PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It was a very wet start to the 2022 hockey season, with the major rain event and subsequent flooding in Brisbane in late February. Our initial hopes that floodwaters would not exceed previous levels were dashed when floodwaters inundated the ground level of the Downey Park clubhouse to within millimetres of the top floor. And all our other buildings were not spared either – the Rasey Park clubhouse, the female change facility on field 10, our storage sheds with tractors, mowers and golf buggy were all inundated. It has been a monumental effort trying to get all the facilities cleaned up, repaired or replaced, and back into operational order. The clubhouse is still in a state of semi-repair, with painting currently underway, leaving installation of services yet to be done. In all of this it has been a credit to everyone in our association that we managed to still run a successful winter fixture season.

The Enoggera Creek Precinct Plan encompassing plans for a turf at Downey Park, which had seemed to go into hiatus over the Christmas break, was summarily cancelled, not just deferred, by the Brisbane City Council as a consequence of the flood impact. This in spite of a turf at Downey Park being an election promise by the BCC. What this means for Downey Park moving forward is yet to be re-evaluated. It needs to be decided whether we try again, or whether we redirect our energies elsewhere.

2022 player numbers bounced back after the impacts of COVID-3,541 players were registered as at the end of the season, which represents a 2% increase of pre-COVID numbers. Flooding did not impact on the start of turf fixtures with hockey fixtures for Premier League (PL 1-3), Metro League (ML 1-3) and Junior Turf (JT) fixtures underway at five turf venues in March. Senior Grass also started in March, but the start of junior grass fixtures was delayed until after Easter to enable to fields to recover from their big soaking.

Shared activities with BHA were once again fixture and venue scheduling, the U11 Southern Cross/Coulter Shield day in August, a cut-down version of Gala Day at the start of the season, and shared turf Grand Final days. We continue to look at and address areas where working together achieves better outcomes.

For the first time in many years BWHA hosted a State Championship, namely the U18 Women's State Championships, in June at the Brisbane North Hockey Centre, Burringbar Park. Special thanks go to Board member Bron Morris and the BWHA staff for the outstanding effort they put into planning and running of what was a very successful three days of competition. Thanks also to the many volunteers that assisted.

Our streaming of hockey fixtures via briZHockey continued again this year and included streaming of both PL1 and PL2 games. Whilst this service comes at a cost to members general feedback is that it is valued and to continue with the service.

Board meetings continue to be held twice/month, generally one face to face and the other via zoom. I have re-nominated for another term in 2023 as have most of the current Board members. Some thought and consideration is being given to devolving more discussions and activities to working committees, to free up the Board to spend a little more time on strategic initiatives and forward planning — for example, major lobbying is required to ensure a hockey legacy is retained from Brisbane hosting the 2032 Olympics.

We continue to work with Brisbane Hockey Association (BHA) to administer Hockey Brisbane Inc, where we share and discuss topics and activities of particular interest to both associations. One such topic this year was a combined forum where we considered issues around our junior competitions. We also worked with BHA and Kedron Wavell Services Hockey Club (KWSHC) to administer the Brisbane Hockey Management Group (BHMG), which manages the Brisbane North Hockey Centre.

I would like to thank all the members of my board for their commitment, enthusiasm and, in particular, their resilience during the year. To all the dedicated volunteers at club and association level — thank you, because your workload this year was also substantially increased. And last but certainly not least, my sincere thanks to Kath Proctor and all the BWHA staff for their ongoing support and tremendous work effort in what has been yet another quite unique year.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Prior to the local government elections in March 2020, Brisbane City Council gave an election promise to build a turf on a carpark at Downey Park. They then commenced a review of the entire sporting precinct with the Enoggera Creek Precinct Plan. Council provided draft plans to residents and sporting groups and the proposal involved significant upheaval to many long-established sporting clubs and associations in this precinct.

This process was not handled well by Council and resulted in many sporting groups and residents in the area expressing disappointment and concern about the proposed changes to the precinct. For us, the changes were potentially significant but we approached the proposal with an open mind and expressed our concerns and provided appropriate feedback. We also worked with Brisbane Softball Association as joint tenants of Downey Park and endeavoured to find solutions that worked for both parties.

The end proposal was a single turf being built on top of a carpark on what we affectionately know as the 'cabbage patch'. This was not ideal for BWHA for so many reasons but we were working with softball and other groups on how we could make best use of the park and still get the turf we so desperately need. Unfortunately, following the massive flood of the park (and of the Brisbane region) in February this year and the costs associated with community and flood recovery, Council abandoned any plans for the sporting precinct renewal and this included the turf. We believe it is not likely these plans will be revisited any time soon.

Bearing this in mind, we will continue to engage with Council on future options for additional turfs in the Brisbane region and this includes being a part of the Hockey Queensland Facilities Working Group which is working with the Queensland Government on plans for facilities for the Olympics in 2032.

In the meantime, we continue to struggle as existing turf facilities do not meet our growing demand for contemporary hockey played on a synthetic surface. Sporting fields located on flood prone land provide us little/no opportunity for development. Urban development also means green space (in particular green space for sporting facilities) is in peak demand and

unlikely to be given to low profile sports like hockey. The Olympics may or may not provide a legacy pitch/es but at the moment this may be our only hope.

I'd like to recognise a few fantastic people who really helped us along the long, tiring and frustrating journey for a turf at Downey Park which commenced early in 2012. Tony Battams (provided us all the drawings), Tony Loveday from RMA Engineers (an expert in flood engineering like you have never met), Hannah Tohill (town planner extraordinaire) from (then) Wolter Consulting, and Andrew Middleton from Douglas Partners (geotechnical engineer). These experts in their different areas all provided positive and valuable information that supported our turf request to Council and without them it would not have been possible to get as far as we did. For their efforts, we give our heartfelt thanks.

We will keep up the good fight to provide more and better facilities for you, our members. Our sport continues to experience positive growth in player numbers so our need for more facilities will not abate anytime soon.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The eighty-eighth AGM was held on Tuesday 23rd November, 2022. Our 2021 **Volunteer of the Year Awards** were presented to **Judy Hartnett** (Juniors) and **Bruce Carroll** (Seniors). Service Awards for 10, 15, 20 and 25 years of service to BWHA were presented. New Board member Kate Smith was welcomed.

Our long-time casual Grounds Supervisor Noala had a short break in November and during her absence Clare Slocomb offered assistance with mowing, Clare also encouraged a number of friends to assist, for which we were very grateful.

At the end of 2021, planning meetings were undertaken and we planned for a "normal" season in 2022. Unfortunately, our plans were short lived as Omicron came our way as the borders opened up and 2022 was ushered in.

The BWHA Office closed for it's Christmas break on the 17th December and on the 28th December a local community member saw water spilling over our veranda from a pipe that had burst behind our industrial glass water (which had not been used since COVID started), which flooded our first floor, entering our office space and running down through the light fittings into the canteen below. Thanks to the wonderful community member for alerting the BCC and our Facebook page, and thank you to the BCC personnel who attended to make the place safe, and Amy, Carol, Lyle and Ben who responded to clean up the mess. Thankfully there was less damage than first feared, but it did delay the start of our 2022 return to work. The first day back on the 17th January, saw no lights under the clubhouse, and no electricals in the office until checked by our electricians.

We had organised prior to Christmas for painters to freshen up the downstairs area of the clubhouse from floor to ceiling. We thought for a moment that it wouldn't be possible, but after a short delay to organise lighting, this was completed.

A new Golf Buggy arrived, replacement shade sails for the front of the Just Hockey end of the building and the first aid room installed. The BCC replaced many of our old lights in the clubhouse with LEDs as part of their resilience program. One of the electrician's installing this thought she had COVID so work stopped and a clean of the facility done, but while she did have a virus thankfully it was not COVID. We finally took delivery of our new replacement ride-on mower in January. Miesh Elmes came on board as the Development Office to support our members at the grassroots level.

With COVID still causing concern our first Board Meeting with the Junior Committee was via ZOOM and the first Council Meeting also held via ZOOM. As part of the first Council Meeting for 2022, a PowerPoint presentation was created by Kathryn Austen to induct new and returning club delegates, to assist them in the important role of administering their club and providing the correct information to BWHA when requested. We congratulated Life Member Lyn Thomas on her OAM for Services to hockey in the Australia Day Honours list.

The Rasey Park working bee was completed in January supervised by Karin Walduck, ready for the JTAS Primary Schools competition held there each February/March. The working bee for Downey Park was held on the 19th February and we thank all clubs for their support in these.

Our second Council Meeting was held via ZOOM due to the ongoing COVID threat, but planning for a full season was underway, with some new protocols introduced to deal with any possible effects of COVID on teams. The start of the season was again to be a "Gala Day" to celebrate the opening of the season with 5 men's and 5 women's division 1 games all played at the same venue on the same day, a special day for everyone to celebrate hockey in Brisbane.

Following a very wet summer, on Friday 25th February, the forecast was for significant rain over the weekend. BWHA has always dealt with flooding at Downey and Rasey Parks and have over the years worked hard to make our facilities as flood resilient as possible. So, on this Friday when we left the office all items had been raised above 1.2 metres (the highest flood height known in the last 20 years) in all the ground floor areas at DP and RP. We knew there would be some local flooding, but felt we had prepared for what was coming, but no one expected the rain-bomb we received in south east Queensland that weekend. Early on the Saturday morning I travelled into Downey Park, waded through the water to get into the clubhouse, everything was still high and dry. Normal floods at DP & RP come up and go down very quickly, but as we all know this did not happen this year. On that Saturday the rain did not stop, the power of the rain was unbelievable. As the day progressed, we all knew it would be a new record flood height but never expected it to reach the levels it did. Photos taken by local people, showed the height which was unbelievable. We were extremely lucky the rain stopped when it did, as the water was only inches from entering the first-floor level of both the DP & RP Clubhouses, the maintenance shed purposely placed at the highest point of the park also had water enter it for the first time ever.

When the water finally receded, the damage could be assessed. Downey Park is traditionally a quick drying area, but we had had so much rain prior to this event and the water stayed on the fields for days, the fields were unplayable for weeks following the event. The damage was significant, and at the time of print we are still in the process of fixing and replacing all the damage at both DP and RP. Thank you to our own members "Mud Army" who helped clean

our facilities, and especially our staff who for weeks were cleaning and washing items. The new amenities facility at Noble Street, which was built 1.2m above ground, at additional cost, to withstand our normal flood levels, was inundated, but the design saw minimal damage to the infrastructure, but the electricals (including the flood lights) and gas all needed major work to restore. We are lucky we had flood insurance which is covering most of the repairs, but we have been advised that flood insurance will no longer be available to any SEQ sporting group, so we will need to determine how we self-insure for this in the future.

A special thanks to our casual grounds staff Noala and John, and their band of volunteers who worked tirelessly when conditions allowed to get the fields mowed and marked to start the grass season. The Gala Day did go ahead, but in a low-key fashion, this decision was to allow people some normality after a week of disaster for many. Thank you to the **BCC** for emergency funds to assist with the clean-up at DP & RP and for providing collection of the damaged items. Thank you to the **Department of Sport** for assisting with a grant for items not covered by Insurance and to further improve our flood resilience. We also set up an Australian Sports Foundation Appeal, and to date have received \$2212.11 in donations, thank you to all who have donated.

Following this event, the year seemed to roll on, through the will of the members and staff, but the impact of the flood was felt at every level and every area of our association in some way or another during the year. We have not been able to use the majority of the ground floor of the DP Clubhouse this year, relocating the Saturday Office and Canteen upstairs. Due to our numbers, we needed the toilets downstairs, so every week our President cleaned and mopped them for use, as we couldn't allow outside cleaners safe night time access to the area. Thank you to Lorraine and Bruce for ensuring this transition ran smoothly and to Sarah and staff in the canteen/bar for operating under limited facilities. The Sports Trainers at DP were without vehicles for the first few weeks of the season as we were awaiting replacements. Thank you to everyone for their patience and understanding during this difficult time.

Following the reduced player numbers in recent years due to COVID, 2022 saw us increase our member numbers to above pre-COVID levels. This meant increased team numbers in our Senior Turf and Juniors. Thank you to all our Fixture and Grading Committees for organising the competitions for our members.

Following twelve months of discussion, ideas and plans with the BCC, the Enoggera Creek Precinct Plan was rescinded following the floods. This has left the promise the BCC made to BWHA pre the last election to build a synthetic turf at Downey Park lost. We are still in discussion with the BCC, but cannot provide any update on this, at this time.

We sent teams and personnel to all state championships and regional tournaments in 2022 for the first time in two years and all teams acquitted themselves well. The full details can be found in later reports. Thank you to Amy, Miesh and Carol for their work in facilitating this. In 2022 we hosted a State Championships for the first time in a number of years. As we do not have a turf at Downey Park, any hosting we do must be at another facility, which adds to the cost, workload and preparation. Bron Morris looked after this area with Kathryn Austen and they produced a great U18 Women's tournament at Burringbar Park in June/July. Thank you to BHMG for all your assistance in allowing us to host the event at your facility. We hosted the U11 Southern Cross and Coulter Shield at Downey Park again after the COVID break for

the last two years. Without a functioning canteen downstairs, we created a temporary canteen with hire equipment and volunteers to feed the many visitors we had at DP. Thank you to all who assisted on this day.

Hockey Australia and Hockey Queensland encouraged all hockey associations to support special events in our calendar. This year we acknowledged through our Social Media and general communications, Men's Round, Women's Round, Pride Round, and the Indigenous Round. A special thanks to the Anno Family who assisted with providing guidance and indigenous artwork to celebrate that round, and our many indigenous members who provided a personal snapshot for our social media.

BWHA retained Paul Mills and briZHockey telecasts in 2022. While this is a significant outlay, it provides a unique service to our hockey community. Thank you to Paul for being the driving force behind this and the volunteer commentators who makes themselves available each week.

2022 has been difficult for many this year, our thoughts are with those who have lost loved ones, those who have been devasted by the floods or other natural disasters. It is important we as a community continue to support and assist each other in whatever capacity we can. Thank you to our magnificent volunteers led by our President Dr Karin Walduck and our staff who are willing to do whatever it takes to keep hockey going in Brisbane.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Each year, seems to create its own new and unique challenges. Sonya takes a strong leadership and oversite role with the finances for BWHA, with the actual administration of the finances is spread across the staff of BWHA, each looking after the areas under their control. The strong financial position of BWHA is down to all these people.

The audited Financial Statements for the year ending 30 Sept 2022 are at the end of this annual report.

In 2022 our trading position returned to pre-Covid levels:

- The impact of the floods means some budgeted expenditure was not used in 2022 and will therefore be utilised next year as repairs are finalised.
- We have a provision for equipment replacement and upgrade that could not be completed this year due to the flooding.
- We received grants from the BCC for immediate flood assistance for \$10,000 and have applied for State Government Grant money for further flood resilience work in 2023.
- Salaries and wages were up, as we re-employed a Development Officer to offer more programs to our grassroots members.
- Profit was \$16k.

DATABASE AND CLUB SUPPORT REPORT

Database

Starting the 2022 season with the same member & competition management database as the previous season was of benefit to administrators who did not have the added burden of a new system added to the other challenges of start of season. It is an ongoing disappointment that RevSport still does not appear capable of running the sorts of reports BWHA would find helpful for both daily administration and data analysis to aid strategic planning.

BWHA and BHA again jointly decided that sharing a single RevSport member management system supplied the most straightforward registration option for our families who play across both Associations. Where functionality issues arose with the system, both Associations worked together on a solution or to escalate to Hockey Queensland.

Hockey Queensland has scheduled the 2023 rollover of the RevSport platform for Monday 19th December 2022 and all clubs need to have their club portals set up in early January 2023.

Queensland U18 Girls Championship 26-28 June 22

After two years of COVID delays, BWHA finally hosted the Queensland U18 Girls Championship from 26-28 June at Brisbane North Hockey Centre (Burringbar Park). The weather was kind and the contributions of a large group of people contributed to a successful event. Thanks must go to:

- Brisbane Hockey Management Group (BHMG) for supplying the venue to BWHA at zero cost. This was the only way that BWHA could run the Championship without financial loss and the support pre, during & post event from the BHMG board was greatly appreciated.
- The volunteers from all the BWHA clubs who supplied marquees and staffed the BBQ tent. The BBQ tent enabled us to make just under \$500 profit for the event. This was subsequently given to BHMG as a token of BWHA's appreciation for their support.
- The BWHA Office staff who worked many unpaid hours in the months & weeks leading to & over the duration of the event.
- The various local politicians at all levels who supplied marguees.
- Kedron Wavell Services Club for allowing us to reserve sections of the carpark for team vehicle parking.
- The BWHA BOM, Life Members and all other helpers with the daily set up/pack up, hospitality room support, cleaning amenities, emptying bins and the myriad of other tasks needed to run a large event.

BRIZHOCKEY REPORT

The briZHockey contract for the 2022 season allowed for coverage of 44 games to be filmed back-to-back (50% of the time at venues other than the SHC) with a 2-camera set-up. However, Paul Mills again delivered more for BWHA with 46 games covered — 43 with 2-cameras and 3 finals with 3-cameras — which delivers an enhanced viewing experience.

In 2022 for the first time, we had regular coverage of the PL2 competition and finals coverage of the PL3 games. For a number of weeks due to the draw games were not always back-to-back, meaning the crew sitting around for 90 minutes between games. Games were shared evenly as well as the draw would allow and the infrastructure at venues provided. Paul was instrumental in securing a scaffolding for SHC field 2 which allowed more games to be filmed in the finals, this is the first time any games have been filmed on SHC2 in 11 years.

Paul and his crew also supported the live streaming of our awards night (a great initiative) at the end of the season and the first time Paul was back on BWHA soil for over a year.

Peter Smith was again instrumental in helping deliver live streaming in 2022 and was often joined by Michael Price (Ascot Arana) who also works for the ABC as a commentator.

Paul made free videos, looking for sponsors, for our new sponsor Ascot Arana (other clubs have already shown an interest in doing this for 2023) and videos to help raise funds for our Flood Appeal and Peter Smith as he raised money for ovarian cancer research.

While BHA has previously covered their whole season, in 2021 and 2022 they only signed up for finals. BWHA has always acknowledged that if we stop coverage, it will probably never commence again – so we hope to be able to continue working with Paul – so watch this space!

COMPETITIONS PORTFOLIO REPORTS

FIXTURES & GRADING

TURF

It was great to see our turf competitions grow again in 2022. Growing to 67 teams, an increase of 5 turf teams for the 2022 season. It is a real positive the continued growth in our turf competitions and reiterates our commitment (BWHA and clubs) to grow and foster women's hockey in Brisbane. But with the growth comes responsibility not only from BWHA in terms of planning and delivery of fixtures but our Clubs need to make sure that their growth is sustainable with full teams that include goalkeepers, enough Club umpires & coaches. We now have a grading system that gives Clubs a lot more flexibility and clubs should use this flexibility to give themselves the time they need to grow organically and not rush their growth to ensure they don't stretch players or volunteers.

Again, we found additional pressures on our fixtures with wet weather and other hockey events utilising turf availability. Organising the fixtures is not always a simple process. It is very time consuming with factors that impact the schedule such as turf availability, umpire availability, linking with BHA, managing specific time requirements for filming for briZHockey, plus general pre-season Club requests. There will always be circumstances during a season where the scheduling of fixtures and external competitions clash making player availability limited, this is when a club's planning and depth is most important. Increased planning at club level is recommended so as not to see a repeat of a forfeit in Division 1, our premier competition.

The assessment of a competition is often in how competitive it is and this year finals participants came down to the last fixture games in most divisions. This indicates that with our growth we are still maintaining our competitiveness. Mid-year BWHA held an information session for Clubs on affiliations, gradings & fixtures to outline what information the grading committee are seeking from Clubs and to help clubs as best we can whilst they are formulating their planning for the 2023 season.

I would like to firstly thank the Fixture & Grading Committee - Jenny Heron, Ellen Carey & Anna Mehonoshen, I'm so thankful for everything you bring to the table. You are hardworking and dedicated members of the BWHA community, and we would be a lesser organisation without you.

Huge thank you to the staff in the BWHA office. Your dedication to our players is amazing and I cannot thank you enough. I will again single out Kat Austen, for her organisation, commitment, enthusiasm and insight.

Thanks must also go to our Club volunteers who have continued their work under stressful and often thankless conditions - You keep our sport developing & growing - Thank you.

GRASS

Grass Grading

The 2022 season proved challenging for the Grass Grading Committee. With 36 teams nominating, the committee, which consisted of Lisa Donaldson, Lesley Bennett, Tracey O'Connor and Maree Whitchurch, considered changing the number of divisions from five to four, principally because divisions of 8 teams require 21 weeks of fixtures, which leaves little room for additional fixtures to be played in case of wet weather, and necessitating the use of the Masters State Championships weekend to play when many players and officials are absent. This would have meant that there may have been more than one team from a club in the same divisions, which is not favoured by many clubs. Choosing not to go down this path led to an uneven competition in many divisions, exacerbated by the large number of half games played in the later stages of the season to make up for the games cancelled due to wet weather. What needs to be considered in 2023 is what is best for an even and fair competition that is enjoyable for all players, not just for the players from the team that constantly wins. The lowest division is where the players new to hockey, juniors from the grass competition and those returning from long absences can develop their hockey in a safe and fun environment.

Grass Fixtures

Thank you to BWHA ground staff of Noala Gordon, John Robinson and their band of volunteers for preparing our grass fields to enable the fixtures to go ahead during 2022. Due to unprecedented rain in both February and May it was uncertain whether fixtures could start on the planned date or whether the washed out games could be made up later in the season. The Fixtures Committee, which consisted of Lesley Bennett, Margie Brown, Tracey O'Connor and Maree Whitchurch met at the beginning of the season to provide the season draw. While DP1 was prioritised on Field 1, many teams enjoyed the chance to play on the best field during their raffle days. Unfortunately, the different combinations of clubs in each division did not lend itself to "club days" on any particular field. Due to the need to maximise the games at Downey Park, there were no games played at any club's home fields.

MASTERS

I once again had the pleasure of chairing the Masters Fixtures and Grading Committees which consisted of myself, Lesley Bennett, Pam Nitarski and Caroline Schomberg. The committee worked hard again this year in the pre-season, grading teams into divisions which would provide the best competition and participation for all players as well as ensuring an even split of timeslots for fixtures. Clubs are making progress every year in grading their own players and teams into suitable divisions meaning that there was little movement of teams at the grading stage by the committee. 2022 saw the Masters competition full, with 28 teams competing. No further growth will be possible as far as numbers of teams who can play due to the availability of turf on a Monday night. Some torrential rain early in the season and some issues with lighting affected the season with games being made up in later rounds over two halves.

A special council meeting was held this year to discuss the BWHA Masters Competitions. The meeting had some very useful feedback and ideas provided by club representatives and as a result, this meeting identified the need and paved the way for a newly formed Masters committee in 2023.

2022 was another successful season and I am sure that all Masters players are looking forward to returning in 2023.

UMPIRE & TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

The Umpire & Technical Committee had 8 dedicated members this year who worked closely with the BWHA MDM, Competitions and Development Officer to achieve our outcomes.

Jasmin Kay worked again on the rule of the week which was very engaging with our members across the BWHA social media accounts and was shared widely by many other hockey clubs and Associations across Australia.

Jenny Heron worked tirelessly on the senior turf technical allocations, as well as recruiting and upskilling many of these members and Kathryn Austen completed the Junior Turf technical allocations. Judy Hartnett and Kathryn Austen worked closely with our umpires and club umpire coordinators to complete umpire allocations for Senior Turf and Grass. A number of our younger, inexperienced umpires had the opportunity to officiate with our experienced umpires this season and it is something we will continue to foster and develop in 2023.

Working alongside our Umpire Stewards, Tamiesha Elmes took on the role of Umpire Accreditations, organising our umpire mentors and assessors this season. Miesh's hard work in this role saw many new umpires accredited and many experienced umpires upgraded during this season.

BWHA hosted the U18 Women's State Championship at Brisbane North Hockey Centre (Burringbar Park) and as hosts a requirement was to provide additional umpires and technical officials for this tournament. Thank you to our volunteers for making yourselves available and helping BWHA host a well-organised event.

BWHA continues to support Hockey Queensland and Australia events by providing a large number of officials for their tournaments across the State, Country and Internationally. Our contingent of officials who participate at State and National Championships in an off-field role is growing every year and is a credit to the hard work that we put in at an Association level to develop and foster officials. Congratulations to all of our members who took on leading positions as Tournament Director, Technical Manager, Umpire Coach, Umpire Manager and as appointed Umpires and Technical Official this year. A number of our officials were accredited and upgraded at these events – congratulations on your personal achievements.

The BWHA Development team and U&TC Volunteers provided access to courses throughout the year to assist clubs develop umpires and technical personnel. Clubs are reminded that the BWHA Office and its volunteer committees are here to help and can provide assistance when asked on how to continue to recruit and retain umpires and technical officials. For the 2023 season, clubs should be looking at how they develop and implement an Umpire Development Plan, making this a priority in their off-season.

TURF UMPIRES STEWARD'S REPORT

The 2022 season started with the same notations as 2021, COVID-19 impacting our community sport. The joint Gala Day with BHA was able to go ahead in early March but scaled back due to the requirements of social distancing. While off-field sport was still impacted, BWHA was able to provide our members with high level umpires to start our season and it continued throughout.

With 33 games of senior turf being played every weekend across Saturday and Sunday, 66 umpires were required to complete the weekly PL1-3 and ML1-3 allocations. A number of clubs still do not have the correct number of umpires required as per their Affiliations of the BWHA Operations Manual. It is imperative that clubs support, mentor and upskill their umpires to allow them to continue to affiliate the high level of teams they want each season. While BWHA is blessed with having a number of high level, experienced and dedicated independent umpires to cover a majority of PL1 fixtures, the next generation of umpires need to be worked with at club level and require clubs to put in the hard work as they would with their player development. BWHA provides umpire talks, mentor workshops and have staff and the Umpire & Technical Committee available to provide opportunities to assist your club with recruitment and retention of umpires. Clubs need to value umpires and umpire development more and put practical solutions in place for 2023 and beyond to continue to foster this critical area of our game. Without umpires, we cannot play the game that we all love and enjoy.

It is disappointing when reports of umpire abuse from Coaches, Players and Spectators are received by BWHA, when so many of those people complaining do not themselves umpire or respect that without the 2 officials on the field, we could not play at all. Players expect the highest level of umpiring but forget that they too make mistakes throughout their game and would not appreciate the same level of scrutiny placed upon themselves. BWHA has some of the best umpires in the country in our Association, and while sometimes mistakes are made, it is no excuse for abuse. Thank you to the many clubs who had a real positive attitude towards umpiring this season, this starts with your executive, your coaches and your captains and it was wonderful to see that respect being displayed throughout the season. It really does make a difference and impacts our sport for the better.

I would like to thank the members this season who umpired week in and week out, the umpires who took up the whistle for the first time, and to the clubs who valued umpires and mentored, supported and recruited for their club. Your hard work and dedication to our sport is truly valued and you made this season a success.

This year BWHA were able to upskill a number of umpires into PL1-3 divisions, including Rhiannon Aleksic and Olivia Elphick completing their first PL1 allocations this year. Thank you to our Australian and Level 2 umpires who provided match day support as co-umpires and mentors to the next generation coming through in PL1 and PL2 divisions. BWHA is lucky to have such a wonderful group of top-level umpires who give back and support the next cohort of umpires coming through.

A number of individuals this season also were able to have the experience of being part of the final series in Metro League. These opportunities give these umpires practical skills in dealing

with high pressure situations and will only further assist them on their journey of umpiring. Congratulations to all of our umpires who improved this season.

Aleisha Neumann was selected to represent Australia at International level for both the Women's World Cup and the Commonwealth Games. Thank you, Aleisha, for making yourself available to umpire our weekly PL1 fixtures when you could, your knowledge and skill is appreciated by all in the Brisbane Hockey community. Congratulations to Mel Blanchard who received her Australian badge this year at the National U21s Tournament.

BWHA is again lucky enough to have some of the best umpire coaches and mentors in Australia and Internationally as part of our panel. Thank you to Jan Hadfield AM for her continued support of our PL1 & PL2 umpires and to myself on my first year of allocating the Senior Turf Umpires. Your support and guidance were very much appreciated. To Lyn Hill and Lynn Cowie-McAlister for their behind-the-scenes assistance when needed, to the Level 2 & 3 umpires for making yourself available to umpire and support your younger co-umpires, to Miesh Elmes who took on the challenge of working with our umpires and mentors to coordinate the practical accreditations each week – you did an incredible amount of work and are the reason so many umpires received badges this year. Finally, to all of our wonderful mentors and assessors who took the time to give back to our sport and make a real difference – your work has been spectacular this season and BWHA has been able to upskill a large number of umpires this season thanks to your hard work!

I look forward to the 2023 season and working with our brilliant umpires once again.

GRASS UMPIRES STEWARD'S REPORT

The senior grass competition at Downey Park this year consisted of 36 teams compared to 37 teams in 2022. Each week 32 umpire allocations needed to be filled (4 divisions had byes). Most umpires of senior grass games are senior grass players which makes the juggling of umpire allocations around their games challenging. The group of DP 'regular' umpires ensured games were consistently officiated across the whole season. The downside of using the same umpires each week was the noticeable lack of developing umpires on senior games this year. Senior grass continues to be an overlooked opportunity for developing umpires. An approaching challenge could be to find umpires for senior grass games should the current regulars stop playing and / or umpiring.

This year there were many games in the same division at the same time which created challenges with umpire allocations. There are a couple of regular umpires who do not play but come to Downey Park each week for the opportunity to umpire the senior grass games. Their flexibility to umpire in gaps when playing umpires are not available was an asset.

Many clubs have had the same umpire co-ordinator for several years and as I have been the grass umpire steward for many years, I have built connections with these club personnel and have been able to adjust allocations when challenges arise. I would like to thank the clubs for their flexibility to accommodate changes to allocations, sometimes at the last moment.

I would like to recommend that clubs consider senior grass on Saturday afternoons as an opportunity to develop their umpires. There are many experienced umpires at Downey Park who can support them on games.

TURF

Although COVID-19 was still prevalent in society, fortunately it did not affect the season's fixtures, although some players would have been forced to miss games through isolation requirements. Thank you to those clubs who filled the match books out correctly. It makes the job of staff and volunteer match secretaries easy when players are listed in alphabetical order and in team order. Some teams coped better with the additional column for the players' registered team than others. Many clubs found it a challenge to fill their teams each week, with COVID still a factor. Most of those clubs had overestimated the number of players they had available for the season, but were in a quandary as to whether there were too many players for fewer teams but not quite enough to that extra team. Please consider in 2023 whether the correct number of teams is being entered. One problem encountered is the number of clubs that no longer have JG teams which leads to clubs asking for permission for junior turf players to play outside the rules in lower grass teams, begging the question if too many are playing is this leading to an unfair competition. When asking for permission for players to play in divisions outside the rules please provide as much information as possible in the original request.

MEMBER DEVELOPMENT MANAGER

At the start of 2022 we welcomed back Miesh Elmes to the Development Department, which offered an exciting prospect for the extent of development and representative opportunities that BWHA could offer, particularly with new initiatives that had laid dormant since 2020 whilst we continued to recover from the pandemic.

We were once again happy to provide approximately **1158 members** with **development opportunities** – across multiple roles of hockey including playing, coaching, umpiring and officiating – and approximately **400 members** (again across an array of positions) with **representative honours**.

Our Brisbane team enjoyed the perks of a home tournament and experiencing the 'Hockey One' format with field goal conversions. Due to the nature of the draw format, it was a tight competition that came down to goal differences as to who would proceed to the grand final.

Other opportunities - The opportunity to host the U18 State Championships was a fantastic highlight for our year and could not have been done without staff Kathryn Austen and Carol

Chiu Chong, along with Board Member Bron Morris and their team of volunteers that worked tirelessly for months bringing the event together – our representative players, coaches, managers and umpires could not have had the experience of a home State Championships without you.

We have to acknowledge the volunteer selectors and coaches of each age group and highlight what an incredible job they do, in what are generally thankless and scrutinised positions.

Your efforts are highly valued and we hope to see you nominate again in the future. Another mention to all of the team managers of each representative team – the lengths they go to in ensuring each task is met to a high standard is incredible. We're thankful for your time.

Without volunteers in these positions, our representative teams struggle to operate as smoothly as they do.

BWHA is always seeking nominations from all of its members and willingly give support to anyone who would be interested in filling one of these roles in 2023.

Umpires were exposed to Introduction to Umpiring clinics, Turf & Grass Umpires Talks and the Umpire Mentor Workshop as well as many BWHA mentors out on the grounds. Many clubs took advantage of our services in regards to umpiring development and held Umpiring Development Clinics.

Our representative umpires were also given an opportunity to participate in the first Representative Umpire Workshop run by Sonya Fisher and Naomi Crase from our Umpires & Technical Committee, in an effort to further support and upskill our umpires appointed to attend State Championships.

We're extremely happy to state that **90 Umpires** received new or upgraded accreditations this season, through the diligent work of staff Miesh Elmes, our umpire mentors and club umpire coordinators for putting their umpires through the process.

We successfully ran two **Level 1 Coach** courses (22 total participants) in conjunction with a **Level 2 Coach** course (14 participants), collaborating with Ipswich Hockey, and look forward to working together in the future to provide more courses and opportunities.

We were able to create and provide more development tools for our representative and school coaches, such as tournament preparation guides, skills guidelines and feedback reports.

We again held the **Junior Coach Workshop** and found it has gained traction since its beginning in 2021.

Sadly, the U18 Southern Cross tournament was cancelled due to poor weather.

Apparel

Apparel sales were again strong in 2022 and that led to some shortages of particular sizes for our final group of the year the U15 teams. With lead times changed due to COVID, there isn't as much of an opportunity to replenish stock mid-season as there was pre-2020. Increased stock at the beginning of the year will aim to resolve this problem.

We saw the new Anorak Jacket come into the range this year and it was well received. Sizing from Gray's was problematic and we ended up with very large sizes. Smaller sizes will suit more players going forward.

Uniform fittings are again worthwhile for Junior teams however mixed success for Masters teams. Schedules will be adjusted each year to maximise attendance as needed.

Uniform & Equipment

Uniforms are being replaced as able to each year as they become older or damaged. Skirts seem to be the biggest issue this year with ageing stock and elastic wearing. More blue skirts purchased in the off season were well used by our representative teams allowing all under age teams to travel with a set of blue alternate skirts.

We updated our GK Smocks this year to add a Lime Green Primary smock with our regular orange smocks now our alternate smock. This satisfies HQ requirements for all GK's to have a primary and alternate smock. Many thanks to Just Hockey for assisting with the ordering and supply of these smocks.

Tours

2022 State Championships saw all tournaments held in the South East corner with the exception of Masters who headed to Townsville.

The Masters trip had its challenges with problems with the car hire booked in the weeks preceding the tournament. This was resolved with days to go. Last minute COVID withdrawals caused concern for a number of teams and an umpire however we were able to fill the spots with a last-minute call for assistance. All accommodation provided was a good standard. Teams stayed across 4 venues.

U18 State Championships were held in Brisbane at Brisbane North Hockey Centre. Our teams did miss the opportunity to travel as a group to another centre however did their best to come together as a team each day whilst staying at private accommodation. BWHA as a staff group in addition to Board members worked tirelessly to make this event happen. Thank you also to the players parent group who assisted in keeping the BBQ running each day.

U13's travelled to Ipswich for their State Championships. Staying in one accommodation venue was a huge benefit to teams. Unfortunately, poor weather on the final days led to shortened or missed placing games. Managers and coaches did a fantastic job of navigating the changes and keeping the kids well looked after during this time.

We were delighted to welcome back the U11 Southern Cross and Coulter Shield tournaments to Downey Park having missed the past 2 years due to COVID shutdowns. All teams for the first time played in the full Brisbane playing strip and looked fantastic. Our teams were full of positivity and played very well over the day.

A huge thanks to our coaches, managers, selectors, umpires and technical officials who supported all of our wonderful players on these trips. These trips wouldn't happen without you.

Unfortunately, we are finding costs are rising significantly across accommodation, transport and food suppliers and the cost of tours are rising. We are always looking at ways to lessen the cost of a tour to any group.

FACILITIES & CANTEEN REPORT

The year stared well with a working bee at Rasey Park ahead of the JTAS season which got underway early February. With a stocked canteen operating we were devastated when Rasey Park and Downey Park canteens and associated ground floor areas flooded in February 2022.

Stock and equipment loss across both sites was high. The clean-up for both of these sites along with the first aid shed and Field 10 amenities block took weeks to complete. Downey Park's clean-up has effectively been going on for almost the entire winter season.

The Rasey Park site saw us get back on our feet relatively quickly. Whilst we sold drinks out of an esky for the first few weeks of the regular U7 and U9 season, we eventually were able to get a fridge back on site (which had to be carried through the serving window) and new BBQs in place. The hot box, kettle, cash register all needing to be replaced along with the BBQ, fridge in the store room and BBQ utensils, loud speaker etc.

Downey Park sadly was not able to be repaired as quickly and the decision made to operate a makeshift canteen for the foreseeable future from the smaller upstairs kitchen and bar area. This reduced the number of items the canteen was able to offer.

Traffic to the canteen was reduced as many didn't walk upstairs. With a significantly smaller oil fryer, it was difficult to make a suitable quantity of hot chips each week and this item saw long wait times.

The effect was also felt across canteen staffing levels which were significantly reduced for the season. Our afternoon canteen convenor also took on the role of bar convenor with our thanks.

The U11 Southern Cross saw us have all the required fridges, cookers etc on site, however due to builder constraints we were not able to have the downstairs canteen reopened in time. Another makeshift canteen was made downstairs in the Just Hockey space. A deep fryer was hired and placed outside around the corner near the building's emergency stairs and we used 2 BBQs in the place of our regular cook top. Fridges were stocked just inside the area and a Bain Maree and behind the fridges a giant prep area was made to put burgers together and anything else needed.

A second BBQ area was located adjacent to the Field 10 amenities block to lessen the load.

The canteen staff worked alongside BWHA staff and Board members tirelessly during the day to ensure all visitors to the park could purchase a variety of items.

We endured a number of break in's and attempted break in's at Rasey Park this year. We have worked hard to limit options to damage and break into the facility. Due to its isolated nature though it is a drawcard for this activity.

With building works almost complete at Downey Park we are looking forward to a great 2023.

GROUNDS REPORT

This year our grounds team had to work harder than previous seasons due to the devastating February floods that heavily impacted Downey and Rasey Parks.

The rain bomb that sat over Brisbane saw rainfall across our parks like we had never seen before, therefore resulting in the water not receding quickly and sitting on the fields for days, leaving them soaked with mud, sludge and silt. We could not get a buggy, mower or tractor on them for weeks due to the wetness which created additional mowing to get the fields to a playing condition to start the grass season.

Our brand-new tractor was flooded in the top equipment shed along with all of our other operational equipment required to maintain the facilities. Thank you to our "mud army" who volunteered their time to help clean the maintenance sheds, and to those who lent us equipment to complete basic tasks before we had own working machinery again.

The maintenance of Downey and Rasey Parks that we lease is completed by casual Noala Gordon (about 8 hours a week) and John Robinson (contractor 1 day a week), but they provide much more service than the hours imply. The work they both contributed to have the fields back up and ready for fixtures after the floods this year was truly incredible. While some fields required additional work and repairs during the season, overall, our grounds staff were able to give our members premier playing fields week in and week out. BWHA cannot thank them enough for their dedication and assistance this and every year.

Noala turned 80 this year, with the BWHA staff holding a morning tea for her in November to celebrate her milestone. We are grateful for the work Noala continues to contribute to our Association and look forward to having her return in 2023.

Thank you to Clare Slocomb and Jan Galloway who volunteered their time throughout the season helping John and Noala with the many tasks required to keep our fields in top playing condition.

Our major challenge continues to be keeping football boots off the fields, the soccer clubs don't allow social groups to use their fields, so they move to areas like Downey and Rasey Park where they pay no maintenance costs, use our nets and destroy our playing fields. It is heartbreaking to see.

We held working bees at the start of the season, before the floods, thank you to all clubs who performed their tasks. These tasks are essential to our association. The working bee for the end of the season was postponed due to the ongoing flood repair work at Downey and Rasey Parks.

We thank Brisbane Softball Association for working with us to keep the fields well looked after throughout the whole year and continue to have an excellent working relationship with our co-users of Downey Park.

CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

The Junior Committee supports the provision of hockey for juniors in Brisbane from U7s to Js (U18). We work with the BWHA staff to organise, manage, and support the junior fixture competition including grading. This year the Junior Committee membership was eight members.

2022 was another year disrupted this time with major flooding and the Downey Park and Rasey Park Buildings inundated with flood water in February which delayed the start of the season for weeks! We were unable to hold grading games due to the weather and hoped that our paper gradings were sufficient for us to grade the teams in each division. We were able to complete a full season having some games as double points to allow us to finish the season including finals in the allocated season.

The junior committee took over the junior grass and turf match secretary roles to monitor players in all junior divisions and report any registration lapses to BWHA for communication with clubs. Clubs change junior volunteers quite regularly and this process assists educating clubs to some rules they may not have been aware of before.

2022 Competitions

Junior Turf:

The number of junior turf teams in the JT1 to JT4 divisions was at maximum of 34 teams and 7 teams in 13T1, all played on a Friday night. U13T2 playing on a Saturday morning, this season there was 12 teams competing in this competition.

The junior turf season started as scheduled in early March. 13T1 continued playing on Friday nights and 13T2 on Saturday morning. We were fortunate to have 2 turfs available most Saturday mornings which enabled our 13T2 games to be played on turf with only a few grass games necessitated by some turf fields not being available with date changes after the calendar had been published.

The results in all junior turf divisions showed a spread of abilities. The dilemma of grading divisions so the competition is as evenly matched as possible vs clubs looking to develop players and teams through the challenge of playing higher divisions remains a balancing act for the grading committee and clubs.

Junior Grass:

The number of Junior Grass teams dropped overall in 2022. The Under 11 age group retained 4 divisions consisting of 29 teams in total and 12 teams nominating to play U13A & B divisions on grass. The JG competition increased to 13 teams and were able to have 2 divisions for this age group.

The timeslots were very challenging to organise this year with the aim of trying to maximise the options for teams to have substitute players from teams below available for all clubs. The only option to avoid several clubs having teams play at the same time was to hold the JG1 & JG2 games at 11.00am. Feedback about this choice indicated a flow on to senior grass in the

afternoon not having juniors to draw on and to offer development opportunities in these games. As development is a BWHA focus and this will be noted for extra consideration in 2022.

U7 & U9s:

The U7 and U9 competitions ran smoothly this year. The proactive approach and having 2 co-ordinators who were able to identify issues e.g., missing goalies in U9 or extra boys on the field and inform clubs on the spot to educate club personnel was valuable. The Super Hero Day where players were encouraged to come and play in costume was a great success and will be continued.

U11 Southern Cross:

The U11 Southern Cross went ahead on Sunday 7th August at Downey Park and the Boys Coulter Shield was held over on fields 10,11 & 12. The weather was perfect for the event which was well supported by teams coming from Southeast Queensland! It is a great opportunity for the U11 players to show their skills and also our young umpires either learning and also some receiving their community badges.

Junior Umpires

Clubs umpired their own games again in 2022 except for finals. Umpire development is a club responsibility and BWHA supports this with mentors and workshops.

In the finals, clubs were asked to provide names of junior umpires they thought would be capable of officiating on a junior final – turf or grass. Umpiring finals is a recognition of a job well done throughout the season. The response was better than 2021. The Junior committee would like to work more actively in 2022 to support junior umpires especially at Downey Park where they can be watched, mentored, and encouraged.

On behalf of the 2022 Junior Committee I would like to thank the staff of the BWHA office for their assistance during the season so we could do our job to organise the junior competitions for the season. We would also like to thank all the club/school officials, parents and spectators who supported so many juniors taking part in hockey for the 2022 season.

Notes to and forming part of the Financial Accounts For the year ended 30 September 2022

Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 112: Income Taxes AASB 1031: Materiality

ASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost, less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the management committee to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flow that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The net expected cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories of trading stock held for future use are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Income Tax

Income derived by the Association is exempt from income tax in accordance with section 50-20 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(d) Provisions

Adequate provision is made in the Financial Accounts to cover future liability for-

Note 7: Buildings

During 2020 \$577,000 was provided in the Financials for the construction of a new amenities block on Noble Street of which \$498,000 was provided from a State Government Grant, and \$79,000 spent from BWHA funds. The field 10 building is shown in the Non-Current Assets as a "Constructed Non-Financial Asset" with a corresponding "Constructed Non-Financial Asset" shown in the Capital and Reserves — for the amount of grant funds provided. The Building is on land owned by local authorities, leased to BWHA. The BWHA has no right of recovery of this amount in the event of a termination of the lease. BWHA has a recurring 4 year lease, which will continue for the foreseeable future. BWHA is responsible for the maintenance and care of the building as part of the requirements of the lease.

The historical "Buildings at Cost" at Downey Park and Rasey Park are shown as a Non-Current Asset in the Balance Sheet at a written down value of \$56,474, to reflect the original cost to the Association, and to expend that cost by way of a Depreciation charge annually. As the Buildings are on land owned by local authorities, the BWHA has no right of recovery of this amount in the event of termination of leases. BWHA has a recurring 4 year lease, and see no reason for this to not continue.

All buildings that are reflected in the Depreciation Schedule are currently used for activities conducted by BWHA. The depreciation for buildings is set at rates of 2.5% to 5% per annum depending on the expected replacement time period.

Note 10: Related Party Transactions

Transactions between related parties are on normal commercial terms and conditions unless otherwise stated.

Note 11: Turf Fund

An amount is set aside to put towards the cost of a Turf Facility at Downey Park. During the year to September 2022 an amount of \$100,000 has been added, and the fund balance at September 2022 is \$304,222.

Note 12: Impact of Floods 2022

BWHA was heavily affected by a flood in February/March 2022, the repairs are still underway, to date they have received \$ 218,611.33 insurance for repairs and replacements. The flood was the biggest since 1974 and effected all buildings and equipment at Downey and Rasey Parks. The Insurance will cover most of the work, but where appropriate, changes to make the facility more flood resilient are being undertaken as part of the recovery. The flood impacted the canteen and bar income streams, but reduced expenses for water, electricity and other commodities as repairs reduced the ability to use some areas for extended periods during the year.

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 to the Financial Report which describes the basis of accounting. As a result, the Financial Report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Independence

In conducting the audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

It is our understanding that the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association Inc. intends to electronically present the audited financial report and auditor's report on its internet site.
