SECRETARY'S REPORT

At last year's A.G.M. we welcomed the new officials to our association. Unfortunately not all the positions were filled. Joyce Proctor supplied a lovely supper to all who attended.

The Oceanic Under 21 Junior World Cup Qualifying Tournament was held at QE11 from the 24th to 27th November. Australia lost to New Zealand eliminating them from competing at Ottawa. New Zealand subsequently finished in 9th position.

At the beginning of December the association invited its band of workers to dinner at "Buzzards" Restaurant to thank them for all the time and effort put in during the year. A small list of Christmas cards was sent. Thanks to Logan, Commercial, Redcliffe and Valley for supplying girls to work as usherettes at the Lord Mayors' Charity Committee "Christmas in Storyland".

In January we nominated Faye Wastell, Tracey Belbin and Tammy Cole for Australia Day Awards presented by the Brisbane City Council. Faye and Tracey were both successful. Also Elaine Green was congratulated for being presented with an award.

The all day meeting of the Management Committee was very productive. Arrangements for fixtures at QE11 on alternating Saturday and Sunday's was set down.

Under 18 training started on Field 13 with a good attendance, resulting in a hard task for selectors trying to pick 3 teams from the squad named plus the new players relocating during the off-season.

Affiliations closed in March with 23 clubs and 78 teams which resulted in 9 divisions plus a Veterans division. Nominations were called, for rep teams to attend the State Championships in June. The South East Qld. Championship was cancelled due to little or no interest.

On March the 18th and 19th a working bee was organised to get the park ready for the beginning of the season. It was reasonably well attended.

Council and Management meetings were well under way by now. Many thanks to all delegates who attended.

The first fixture day of the season was thrown into turmoil because of torrential rain. Registrations and nomination forms were severely hindered because of this. Fixtures were cancelled at Downey Park but continued at QE11 despite dreadful conditions.

April saw the first meeting of the Under 18 Committee to organise the Championship. Many thanks to the Grounds Committee and all other helpers who toiled to get ready. Despite rain and fields being flooded in the days prior, the championship were ahead in perfect sunshine.

Into May and the wet weather continued - resulting in games being transferred to Sundays and mid-week at QE11.

BWHA acquired a 6 month lease for Rasey Park for the use of Minkey players. Leads are being followed as to future re-leasing.

The Queen's Birthday week-end saw the staging of the State Titles at Rockhampton. No fixtures were played at Downey Park. Brisbane acquitted itself very well with Brisbane 1 being State Champions, Brisbane 2 finished 3rd and Brisbane 3 finishing 5th. The Veterans won their division. Sue McLatchey was named "Player of the Championship". Congratulations to all players, umpires, coaches and managers named in the Open Squad, Under 21 and Veterans teams.

QWHA appointed Miss Janne Ellis (Life Member of BWHA and Past President BWHA) to the position of Executive Director on the 3rd July. A position in which we know Janne will strive to achieve the best for Womens' Hockey in this state.

In July we finally played the President's Cup games, official guests saw some fine hockey, the 1st division result being decided upon after extra time. The best and fairest player from each division was selected, and these players combined to form the "President's Eleven". Thanks to our sponsor Schweppes for their support of this new concept now to become an annual event.

The association called for nominations for the 1990 Under 18 squad. Due to problems experienced because of split fixtures and a large number of Junior players nominating, the naming of a squad has been delayed until after the first training date on Sunday 4.2.90.

This year we saw 3 school teams from the USA and Canada touring Australia, resulting in our Brisbane Under 17 team playing them on the turf. Thanks to all families who helped with the billets.

On the 19th August the last fixture day at Downey Park, presentation of Minor Premiership trophies was held in the clubhouse. Life Members and donors were invited to present their trophies. Tracey Belbin again won the "Pam Glossop" Trophy for highest representative honours.

The semis and finals were played at both Downey Park and QE11. Grand Finals for divisions 4 - 9 and Veterans were at Downey Park on Saturday 9th September. In conjunction with BHA the divisions 3-1 were played at QE11 on Sunday 10th September commencing at 9.00 a.m. The three finals were good games and the Division 1 final was won by St Andrews and the 'Shirley Higgins Memorial Trophy' was presented by Shirley's daughter Jan Salan. Congratulations to all teams who participated in grand finals.

We ran a Art Union this year with a holiday donated by East-West Airlines as the prize. This was a necessary supplement to our sagging bar takings.

Nominations closed for administrative positions with some positions still needing nominees. Hopefully they will be filled before the 1990 season.

During the season a Talent Camp was held in Townsville, congratulations to C. Bartlett, T. Cole, R. Collins, M. Goodwin, P. Schubert and T. Turpie who were invited to attend. Also a goalkeeping clinic was held in Brisbane with girls invited from all over the state - J. Hall and J. Hogan from Brisbane attended.

The inagural "Ricoh Player of the Year" Award Dinner was held at The Melbourne Hotel. Our new major sponsor Ricoh who has helped elevate Women's Hockey to the statis it deserves was represented by Mr. Arch Fraser. A touch of suspense to the final countdown saw a very deserving Helen Cook from Easts named. Mr. Fraser presented Helen with her prizes and reaffirmed his companys commitment for next year. Hopefully next year will be bigger and better with more help from the electronic media. The printed media's coverage of the night was excellent.

The Under 21 State team attended the Championships in Sydney via bus and train travel. The team played well and finished 2nd after extra time. Congratulations to Kelly Thomas (Ascot) who has been included in the AIS team to tour Europe.

The Veterans Championship which was scheduled to be played in Perth was cancelled at the last moment due to problems with travel arrangements.

Congratulations to Jan Hadfield and Michelle Arnold who were selected to umpire the tests between Australia and New Zealand.

During October QWHA conducted a coaching course at QE11, this was very well attended.

I would like to mention that BWHA was happy to assist players, managers, coaches and umpires who represented our centre.

We sincerely thank all our helpers during the season, be it large or small.

CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

1989 has been a fairly quiet season for the Constitution Committee which has met only as required to provide advice on matters raised and wordings for proposed amendments.

By-Laws 4 and 5, coverings registrations and gradings, continue to provide some concern to both Clubs and Association officials.

Four minor amendments to By-Law 4 were approved at the Annual General Meeting held in October 1988. A major change to By-law 5 that granted, with respect to grading, an additional right to number one teams of clubs with more than three teams was ratified at a Special General Meeting held on 11 July 1989.

Three more proposed amendments, one to By-Law 4 and two to By-Law 5, will be considered at the 1989 Annual General Meeting.

The Committee has been working towards compiling a file of the Constitution and By-Laws on computer disc that would allow an updated copy of the Constitution and By-Laws to be available to Clubs in 1990.

I should like to thank the members of my Committee for their co-operation.

FIXTURE/GRADING COMMITTEE REPORT

The 1989 season commenced with major changes in Club registrations, the downgrading of several number one teams and a resulting cloud of threatened civil action. Despite the early problems, the season has progressed well with final results perhaps vindicating the potentially controversial recommendations made by the Committee.

Initially, 79 teams affiliated, with 23 (almost 30%) of these requesting upgrading. This situation made the grading of teams a difficult proposition particularly when some Clubs provided little information to support their requests. One team withdrew prior to the commencement of fixtures. Byes were necessary in Division 9 and in the Veterans Division.

Midway through the first round, Pine Rivers requested to be downgraded from Division 4. Following considerable consultation this request was granted. South West United number three team agreed to be promoted from Division 5 to fill the vacancy created.

The inclement weather in the early part of the season forced numerous re-schedulings of fixtures including the Presidents' Cup Finals. Mid-week make-up fixtures were held at OEII and Redcliffe for the first time.

The holding of semi-finals and finals series matches at both OEII and Downey Park provided some tight scheduling problems.

I should like to thank the members of my Committee for their efforts in what has been a somewhat difficult season.

UMPIRES STEWARDS REPORT

As in previous years, the 1989 season has posed many problems in the allocation of umpires. With six top division games at GEII on most weekends, our umpiring strength was stretched to the limit. However, with the co-operation of Clubs, most fixtures commenced on time and were well controlled.

Of the 1696 umpires allocated, there were 13 non-arrivals (0.8%) and 23 late fines (1.4%). The high substitution rate of umpires (29%) continues to cause concern. Clubs should be particularly aware of the necessity to minimize substitutions and, if necessary, to substitute umpires of equivalent standard.

The brunt of umpiring responsibilities has again fallen upon the shoulders of badged player-umpires and Club nominees. These people, along with our unfortunately too few non-playing umpires, are to be thanked for their dedication.

My thanks are also given to the Umpires Convenor and the Umpires Board for their co-operation during the season.

GROUNDS COMMITTEE REPORT

1989 has been a very busy year for the Grounds Committee. As well as the normal task of presenting the fields to the best possible standard that finances permit for club use, we were given the additional job of presenting six top class full length fields, preferably on the clubhouse side of the drain, and in sight of the control-box, for the Q.W.H.A. Under 18 State Championships for the May Day long week-end. The weather caused us quite a few problems early in the season, and I would like to thank all members of the Grounds Committee for the way they "kept on keeping on" through a very arduous season.

This year we spent approximately \$16 000 in field improvements and maintenance. The value of the volunteer labour to accomplish this was worth at least double this amount, and I would like to thank not only the Grounds Committee, but the Junior fathers who put themselves on the roster to assist us. These volunteers (or Nixie's Victims as they became known) were a credit to their clubs, and always willing to assist when called upon.

Major works carried out for 1989 included

- 1. Lifting turf, filling, and returfing to lift and level the corner of field 7 and to extend it back towards Bretts, and also to fill in depressions on 7 and 8. (January).
- Levelling and regrassing the western side of field 11.
 Relocating chairs and bins back from field.
- 3. Building of a surface drain on the western side of field 12 to remove surface water.
- 4. Manufacturing of two hose reel trolleys on mobile bases to facilitate the setting out and collection of the sprinkler hoses.
- 5. Purchase of four new nets to enable old ones to be used for modified hockey. Most nets now have timber backboards.
- 6. Planning and marking five minkey and two modified fields at Rasey Park, and maintaining the markings for the season.
- 7. Relocating and marking all Downey Park fields at the start of the season, and maintaining the markings for the season.
- 8. Laying down a "hardstand" area for the nets to be stored in the off season, to hopefully prevent rusting of frames and the damage from tall grass and weeds growing through the nets.
- 9. Extension of the underground irrigation system for another 300 metres, providing another nine sprinkler points, which allows all fields on the clubhouse side of the drain to be watered, as well as part of field 10.
- 10. Tree pruning (with council assistance) to improve the view of the grounds.
- 11. Filling in of depressions on sidelines and circles from repeated marking over the years, during the off season.
- 12. Regular watering, and mowing of fields, particularly circles, in addition to B.C.C. mowing was carried out.

Matters which must be attended to in 1990 include repairs to the old sprinkler system, an investigation into the best way to present field 1 in an A Grade condition, and control of the lucerne clover, bindii, and weeds on the park. A quote for \$1300 to spray the park was obtained towards the end of the season. It was proposed that softball contribute half this amount, and hockey the rest. Softball were unable to provide the necessary funds, and as our budget was exhausted, we could not afford the whole amount. However, this will be budgeted for in 1990, and softball approached for their share once more.

I thank the Management Liaison delegate to Grounds Jenny Tidey, for all her support and hard work, and for the way she and Joyce Proctor organised the many smokos and lunches for the crews. know all our workers appreciated the way we were looked after. thank all the members of the Grounds Committee, Noala Gordon, Doug Broadfoot, Sid Holcroft, Harry Smith, Keith Tidey, Laurie Goldsmith, Murray Brown and Denise Roberts for enormous effort they put into 1989. UMPIRES REPORT

Hockey at all levels and in all aspects of the game, has begun to develop a more "professional" outlook, with those around us expecting a more "perfect" performance from administrators, players, coaches and umpires alike. This is fine, for certainly we all want the highest standard possible in all areas of our sport, but let us be realistic in our expectations, and remember that developing programmes to gain these higher standards takes time, and cannot happen in one season.

I believe that this year many players and coaches had unrealistic expectations of umpires who were trying to cope with the complexities of officiating on higher level games. This, coupled with a sometimes poor attitude exhibited by some top players when it came their turn to umpire, only made for much frustration by all concerned.

Improvement in all spheres of hockey requires co-operation by all concerned, and I trust all clubs will encourage a greater tolerance towards the learning umpire in future seasons.

The general interpretation of rules throughout the 1989 season was quite sound, due in part to the well-attended usual pre-season discussions held in March for players, umpires and coaches. However, it did become necessary in July to hold a similar meeting for all umpires, firstly to clarify two new rule interpretations issued by F.I.H. in an effort to reduce elements of danger creeping into the game, and secondly to discuss the Umpires Board's concern at the negative attitudes of some Div. 1 players towards umpires and umpiring. This meeting was well attended by all clubs, and as a result of some useful discussion, I believe many problems were clarified. Some suggestions were put forward, and these will be taken into consideration by the Umpires' Board in 1990.

A panel of umpires was again organised in an effort to develop and support a broader base of umpires from all top teams, but unfortunately some clubs did not avail themselves of the opportunity afforded them, and generally, though five quite productive meetings were held during the season, often those concerned had difficulty in attending, due largely to the problem of having to play on the turf immediately after. It was most encouraging to see the gradually re-emerging interest of clubs in having Board members visit to conduct umpiring discussions, and I trust that interest will continue to increase next year. Umpires convenors for all clubs were nominated for the first time this season, and were encouraged to help their own umpires when they officiated each Some clubs worked diligently, and others did little to improve their own club's standard. Perhaps the Board can offer more assistance to these convenors in the umpire coaching area earlier in the season in future.

Once again it was encouraging to see so many umpires make themselves available to officiate for Brisbane at the Under 18 Championships in May. I trust that much valuable experience was gained by those who attended. Thanks also to the umpires who accompanied teams to the Senior Championships in June in

Rockhampton, and those younger aspiring umpires who travelled to Tweed for the Under 13's and mt. Isa for the Under 15's.

The Queensland Umpires' Examination was held again in late July and a total of 139 candidates sat. However, this year the pass level was raised to 60, and further restrictions were placed on gaining a B level pass, with the result that the number of successful candidates was drastic ally reduced. Only 25 candidates passed, and of these 5 gained A passes, 6 gained B passes, and there were 14 C grade passes. Congratulations to those concerned, whose results appear following this report.

Practical testing and coaching proved difficult once again this season, with all 5 members of the Board having so many commitments in the coaching and playing spheres as well as in umpiring themselves at various levels. However it was found to be more convenient generally for two members to operate at the turf and three at Downey Park each playing day. Though we still need to have the opportunity to observe and coach each umpire more frequently, we felt that we were able to accomplish more with our top umpires this season than in previous years.

This year we have tried to spread the umpiring commitments over more players rather than have our top umpires overworked by officiating each week. This has lowered the overall standard momentarily, but we feel in the seasons to come, as umpires gain confidence, the standard will eventually rise, and more clubs will share the load of providing umpires on Division 1 and 2 matches. Sincere congratulations to all who gained practical badging, and a list may be seen following this report. Special commendation goes to Kym Thomasson and Cheryl Kann, who were successful in being awarded their State A badges, while Kathy Duggan gained her State B. On behalf of the Umpires' Board I wish to thank all umpires for their co-operation and efforts this season, and to urge all those who were not successful to maintain their enthusiasm, in spite of their disappointment.

Brisbane is very fortunate to have in our Association, and on our Umpires' Board, umpires of the calibre of Jan Hadfield, Michele Arnold and Vicky Spice. Vicky has maintained her standard admirably since gaining her Australian badge several years ago, and is a most respected umpire at all levels. Jan and Michelle are to be congratulated yet again this year in being selected as members of the National Panel to umpire at the Senior Championships in Hobart in May, being named No 1 and No 3 respectively in Australia as a result. Both Jan and Michelle were given the honour of each umpiring two test matches between Australia and New Zealand in June, and Jan also was appointed by F.I.H. to officiate at the Champions Trophy held in Frankfurt in September. We are proud of your achievements, ladies! Our special thanks go to Kym Chandler for her efforts during the last two months of the season, and we sincerely congratulate her on gaining her Australian badge at the recent Under 21 Championships in Sydney.

The Umpires are grateful for the support always given to us by B.W.H.A. and we will all wear with pride our new set of shirts recently arrived at the end of this season.

My sincere thanks to all members of my hard working Umpires' Board for their work throughout the season, with appreciation to both Jan Elliott and Mary Hughes for their efforts with the less experienced umpires. A special thanks to Lyn Thomas, who always carries out her unenviable task so admirably, and supports me so well. Thank you all once again, and good umpiring in 1990.

JUNIOR SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Our success at Southern Cross this year, reflects how well the selectors carried out their responsibilities. Thank you all.

JUNIOR SUB-ASSOCIATION TREASURER'S REPORT

Our Junior Management Committee met in November 1988 to draw up a budget for the 1989 season. We have had a very successful year finishing nearly \$200.00 above our budgeted credit balance.

The B.W.H.A. Subsidy of \$5,000.00 was used solely for subsiding our Representative Players and Officials. We subsidised them for a total of \$5,802.99. Our thanks goes to the B.W.H.A. Committee and hopefully they will consider an increase next year. There is a need for Minkey and Hockey Development in the schools but we don't have the resources to raise the funds for such a programme.

The opening of the Equipment Shop this year proved to be a huge success both financially and as a service to our players. It certainly has proved the need was there. The shop raised \$3,682.68 which eliminated many raffles and lamington drives. We must thank Dell Carbis and Jennifer Evans for their fine effort.

A World's Finest Chocolate Drive was conducted to help the Representative girls raise money for their tours. The money raised by each girl came off her own fare and some girls raised nearly their whole fare. A total of \$2.711.70 was raised.

The Talent Camp for Ul5 and Ul3 Representative Players was held at QEII from 21st to 23rd March. Our subsidy entitled from the Department of Education Sport Division was \$439.00 which is almost a quarter of the total cost of \$1,802.00 for the Camp.

Umpiring fines reached an all time high of \$810.00. Our aim for next season is to think of a way to reduce these fines.

As an incentive to our Junior Umpires we presented the girls who passed and became Badged Umpires this year with an Official Umpire's shirt and socks. We outlayed \$251.30 and we hope it will encourage more girls to sit for their Umpire's Badge.

Raffles have raised \$794.96.

All stocks of Representative gear were sold and therefore has given funds towards replacements. This year we have been able to put \$7,000.00 aside for replacement of Representative gear and Uniforms. Our main sources of revenue being the Equipment Shop, Raffles, Fines and selling off of all stocks of Representative gear.

I'd like to thank all members of Management and Council for their help and co-operation in my first year as Treasurer.

TREASURERS REPORT

From the finance committee meeting in November registration fees for 1989 had to be increased by 5% to cover increases by Q.W.H.A.

Associations are now being charged per capita and this is not able to be absorbed totally by the present fees.

This year the Under 18 State titles were held in brisbane which meant our field maintenance and repairs budget had to be increased substantially. Overall \$16,000.00 was spent on the fields. Two sets of new nets were purchased in this figure.

The canteen once again was our main source of income netting a profit of \$10,827.91. Kath and Dave are to be commended for the job very well done.

Bar sales remained steady even with the drain of both players and supporters to Q.E. 11. Rental was slightly down this year and this Noff seasonN could do with more bookings.

Telephone costs increased with the instillation of a phone at Rasey Park for the minkey and Modified fixtures.

Sponsorship of \$4,000.00 was given by Fosters and Ricoh sponsored us with a Photocopier valued at \$4,000.00

Our representative teams were insured for the first time this year Fortunately claims were minimual.

Break-in were a problem early in the season. Security bar were fitted to the downstairs change rooms at a cost of \$1290.00, which we had not put into our original budget. New locks also had to be fitted costing \$226.40.

The sewerage system decided to pose problems as well this season. Repairs costing a total of \$1598.00 were required.

Store rooms were constructed to make room for more office space down stairs. We were fortunate the weather was wet early and the builder could finish the job with very little bother to users of the space.

Assistance was given to our rep players again this year as well as Coaches & Managers totalling \$1,330.00. A subsidy of \$5,000.00 was given to the Junior Sub Association.

As you can see by the following statement our expenditure is catching up to our Income very fast. The next few years will be a very testing time for amateur sport and will require a dedicated team to manage the financial affairs of any sport withso many involved in actually playing the game.

I would like to thank all those who have given me assistance over this year and especially Jack Manders who I am sure has aged at least ten years since I took over as treasurer.
