CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

1992 has proven to be a very quiet year for the Constitution Committee. With a brief to convene only as required, to provide advice on matters raised or recommend wordings for proposed amendments, the Committee has not been called upon to meet during the season.

The Presidents Cup Finals for Division 1 and 2 were conducted under a different situation this year. Advice was given by the Convenor that no amendments to the By-Laws were necessary.

A small number of proposed amendments to the By-Laws were passed at the 1991 Annual General Meeting with a subsequent amendment at a Special Meeting, at the beginning of the 1992 Season, to correct an administration error in the original wording of one amendment presented to the Annual Meeting.

The results of these proposed amendments were as follows:

- . An extension to the requirements for players to sit for the umpires exam (By-Law 11)
- . A tightening of player qualification rules for cup finals $(By-Law\ 9(a))$
- . A tightening of player qualification rules for semi-finals and finals $(By-Law\ 8(a))$

From the lack of activity, it can be assumed that clubs are satisfied with the current Constitution and By-Law Documents.

Continuous watering of fields during the season in order to maintain a good grass coverage.

All nets were removed from playing fields and have been stored at both Downey and Rasey Parks.

As you can see from the above, the Grounds Committee (few) has had a busy year maintaining both parks.

As this will be my last year as Convenor, I would like to thank my committee. A special thank you to Robin Sneddon and John Bigg for the many hours spent on upkeep of grounds and equipment and the many associated chores. Also my thanks to Noala Gordon for the mowing of fields when required. To Mary Cockings a very special thankyou for her management liaison and assistance during the season. I would also like to thank the Queensland Womens Amateur Sports Council for their co-operation, BWHA and BJWHA Presidents and their management committees.

UMPIRE'S REPORT

Before I outline the details of the activities of the Umpires Board for 1992, I wish to pay tribute to Heather Scraggs who stood down from the position as Umpires Convenor after more than 20 years in the job. The work that Heather did for Umpires in Brisbane over these years is incalculable, and always done with a smile and that little giggle of hers. Several generations of umpires, including myself, owe much to Heather who was always available to offer advice and encouragement, and the number of Australian Badged Umpires that Brisbane boasts is testimony to her hard work.

With retirement from her employment Heather plans to "trip" here and there at her leisure, and we wish her enjoyment in this new phase of her life - she's earned it! We are, however, grateful that she remains on the Board, and her assistance and support to me this year has been greatly appreciated. I deem it an honour to be known as her friend. Thank you, Heather from a lifetime of Umpires, and congratulations on a job VERY WELL DONE!

Heather's past workload has been shared this year with each member of the Board having a 'portfolio' :- Jan Hadfield conducted the Pre-season and Mid-season Umpires Talks, Michele Arnold and Vicki Spice were in charge of organising the Umpires Exam, Lyn Thomas as Umpires Steward appointed the umpires each week, Sue Weimers organised the purchase of new Umpires Shirts and Cheryl Kann attended BWHA Council and Management Meetings as the Board Representative. Because of the three venues now used for matches, testing of Umpires was necessarily split between Board Members - Jan Hadfield, Michele Arnold and Sue Weimers tested at the Turf Venues at QE II and Redcliffe, and Lyn Thomas, Heather Scraggs and Cheryl Kann tested at Downey park while Vicki Spice was able to test Umpires at both venues.

This year Clubs were asked to submit names of Umpires who wished to be tested and this proved successful, with the Board Members able to target these Umpires from early in the season. All of these Umpires were looked at, at least once during the first round, albeit with some difficulty because quite often listed Umpires had been substituted.

In March, QWHA conducted a Junior Umpire Coaching Accreditation Course on behalf of BWHA. Sixteen people attended from Brisbane and all passed the Course (they are listed later in Records), and their brief now is to coach Junior and/or Beginner Umpires in their Clubs. Candidates were interviewed later by Heather Scraggs and Michele Arnold on their progress with some innovative ideas forthcoming eg: an Umpiring Trivial Pursuit Game.

Umpires Talks were held regularly again this year. The annual pre-season Umpires Discussion was conducted by Jan Hadfield and Michele Arnold, and they also held a mid-season talk with Umpires who control Division 1 - 3 matches with the latter talk in particular drawing positive and favourable responses from participants. Traditional monthly discussions were held as usual, with a change in that topics for the talks were announced at the beginning of the season, and the Board Members took turns to present the discussions. The idea, drew a favourable response, although attendances are still disappointing.

A new BWHA By-law meant that this year all players from Divisions 1 - 4 and Representative Players from Under 18 to Veterans who had not already passed the Umpires Exam were compelled to do so. This meant of course an increase in the number of candidates this year to about 200. Hopefully, the experience of learning the rules and doing the exam will translate both to better umpiring of games and attitudes of players to umpires on the field.

The Board conducted a concerted campaign during the season to have umpires wear white - the aim being to "look the part" and to raise the profile of umpires on the field. The campaign did work for a short time but standards subsequently deteriorated again after a few weeks.

State A and B Umpires who control games on turf from next year will wear pink shirts which were worn for the first time during Finals this year. The white BWHA Umpiring Shirts will now be presented to Umpires who have State C and Senior Badges. State A Umpires who officiated at the Open State Championships were presented with a Jade Green Shirt. These innovations are an important recognition for Umpires.

The Board was greatly heartened by the number of Umpires who applied to travel to the various State Championships this year eg: 9 to Cairns for the Under 18 and 7 to the State Open Championships in Maryborough. The Under 13 State Championships held at Downey Park also gave more opportunities for our younger umpires to gain experience. The Board is also very grateful to Bernadette Gotting of Ipswich who umpired Club Fixtures on a regular basis at QEII this season.

Special congratulations to Jan Hadfield who regained her ranking of No.1 in Australia at the Australian Championships but this was not enough for her to be invited to umpire at the Olympic Games, which was a great personal disappointment. Kim Thomasson attended the Australian Under 21 Championships in Hobart for testing for an Australian Badge but unfortunately was not successful. We hope that she will try again! Brisbane has 3 of the top 5 State A ranked Umpires in Queensland - No.1 Kim Thomasson, No.2 Julie Ashton-Lucy and No.4 Sue Weimers. This means that Julie will travel to Perth to the Australian Under 18 Championships for assessment for her Australian Badge. Michele Arnold also umpired at the Australian Championships in Melbourne as part of Oueensland's 3 representatives - a great effort!

Special congratulations also to Kerry Chatfield who was awarded her State A Badge in Maryborough at the State Championships and becomes one of the youngest in Queensland's history to be awarded this honour. Congratulations to Sue Williams who was awarded a State B Badge, and to Janet Hill, Robyn Leece, Lindy Spice, Brenda Wilson and Melinda Richards who all were awarded State C Badges this year. A fantastic achievement for Brisbane and one that should be built on in the seasons to come.

A new innovation this season has been the "Rule of the Week" where a Rule or part thereof was highlighted and announced over the PA at Downey Park before each match.

Umpiring will form an important part of the BWHA Development Plan and Heather Scraggs is to be thanked for doing the bulk of the work in this area which will complement her work in this area for Oueensland.

This season as the nominal 'Umpires Convenor' has been a great learning experience for me and I thank each member of the Board for their hard work and input this season, with particular thanks to Lyn Thomas who did the bulk of testing at Downey park when I and other Board Members were otherwise engaged. Lyn has given me great assistance and support and I thank you most sincerely, Lyn.

The future of Umpiring in Brisbane looks very bright with several very promising umpires coming through and it is up to all the association to nurture and encourage these talents to their fullest potential so they are not lost because their is a career pathway in Umpiring which can also lead to Olympic and World Cup Representation as much as playing the game does.

FIXTURE/GRADING COMMITTEE REPORT

The 1992 season saw a total of 83 teams affiliated for Senior Fixtures. These included one team from the newly-affiliated Club, St. Peters.

JUNIOR SECRETARY'S REPORT

It is with much pleasure that I present for your interest, my report on the activities of the Junior Sub-Association for the 1992 season. I am very happy to report that 1992 was again a very successful year for the Juniors. Our numbers increased to a record 77 Junior teams plus 14 Minkey and 20 Modified teams. We were delighted with the popularity of junior girls hockey even though it gave the Fixture and Grading Committee a few headaches, trying to find room for 77 teams at Downey Park. It was decided that there would be three timeslots at QE II, this helped a little, except for the couple of Saturdays that QE II was unavailable and then it was "back to the drawing board". The problem was overcome by changing a couple of timeslots and re-allocating fields. I would like to thank all the clubs for their co-operation and patience on these days.

The number of clubs affiliated this year was 16, same as last year, although we lost St Rita's and gained Brisbane Girls Grammar School. There were 11 age divisions, U17A, U17B, U15A, U15B, U15C, U13A, U13B, U13C, U11A, U11B and U11C. The U11 age group played a full round of grading games before being graded into their respective grades.

During the season there were 9 Management Meetings, 5 Special Management Meetings and 8 Junior Council Meetings.

The first Management meeting for the year was held on Saturday 18th January, where the seasons activities were mapped out and the calendar set for the year. We welcomed Judy Trewin to Management and Penny Clarke rejoined the ranks as Tours Secretary. There were no other new faces on the committee, just a couple of changes in positions, Carol Richards moved to Minute secretary and Dawn Winter to Records Secretary.

We were fortunate to have all positions filled on the Umpires Panel this year and what a highly qualified panel they were. Kym Thomasson, the convenor State A Badge, Sue Weimers, State A, Kerry Chatfield, State A, Janet Hill, State C and Jan Chapman with a New Zealand Umpires Badge. The panel worked very hard all season and we thank them all for a job very well done.

We decided to have a coaching clinic for players whom the Brisbane selectors thought would benefit from the specialised coaching. The names of these players was announced on Grand Final Day last year. Most of the players took advantage of the coaching clinic and the opportunity to improve their skills. The clinic was held at Downey Park from 22nd - 24th April, 1992.

Selection trials for the Brisbane Representative players was held on Sunday 26th April when a squad of 42 U15's and 39 U13's were chosen to attend a Brisbane Training Camp from Sunday 3rd May to Tuesday 5th May. From these squads the teams for the first Southern Cross were selected.

1st Southern Cross was to have been held at Sunshine Coast on May 10th but due to very heavy rain in the Buderim area, the games were postponed and were to have been held at Ipswich on May 24th. Again the rain intervened and Ipswich fields were not able to be used, so it was Brisbane who came to the rescue and held Southern Cross at Downey Park. Our teams performed well and overall, Brisbane was well ahead on points at the end of the day.

2nd round was held at Buderim on May 31st but once again the rain intervened and by lunchtime it was evident that the fields were becoming too dangerous to continue playing and the delegates from each centre had a meeting and decided that in the circumstances, it would be best to cancel all other games.

Brisbane was still well ahead in U15A, U15B & U13B divisions and won these three cups, also taking out the Southern Cross Cup for the centre with the highest number of aggregate points. Congratulations to all the teams, coaches and especially the manageresses who had to contend with the muddy uniforms!

The U13 State Championships were held in Brisbane from 21st June to 25th June. Our most sincere congratulations to Ronda Nix, the Tournament Director, and the U13 Committee on yet again, another very successful Championship. HOCKEY PRO-SHOP REPORT

We will start this report by borrowing the 1991 Convenor - Di Potter's opening line - "Little did I (we) realise the task that lay ahead of me (us) when I (we) offered to supervise the "Hockey Shop"!"

The format for the Hockey Shop for 1992 was again greatly changed with the shop area being extended and made self-service. Paper work at point-of-sale caused more headaches than one could have imagined (the paper work laid down by "Just Hockey" being changed twice in the first two weeks of the Season.)

What a start to the season ! Plans had been made to open the "Pro Shop" pre-season. It was anticipated that the shop would be opened on Thursday 20.2.92 but due to lack of supply of stock from Just Hockey this was an impossibility. The elements then took a hand. We were flooded out twice and had to clean up each time and start again. The shop finally opened pre-season on Thursday 12.3.92 between the hours of 4-6pm, but with very limited support. More publicity to all Clubs is imperative, possibly with BWHA advising Clubs in January correspondence. This could be followed up with leaflets handed out personally at club training sessions (including Mens).

Once again the Shop was predominantly stocked by Just Hockey with the Junior Association controlling it. At times problems arose with delays in stock of equipment from our main suppliers and this is an area which MUST be improved on. BWHA Juniors made it possible for us to procure supplementary items for sale.

During the season we traded on 24 Saturdays, as well as 8 Sundays which included fixtures, grading games, Representative team selection trials, Southern Cross Carnivals and five days during the State Under 13 Championship. At times it was necessary to restrict entry to the shop until some customers departed as it was impossible to move inside. But on the positive side, the amount of money banked from these 'special occasions' was nothing short of amazing. We must' congratulate the players from the Junior Association for their strong patronage to the shop. It is hoped that the Senior players will show greater interest in future seasons, knowing what is available from the shop.

We also had the unfortunate experience of two attempted breakins plus one breaking, entering and stealing from the shop (the latter occurring during the night prior to opening day of the State Under 13 Championships). However, with the assistance of our Junior Committee and the Grounds Committee we were back in operation with a minimum amount of fuss.

There are people we wish to sincerely thank for their help and support. The advice and assistance to customers from our resident "Goalie" expert was invaluable in this very specialised area of the shop. To Robyn Sneddon who once again contributed her "stick expertise"; to the various members of the Grounds Committee, in particular Ross Mitchell and John Bigg for their expert 'maintenance and repair' work; to all Clubs who provided helpers each week; to the St Andrews (Junior) Mums who once again assisted re-stocking the shop; to the Committee of the Junior Association and in particular the Treasurer, Maureen Fleming who patiently handled the money matters; to Kathy Duggan from 'the Office' for her assistance; and to our very understanding ?? families.

In conclusion, the Hockey Shop provided us with fun and laughter, heartache and tears, a lot of endless hours of hard work both inside and outside of trading hours, but it was all worthwhile when we see the amount of money the Junior Association has received from this business venture. We wish to congratulate all hockey players and their families for their tremendous support. Commission paid by Just Hockey to the BWHA Junior Association has reduced their financial burdens, enabling them to fulfil many hockey projects which will benefit ALL players.
