effort in what has been a quite unique year.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The work towards a turf/s at Downey Park continued this year. Brisbane City Council conducted a community consultation on a proposed rearrangement of the Enoggera Creek Sport and Recreation Precinct Plan. This ambitious plan, if it went ahead, would have seen dramatic change to the precinct as we know it. Whilst it would provide two turfs over a carpark it would also see softball leave the park and cricket move in. Numerous other sporting and community activities would also be impacted. All sporting groups and community members involved had issues with the proposal and this was provided in feedback to Council. The result is that Council is reviewing the plan and will approach users again later this calendar year. So, in short, we lose another year of waiting for Council to provide the turf that was promised as an election commitment in 2020. We will continue working with the Council to provide the best outcomes for our sport at Downey Park and we thank our local elected members for their continued support.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Following the great challenges for everyone in 2020, we hoped that we would have a more “normal” season in 2021.....

The 2020 Board of Management meet three times in October and November to plan with caution for the 2021 season, and a few minor rules changes were made. Our 87th Annual General Meeting was held on the 24th November, 2020 for the first time it was a ZOOM meeting, thank you to everyone who took part. A new member to the Board of Management was welcomed, Anna Mehonoshen. Our **Volunteer of the Year** was announced, **Peter Smith** who worked tirelessly, and often without support, to keep our PL1 game filming going through the season, thank you Peter. Nine members received new or updated service awards, and we welcomed **Lesley Bennett** to our **Life Member** group. Lesley has worked in many areas of our association, but with particular interest in our Competitions including Grading, Fixtures, Umpiring and Technical work, she has been on the Board of Management for over 10 years.

The Board of Management met in December to appoint convenors to committees. Due to COVID limitations we did not hold our usual small Christmas party.

With the uncertainty of what COVID would do to our 2021 season, the office staff remained small but hard working. A reorganisation of duties and minor hours adjustments allowed us to work through the season. Tracey O'Connor assisted with the Canteen preparation; and we used short-term program managers to support our development area. We will need to employ a Development Officer in 2022 if we want to keep providing development opportunities to all our members. Thank you to Amy, Kathryn and Carol for working above and beyond for the sport they love.

After many years of hard work, we held the official opening of the F10 Female Facilities. The **Hon Stirling Hinchliffe**, the Minister for Tourism, Industry Development and Innovation and Minister for Sport opened the facility on the 27th March, 2021. We had a number of special guests attend. This is a facility which is open and is being fully utilised by our members, but is still not totally finished, with some minor tasks to be completed and final payments made. The grant however has been fully acquitted. Thank you to the Department of Sport and Recreation for the **Female Facility** Grant, Kathy Rogers from the Department of Sport for her support and guidance and John Giles from John Giles Associates our Project Manager. Thank you to everyone we called on to assist in pushing this project through to completion.

We also expended a grant from 2020 from the **Department of Social Services** (\$5000 to be used for Volunteer Training Costs) and received new grants in 2021 from the **Australian Federal Government** (\$5,100 for a Defibrillator and Office Chairs), and the **Queensland State Government** for Active Clubs (\$2000 for Umpire Development), we received funds (\$25,000) from the **Community Gambling Benefit Fund** to upgrade our Toro mower, this has been ordered for 5 months, but delays with COVID shipping sees us still waiting for delivery. We received COVID Grants from the **Brisbane City Council** (\$9052) for grounds maintenance equipment and work, and the **Queensland Rural and Industry Development Authority** (\$10,000) due to loss of income during the August shutdown. Thank you to all who assisted with these grant applications and thank you to the government departments who make the funds available to assist not for profit groups like ours, without this funding many projects could not happen.

Hockey Brisbane Inc. is an association to manage the activities that BHA & BWHA do together and we met regularly in 2021. We introduced for the first time this year an opening of the Brisbane Hockey season a "**Gala Day**", all 10 Division 1 (PL1 and BHL 1) games played together at the State Hockey Centre. It was an enjoyable day with activities for all. We have received good feedback and will take that information and work to have a bigger and better "Gala Day" in 2022. We continue to explore all areas that we can develop together to improve the hockey experience of all in Brisbane. We have also spoken to and met regularly with the HQ CEO, Alison Lyons to allow us to work closely in developing hockey in Brisbane.

Our first Council meeting for the calendar year was on the 2nd February 2021, we discussed:

- The establishment of a PL1 Players Engagement Group – to provide a place for discussion and ideas between players and Board members.
- The Gala Day.

- Fees and the trial of the HQ Senior Social Fee for DP grass players (only playing in the grass competition).
- COVID impacts and the need to use the EVA code to check in.
- The REVSport database.
- Providing information and important dates to get the season under way.

The Junior Committee had 7 members again, led by Judy Hartnett and welcoming new members Janet and Larissa. With Juniors spread across many venues, they use technology especially email to make many decisions to run our very large junior competitions. Thank-you Judy, and your committee for your hard work to get through the Junior season this year.

The affiliations for the Senior Turf teams were submitted at the end of 2020, this provided for 6 divisions. There appeared a number of clubs and players did not want to play in Division 6 as it inferred they were a low-level player, so the Turf competition was rebranded to Premier League (PL) 1 to 3 on Saturday (formerly Div 1 to 3) and Metro League (ML) 1 to 3 (formerly Div 4 to 6) on Sunday. While the PL 1 to 3 seemed to be well received, the ML 1 to 3 did cause some confusion and the Board is considering whether to retain this for 2022.

While the season started well, COVID created a short shutdown at the end of March affecting all competitions and National Representative tournaments. Half games and mid-week games were used to complete BWA fixture rounds. We then got back on track until August, when a major shutdown occurred, the day before the U11 Southern Cross at Downey Park. The Board and fixture committees worked to come up with plans to complete our season once the lockdown was lifted. Community sport had a longer lockdown than other sectors, but a combination of half games, extending the season a week and a shortened finals program saw us finish the season on the 18th September. Thank you to everyone for working with us to find a way to complete our season.

Thanks to **Di Brodie, Lesley Bennett, Kellie Roberts and Judy Hartnett** and your many committees and members for being so accommodating and thorough, doing the task of grading and fixtures throughout the year to deal with COVID shutdowns. Thank you to Kathryn Austen for your support of our volunteers in this area. Thank you to the 3 Match Secretaries, **Kellie, Sue and Cheryl** for your diligence and compassion to assist clubs navigate our rules keeping it fair for everyone.

During the season it was disappointing to have to deal with some poor behaviour on and off the fields, it is essential that clubs work with their members to ensure their behaviour is suitable for our sport. Everyone wants to enjoy themselves and everyone must be treated with respect. Thankfully we did not need to conduct a Judiciary this year, as clubs dealt with concerns when raised with them.

Brisbane Hockey Management Group (BWA, BHA and KWSHC) also had a busy year, with BP2 ready for business from the start of the season and the BP2 amenities block finished and opened in August by the Hon Stirling Hinchliffe. This group is now working to have a scoreboard for BP2 installed and a relocatable office for tournaments and administration organised in the near future.

The REVSport database is still a challenge to navigate, thank you to all club database officers for your hard work in this area. Thank you to **Bron Morris** and Kathryn Austen who have worked hard in this space to keep us informed and supported.

We have some great new umpires and technical officials coming up the ranks, but umpiring is still a challenge in our sport, some clubs are doing a wonderful job promoting and developing umpires, while some are relying on other clubs to carry their load. Thank you to those clubs putting priority and resources into developing their umpires. The Umpire & Technical Committee led by **Sonya Fisher** is always looking for ways to increase and upgrade umpires and technical officials. Thanks to **Jenny Heron, Kathryn Austen, Judy Hartnett and Lesley Bennett** for allocating Technical Officials and Umpires this year.

Casual staff members **Noala Gordon** and **John Robinson** do an enormous amount of work all year round to have our grass fields ready for competition, thank you John and Noala. We continue to have to deal with “Football” boots on our fields causing enormous damage and the park being used continually as a leash-free area for many dogs. Thank you to all clubs who completed their Working Bee allocations in 2021.

During the year it was announced that an Enoggera Creek Sport and Recreation Precinct Plan had been developed in consultation with the many sports and community groups who use the area from Rasey, Victor, Downey, Finsbury, McCook and Spencer Parks along Enoggera Creek. To say the plans were not universally accepted would be an understatement. Unfortunately, our promised artificial surface over a carpark has been caught up in this, and therefore we are still waiting to get the final details on what is happening with this project. We met with Downey Park Netball, Brisbane Softball and Brisbane Table Tennis on a number of occasions to talk through our requirements. We thank them for their support for the great park we all love.

While COVID played havoc with our State and National Tournaments, with contingency plans in place the State Championships went ahead. BWA was scheduled to host the State U18 Women’s tournament, but it was relocated to Townsville to avoid SEQ possible COVID lockdowns. Thank you to **Amy Ryan, Carol Chiu Chong** and all our volunteers for your work in this area to select, train and manage our representative teams, the results were great and can be found in the records section of this report.

BWA retained **briZHockey** for a PL1 game each week. Thanks to Paul Mills for his ongoing support and work ethic to put information out during the year and organise filming while he is located in NSW. A special thanks also to Peter Smith for commentating and assisting with the set up each week.

Thank you to our Downey Park staff: Canteen Convenors –Tracey, Emelia & Jeremy; Admin – Lorraine; Time Stewards Tom/Shona; Rookie – Sue, First Aid – Karen, Genevieve and Tahlana; Bar – Yvie; the Saturday grass fixtures could not run as smoothly without you. A special thanks to Volunteer Bruce Carroll who assists every week at Downey Park, opening and closing the facility.

Thank you to the many volunteers that support our sport, especially to our President **Dr Karin Walduck**, she is an outstanding volunteer, mentor and leader and we are very lucky to have

her. Thank you to the staff members casual, part-time and full time who all provide a great service to our sport. Thank you to the government departments and sponsors who allow us to grow and develop with support, both financial and in-kind.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Well, 2021 has again been quite a year and thanks must go to Kath and the BWAH team in the office.

The audited Financial Statements for the year ending 30 Sept 2021 are at the end of this annual report.

In 2021 our trading position generally returned to pre-Covid levels:

- Revenue was approx. \$1.378m (up from the Covid impacted \$1.245m in 2020 that included \$143k in Covid assistance) and included:
 - \$26k in Grant funding; and
 - \$10k in COVID Assistance (noting no JobKeeper payments were received after September 2020)
- Salaries and wages were similar to FY20 reflecting the smaller footprint of our operating staff due to the uncertainties around Covid and the potential shutdown of community sport
- Profit was higher at \$91k (after higher depreciation expense of \$70k due to the completion of Field 10 Female Facilities) with a portion of the profit to be allocated to reserves to provide for future capex.

DATABASE REPORT

The revolutioniseSPORT database was again mandated by Hockey Australia/Hockey Queensland for member registrations in season 2021. BWAH also used the platform for competition management and reporting for the 2021 competition season.

There are still aspects of the system that have proven challenging, especially in the available reporting & the restrictions around tailoring the system to better match BWAH requirements.

BWAH is also continuing to press HA/HQ to provide members more control over what data is displayed by the system with an expectation for a resolution in this space for 2022 season.

Bron Morris - Database and Club Support

BRIZHOCKEY REPORT

The briZHockey contract for the 2021 season allowed for coverage of 22 games (50% of the time at venues other than the SHC) with a 2-camera set-up. However, Paul Mills again delivered more for BWA with 28 games covered – 24 with 2-cameras and 4 finals with 3-cameras - which delivers an enhanced viewing experience.

Paul and his crew also supported the live streaming of our awards night (a great initiative) as well as our umpires talks at the start of the season. Peter Smith was again instrumental in helping deliver live streaming in 2021 as due to pandemic restrictions, Paul was only able to get into Queensland for two dates. So, a big “thank you” is required to Paul’s Qld based crew and to Peter.

My amazing moment of 2021 was standing at a bus stop in Adelaide St, on the way home from work, taking a call from FIH about the possibility of them streaming our games. BWA is the FIRST HOCKEY ASSOCIATION IN THE WORLD to have its club competition streamed via the FIH Watch.Hockey app. Kudos to Paul for pitching our product to them and then delivering it in a format they could use. While we have not been provided with stats from FIH, when Paul last spoke to them the numbers were around 200-300 views per game – which is amazing for year one for a women’s association from “downunder”!

Paul also undertook extra duties in 2021 as Google transitioned between formats, as during the year, he converted videos from 2012 to 2016 and plans to do the remaining 4 years when time permits.

There are currently discussions underway for what live streaming in 2022 might look like across both BWA and BHA. While BHA has previously covered their whole season, in 2021 they only signed up for finals. BWA has always acknowledged that if we stop coverage, it will probably never commence again – so we hope to be able to continue working with Paul – so watch this space!

COMPETITIONS PORTFOLIO REPORTS

FIXTURES & GRADING

TURF

The season begin with 61 Affiliations from senior turf clubs which included an increase of 5 teams across our Saturday & Sunday fixtures.

With the majority of clubs applying for division 4 and 5 this meant some difficult decisions were required by the gradings committee resulting in Commercial, St Andrews and South West United not being given their first preference of affiliation. The result being even competitions in ML 1,2 &3.

In the middle of the season the fixture and grading committee began an extensive review of the current grading system. This has resulted in a more extensive affiliation process for clubs when they affiliate. The additional information that clubs need to provide for the grading committee will be used to make more informed decisions for the benefit of all competitions. The additional information also required a focus on clubs having adequate support for the teams they want to affiliate for which includes coaches, umpires and goalkeepers.

The 2021 season continued until the lockdowns began in Brisbane in July and community sport was placed on hold. With the decision by clubs not to extend the season into October this again meant that the board of management was required to make some very difficult decisions. A shorter finals series was decided. These are very difficult decisions to make especially as we understood the impact it would have on teams that had performed well throughout the season and missed out on the final's series because of the lockdowns.

With vaccinations and reopening of borders in 2022 we hope for a more consistent and uninterrupted fixture season.

The results for each division in senior turf showed a high level of competition in most divisions. As some clubs build and rebuild their membership base there are still some less competitive games but clubs are working continuously to improve their competitiveness on field.

Thank you to the fixtures and grading committee who have worked very hard this season to improve the grading structure and system and we look forward to seeing how clubs respond to these changes and continue to develop and improve the competitions.

A big thank you to the BWA office staff who have again worked tirelessly during the season with minimal staff to keep our competition running.

To Kathy Proctor whose knowledge and dedication to the sport is unwavering and thank you for your wise counsel. Very big thank you also to Kat Austen our Competitions Officer who lives and breathes our competitions and who's advice I value greatly.

I am looking forward to a full season in 2022 with no interruptions.

GRASS

The 2021 season appeared as if it would run more smoothly than the Covid 19 interrupted year of 2020 then..... the Delta strain arrived which caused the season to be paused, with fears we may not be able to continue. As hockey shares Downey Park with softball, the season could not be extended much to enable the fixtures to be completed with full games, so a combination of half games and double point games ensured that it was possible to get through all the games and allow enough time for the first and second placed teams in all divisions to play a grand final, which again had limited spectators and restricted numbers allowed in the clubhouse which dampened the celebrations.

Only 37 teams were nominated for the grass competition in 2021. While BWA has endeavoured to have an even number of teams distributed over only 4 divisions, with the various combinations of clubs and teams, the fifth division had to be reinstated. The final makeup of the grass competition was DP1 8 teams, DP2 6 teams, DP3 10 teams (although this was reduced to 9 half way through the season when SBE reluctantly withdrew their team due to lack of numbers), DP4 7 teams and DP5 6 teams. The good news is that more teams were added to DP1, which made the division more competitive. The inability to promote teams that continually lead in their division, because there is already a team in the higher division, lead to a serious imbalance between the top teams and the bottom teams in each division. If clubs have a team or teams that continually win their division by a large margin, they need to seriously consider whether they are nominating for the correct division. There isn't time in the season for grading games, nor is there the drive to get promoted to a higher division should grading games be held.

Thank you once again to Noala Gordon and John Robinson for their tireless efforts in preparing and maintaining the fields so that the grass players could showcase their skills.

Thanks also to the Grading Committee which consisted of Lesley Bennett, Tracey O'Connor and Maree Whitchurch and the Fixture Committee – Lesley Bennett, Maree Whitchurch, Margie Brown and Tracey O'Connor.

Last year I signed off hoping that the 2021 season would be better than 2020, and the same wish applies for next season, when we can hopefully get in a full season of hockey.

MASTERS

The Masters competition saw a slight increase in team numbers this year however due to availability of fields, the master's competition at this point will be limited to 7 teams per

division. After a few missed games due to weather and COVID, shortening the season was necessary with finals series in some divisions limited to first and second finishing teams.

The 2021 Masters season was another success, and I am sure that all Masters players are looking forward to 2022.

UMPIRE & TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

In 2021 the U&TC with the assistance of many volunteers and BWHA's MDM and Development & Competitions Officer, continued to work on developing the skills and experience of our umpires and technical personnel.

Thanks also to Jenny Heron who did an awesome job again with Senior Turf Technical allocations, Kathryn Austen who undertook allocations for Junior Turf and Kath Proctor who took on Senior Turf umpiring allocations and Judy Hartnett (Grass Umpire Allocations) in 2021. Trying to take into account everyone's availability **and** experience is a herculean feat, that is not truly understood by the hockey community – so thanks for the dedication these people bring to what they do.

Thanks also to Jas Kay for the Facebook "Rule of the Week" posts she did this year. These created lots of discussion and were shared by some of our clubs and by other HQ Associations – a real success story. We hope to continue this in 2022!

Per below, the BWHA Development team can provide access to courses and people to assist clubs develop umpires and technical personnel – you just need to ask.

Umpire Development

- BWHA can arrange for someone to attend umpiring sessions clubs host – whether it be with Junior teams, sessions with parents or Senior Turf, Grass or Masters' teams.
- These types of sessions can remove some of the anxiety that new or less experienced umpires have and can allow people to say "yes" when asked to give back to the sport by picking up a whistle
- So, in 2022, BWHA would also like clubs to work with us to help their club members to pick up a whistle OR to get their already accredited umpires to find someone to mentor in their club throughout the season (one to one programs can work really well)
- We would also like clubs to assist us to prepare representative umpires to attend HQ State Championships, by ensuring they are available to be allocated to games and actively mentored before the championship

Technical Development

- In 2021, BWHA was able to deliver another Level 0 Technical Course with one of the attendees gaining her Senior Judge Certificate during the season – well done to Jas Kay
- During the year HQ also accredited me to deliver Level 1 Tech Courses and undertake Technical Assessments with my first HQ Championship as an Assessor being the 2021 U18 Men's

- BWA also provided our full complement of technical personnel for State Championships with three of our techs being awarded their Level 1 HockeyEd Technical accreditation – a great result for BWA and of course Kathryn Austen, Carol Chiu Chong and Chang Su.

Clubs need to put the same amount of time and energy into umpiring development as they do to player and coach development.

As always, we had an outstanding group of Level 3 & 2 umpires officiating on many of our fixtures, many who travel from throughout the South East Corner of Queensland. We are very lucky to have the calibre of umpires we do on our PL1 & PL2 games. Thank you to all that travelled, filled gaps at the last minute and mentored other umpires, you are very valuable to BWA.

Thank you to our other Senior Turf mentors Lesley Bennett, Naomi Crase, Sonya Fisher, Emily Gotting, Jasmin Kay, Helen Kura, Aimee Mazzaferri, Chloe Reid, Caitlyn Smith, and Naomi Zerner.

GRASS UMPIRES STEWARD'S REPORT

The senior grass competition at Downey Park this year was reduced slightly due to effects of Covid. 37 teams played senior grass this year compared to 31 during the covid reduced season requiring 36 umpire allocations to be filled each week. Again, there was a group of DP 'regular' umpires but also some other number of young umpires using senior grass competition to hone their umpiring skills and to help their clubs cover their allocations. Where possible these developing umpires were paired with an experienced DP 'regular' and overall, the standard of umpiring was high allowing teams to enjoy their shortened season.

The umpire steward role is made easier by having information about umpires including when they play, any preferences e.g., work restrictions and any injuries or time not available. Clubs that continue to fill their umpire register with players instead of umpires make the umpire

steward role more challenging when the person named is highly likely not to complete the allocation negating the benefit of carefully allocating them when they don't play etc.

Another challenge with umpires at senior grass games is clubs allocating inexperienced umpires with no mentor or support. While I attempt to identify these allocations and place an experienced umpire on the other side of those games, it should be the club's responsibility to look after these umpires. Inexperienced umpires umpiring games they can't handle is stressful for the umpire and disappointing for the teams trying to play a game that is not being managed.

I would like to thank the BWA senior grass clubs, players and club umpire co-ordinators for their support and flexibility to fulfil the Downey Park umpiring requirements each week. I would like to add a particular thank-you to the umpires who were flexible with games and able to swap allocations when unexpected difficulties arose for some umpires.

Recommendations:

- Ensure clubs continue to inform BWA of umpire changes e.g., injuries or absences that affect umpire availability during the season or umpire development intentions and requirements, so umpires can be allocated from the most up-to-date version of their umpire register to minimise changes needed once the draw is published.
- Encourage clubs to list details of junior/beginner umpire needs on their umpire register so they can be allocated to suitable games with experienced umpires to assist their development.
- For clubs to list only umpires capable of the games they are allocated for on their umpire register as per BWA guidelines.

TURF

This was my first season as Turf Match Secretary since pre-computer days, and it took a few weeks to work through the best method of recording the results (many thanks to Kat Austen for some hints!). Some mistakes were still made, and my thanks go to Team Managers and Secretaries for their patience throughout the season.

Lockdowns resulted in Team Sheets and Match Reports being scanned and emailed, which proved a more efficient and better way of performing the job both initially and also when checks of previous rounds were required. U11's enjoyed a friendly 'U11 Carnival Day' in lieu of the cancelled U11 Southern Cross.

U13 Southern Cross & State Championships – Our U13's travelled to Gympie, and while it was in the balance whether they would be able to attend (as a local government lockdown was active in the days leading up to their departure), they still managed to get there and overall had a very successful tournament – out of the entire cohort (57 players), only 1 player had ever attended a State Championship before.

All 4 Brisbane teams were a dominant force in every division they played in.

U13/1 – 1st in Division 1; **U13/2** – 2nd in Division 1; **U13/3** – 1st in Division 2; **U13/4** – 5th in Division 2

U15 Southern Cross & State Championships – Our U15's travelled to the Gold Coast after a disruptive lead up to their tournament (cancellation of their U15 Southern Cross and in turn, less trainings), however despite the challenges they too were a dominant force in the divisions they competed in.

U15/1 – 1st in Division 1; **U15/2** – 5th in Division 1; **U15/3** – 3rd in Division 2; **U15/4** – 1st in Division 2

U18 Southern Cross & State Championships – Our U18's were relocated to Townsville due to the potential risk of hosting the State Championships in Brisbane (being the city most likely to experience lockdowns) – ironically Townsville also ended up experiencing their own lockdown on the final day of competition. Thankfully the tournament was able to come to its completion and the cohort was able to travel home safely.

Once again BWA is proud of the performance of our teams, 2 out of 3 playing in a grand final.

U18/1 – 2nd in Division 1; **U18/2** – 2nd in Division 2; **U18/3** – 3rd in Division 2

Masters State Championships – Our Masters headed to Warwick, and experienced what was likely the coldest tournament of the season. While the temperature, travel and facilities had its challenges, our 6 teams once again represented BWA proudly.

Bris 1 – 4th in Division 1; **Bris 2** – 5th in Division 2; **Bris 3** – 4th in Division 3; **Bris 4** – 6th in Division 3; **Bris 5** – 2nd in Division 6, **Bris 6** – 7th in Division 6

Hockey Queensland Championships – Our HQ Champs team headed to Toowoomba over the May long weekend and competed in the inaugural Hockey Queensland Championships (formally known as Opens State Championships). While their preparation was short, the team succeeded to going undefeated throughout the tournament.

HQ Championships Team – 1st (only one division)

I have to acknowledge the volunteer selectors and coaches of each age group and highlight what an incredible job they do, in what are generally thankless and scrutinised positions. Your efforts are highly valued and I hope to see you nominate again in the future.

Another mention to all of the managers of each team – the lengths they go to in ensuring each task is met to a high standard is incredible. We're thankful for your time.

Without volunteers in these positions, our representative teams struggle to operate as smoothly as they do.

BWHA is always seeking nominations from all of its members and willingly give support to anyone who would be interested in filling one of these roles in 2022.

Umpires were exposed to Introduction to Umpiring clinics, Turf & Grass Umpires Talks and the Umpire Mentor Workshop as well as many BWHA mentors out on the grounds. Many clubs took advantage of our services in regards to umpiring development and held Umpiring Development Clinics.

We're happy to state that **39 Umpires** received new accreditations this season.

We successfully ran a **Level 1 Coach** course (14 participants) in conjunction with a **Level 2 Coach** course (20 participants) under the Hockey Brisbane banner, and incorporated more development tools for our representative and school coaches.

We held the inaugural **Junior Coach Workshop** and are pleased with the outcome and look forward to building on it next season.

In 2022 we hope to expand in the coach development space with more workshops for all coaches to access.

We reached approximately **66 schools** and showcased hockey to **3662 students**. There were **12 Sporting Schools** programs and **3 Hookin2Hockey programs**.

The Term 1 Hookin2Hockey programs continue to be a great initiative, with many local clubs reaping the benefits of this recruitment tool. We'll continue to do these programs in 2022, and we hope more local clubs become on board. More thanks go to the coaches within our School Coaches Network who assist us in delivering their programs and gives us a wider reach.

The maintenance of Downey and Rasey Parks that we lease is completed by casual Noala Gordon (about 8 hours a week) and John Robinson (contractor 1 day a week), but they provide much more service than the hours imply. Apparel

Thank you to all the team managers who were able to assist on the busy uniform shop mornings. We trialled some Sundays this year to avoid the Rasey Park car park issues on a Saturday morning and they seemed to work well when able to happen. We will continue to improve uniform shop hours for teams into 2022.

Uniform & Equipment

We continue to replace old uniforms each year. In 2022 we will be updating some of our GK Smocks as Hockey Queensland now require them to be numbered front and back with a 1 or 2-digit number (due to the ongoing use of AltiusRT) and a lot of our GK smocks have 3-digit numbers. In 2022, we hope to be able to supply all U13, U15 and U18 teams with the cherry and alternate blue skirt for their championships as we continue to purchase more blue skirts.

We will purchase some more balls as we rotate out the unusable ones and a few ball bags which have broken this year due to age.

Tours

The 2021 State Championship venues were originally those planned to be the venues for the cancelled 2020 Championships.

The Masters Championships were held in Warwick. Our accommodation venue just outside of Warwick booked in 2019 for the entire contingent had not survived the COVID shutdowns of 2020 unscathed and after much concern it was agreed with the venue that they could not provide the level of accommodation previously agreed upon and the decision was made after Brisbane teams had been announced, to move all the Brisbane teams and officials to Toowoomba for accommodation. We were successfully able to place the 6 teams across 4 venues. Thank you to Karin Walduck for her assistance liaising with our Warwick accommodation and for the teams and officials who made the hour-long drive to and from Toowoomba each day for the tournament.

Brisbane was initially scheduled to host the U18 State Championships however Hockey Queensland made the decision to move the U18 event to Townsville due to less likelihood of COVID shutdowns. Thankfully it was a big centre and we were able to get our teams accommodation, flights and ground transport with relative ease at short notice. A shutdown in Townsville was called for 6pm on the final day just as our teams were boarding a flight home. They all safely arrived back in Brisbane as a lockdown also commenced in Brisbane.

The U13's headed to Gympie and a 3-day snap lockdown was called for South East Queensland 4 days prior to departure. Our thanks to Hockey Queensland who were in constant contact with Associations navigating the issues related to this. A further 1-day lockdown was advised for Brisbane which led into the scheduled day of departure. The lockdown was lifted at 6pm after our teams had been originally due to depart for Gympie. As a result, we worked with Belbaker Bus Lines who were very accommodating with after-hours contact and negotiated a 4am departure time for the first day of competition to get our teams to Gympie for the tournament commencing at 7am. Our thanks also to Maranatha Camp for working with us for our late arrival and change of plans. Our thanks to players, officials and families for making this work.

The U11 Southern Cross Tournament was scheduled to take place on Sunday August 1st and sadly on Saturday July 31st a snap lockdown was called in Brisbane and the Southern Cross tournament was cancelled. We had a clubhouse full of stock and 4 very disappointed teams. Unfortunately, we were unable to reschedule the Southern Cross event. We were able to hold an U11 Exhibition Day in September to give our teams a chance to wear their uniforms and compete.

Our U15's teams were sadly unable to travel to the U15 Southern Cross event due to a lockdown affecting South East Queensland, however they were successfully able to travel to the Gold Coast for their State Championships.

What we have found this year with accommodation is that the state of most venues has declined due to lack of use and less tourists. Whilst all venues were originally great, sadly they haven't been as good as they would normally be. Another Covid side effect for 2021.

CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

The Junior Committee supports the provision of hockey for juniors in Brisbane from U7s to Js (U18). We work with the BWA staff to organise, manage and support the junior fixture competition including grading. This year the Junior Committee maintained its membership of seven members. 2021 was another year disrupted by Covid but not as heavily as 2020 with all teams being able to complete a full season including finals. The junior committee took over the junior match secretary role to monitor players in all junior divisions and report any registration lapses to BWA for communication with clubs. Clubs change junior volunteers quite regularly and this process assists educate clubs to some rules they may not have been aware of before.

2021 Competitions

Junior Turf:

The number of junior turf teams increased by 1 overall with 2 less in JT and 3 more in 13T. The junior turf season started as scheduled in early March. 13T1 continued playing on Friday nights and 13T2 on Saturday morning. Most 13T2 games were able to be played on turf with only a few grass games necessitated by some turf fields not being available with date changes after the calendar had been published. 50 teams competed in junior turf divisions, 33 in JT and 17 in 13T. 4 clubs fielded teams in both U13T divisions showing growth in this age group on turf. One U13T team was not included in the competition as the majority of the team was still U11 age. The results in all junior turf divisions showed a spread of abilities. The dilemma of grading divisions so the competition is as evenly matched as possible vs clubs looking to develop players and teams through the challenge of playing higher divisions remains a balancing act for the grading committee and clubs. The desire to field junior teams on turf can lead to disappointing results for some teams including 38% of teams losing more than half the games played. The most consistent division for spread of results was JT3 although there was one team who lost every game.

Junior Grass:

The number of Junior Grass teams dropped overall in 2021. The Under 11 age group returned to having 4 divisions after 5 in 2020 and overall in Under 11 there was 1 less team. Extra U13 turf teams lead to only 10 teams nominating to play U13 Grass down from a total of 12 teams in 2020. The grading committee had no choice but to put them all in one division resulting in a very disparate competition with many large defeats for some teams. The JG competition increased by 2 teams and have 6 clubs fielding a JG team in each division.

The timeslots were very challenging to organise this year with the aim of trying to maximise the options for teams to have substitute players from teams below available for all clubs. The only option to avoid several clubs having teams play at the same time was to hold the JG1 games at 8am. Feedback about this choice indicated a flow on to senior grass in the afternoon not having juniors to draw on and to offer development opportunities in these games. As development is a BWA focus this will be noted for extra consideration in 2022.

U7 & U9:

The U7 and U9 competitions ran smoothly this year. The proactive approach of the coordinator who was able to identify issues e.g., missing goalies in U9 or extra boys on the field and inform clubs on the spot to educate club personnel was valuable. The sports trainer at

Rasey Park most Saturdays was a great support for players, parents and the co-ordinator. The Super Hero Day where players were encouraged to come and play in costume was a great success and will be continued.

U11 Southern Cross:

The U11 Southern Cross did not occur again this year due to a snap Covid lockdown making 2 years in a row this age group has missed the opportunity to participate at a representative level. A carnival was held at the start of 2021 to make up for missing the tournament early in the 2021 season but it had to coincide with grading games making it a busy morning.

Junior Umpires

Clubs umpired their own games again in 2021 except for finals. Umpire development is a club responsibility and BWAH supports this with mentors and workshops.

In the finals clubs were asked to provide names of junior umpires they thought would be capable of officiating on a junior final – turf or grass. Umpiring finals is a recognition of a job well done throughout the season. The response was better than 2020. The Junior committee would like to work more actively in 2022 to support junior umpires especially at Downey Park where they can be watched, mentored and encouraged.

On behalf of the 2021 Junior Committee would like to thank the staff of the BWAH office for their assistance during the season so we could do our job to organise the junior competitions for the season. We would also like to thank all the club/school officials, parents and spectators who supported so many juniors taking part in hockey for the 2021 season.

RESULTS



Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 112:	Income Taxes
AASB 1031:	Materiality
ASB 110:	Events after the Balance Sheet Date

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost, less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the management committee to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flow that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The net expected cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories of trading stock held for future use are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Income Tax

Income derived by the Association is exempt from income tax in accordance with section 50-20 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(d) Provisions

Adequate provision is made in the Financial Accounts to cover future liability for-

Note 7: Buildings

During 2020 \$577,000 was provided for in the Financials for the construction of a new amenities block on Noble Street of which \$498,000 was provided from a State Government Grant, and \$79,000 spent from BWA funds. The field 10 building is shown in the Non-Current Assets as a "Constructed Non-Financial Asset" with a corresponding "Value Of Constructed Non-Financial Asset" shown in the Capital and Reserves – for the amount of grant funds provided. The Building is on land owned by local authorities, leased to BWA. The BWA has no right of recovery of this amount in the event of a termination of the lease. BWA has a recurring 4 year lease, which will continue for the foreseeable future. BWA is responsible for the maintenance and care of the building as part of the requirements of the lease.

The historical "Buildings at Cost" at Downey Park and Rasey Park are shown as a Non-Current Asset in the Balance Sheet at a written down value of \$395,588, to reflect the original cost to the Association, and to expend that cost by way of a Depreciation charge annually charged against current income. As the Buildings are on land owned by local authorities, the BWAHA has no right of recovery of this amount in the event of termination of leases. BWAHA has a recurring 4 year lease, and see no reason for this to not continue.

All buildings that are reflected in the Depreciation Schedule are currently used for activities conducted by BWAHA. The depreciation for buildings is set at rates of 2.5% to 5% per annum depending on the expected replacement period.

Independence


In conducting the audit, I have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.
