STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:-

During the 1962 year it was B.W.H.A.'s honour to hold the Queensland State Championships in our centre. Although the majority of centres attended - we were disappointed that the three large far northern centres - Cairns, Townsville and Mackay - were unable to attend.

The weekend was really a success and this success is a tribute to those who worked so hard for the game. Saturday's play started well with a fine day. Our Patroness and Q.W.H.A. Patroness Lady P.R. Green performed the Opening Ceremony. The 'hostess' Brisbane Club presented each visiting centre with a basket of fruit.

Sunday evening found the Queensland Annual/General Meeting in progress at which all centres presented a report of their Association's activities - after which supper was served.
