PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year marked a major milestone for the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association—we turned sixty! Should anyone think that this qualifies us for retirement and the pension, they have only to read this report to see that we have only just begun. The energy and commitment of the multitude of people who make up the administration of this association, both junior and senior, is demonstrated in these pages for all to see, and I congratulate them all sincerely for their dedication and enthusiasm, and thank them on behalf of all the girls and women who play hockey with our association.

This year we worked to a Five Year Development Plan, and I am pleased to say that we achieved or exceeded the majority of goals we set ourselves for 1993. This year we extended our office hours, so that we are now open every day of the week, acquired a fax machine (how did we ever do without it!), totally refurbished the canteen and upstairs kitchen and obtained a cafe and takeaway licence, provided first aid to all our venues, engaged a qualified physiotherapist for all our Under 18 and Senior Brisbane teams, employed Sue McLatchey as Regional Coaching Director, really got the CAPS scheme up and running, set up a Coaching Committee, acquired the Lease on Rasey Park, set up the Brisbane Development Fund Appeal to allow tax deductible donations to our association for a turf, (and for future facilities up to the year 2000), and applied to become a Licenced Club. Our development plan will be updated every year to keep abreast of our growth and the needs of our players.

The rapid expansion of our association has caused major problems in the umpiring area, through our inability to recruit, train, and retain, the required number of senior umpires. Unless this vital area keeps pace with our future growth, our development will be severely hampered. It is not coincidental that these problems have surfaced when Umpire Development is the one section missing from our Development Plan. However, with the new Umpires Board very aware of the problems we face, I am sure this section of our Plan will soon be addressed, and BWHA's high umpiring standards will be restored.

This year we have retained our major sponsors, Inchcape Office Products (Ricoh), Cadbury-Schweppes, and Leo Muller Toyota, and we thank them for their involvement, and look forward to a continuing mutually rewarding association in the future. My thanks to Meg Brodie for her work with our sponsors, and to our Publicity Officer Donna Thorne, who was an invaluable help with the BWHA Awards Dinner and Ricoh Medal Presentation.

1993 has been a very rewarding but challenging year for me, and I thank all those people who have helped me in my first year in the chair, particularly our Administrative Assistant, Kathy Duggan, who has been unfailingly polite and cooperative no matter how difficult the task, my Executive Committee Jenny Heron and June Ballantyne, my Management Committee, and all the other officials and hardworking committee members who have given their time to BWHA so generously this year.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Downey Park clubhouse was once again the venue for our Annual General Meeting, held on Tuesday 27th October at 7.30 p.m. Life members were once again present and welcomed our 1992 Life Member Joyce Mecklem to their ranks. BWHA has now embarked on a new system of thanking members who have given of their time for our association - Long Service Awards were given to Jan Hadfield, Joyce Proctor for 10 years and Denise Bryne, Denise Roberts for 15 years service. Mrs Sallyanne Atkinson, A.O., was once again named as Patron for 1993.

Ros Julien, as outgoing President, was thanked by Ronda Nix for her time and work during the part year. Mrs Nix then took the chair as incoming President and opened the Council Meeting to announce all the positions and congratulate the new management and fellow members of all committees. Clubs were asked to seek nominations for any vacant positions and to forward to the BWHA office before the January meeting. After the meeting was closed, everyone enjoyed a lovely supper supplied by Joyce Proctor and looked forward to a relaxing off-season.

The association adopted a 5 Year Development Plan to help with the planned growth of hockey in Brisbane.

The new members voted onto Management were asked to their first meeting in November to contemplate the clubhouse refurbishment and look into the extent and length of time it would take to complete the work. The refurbishment was completed in the "off-season". On behalf of the BWHA Management I would like to thank Mr Keith Nix as Honorary Engineer for overseeing the refurbishment which consumed many hours.

QWASC asked once again for help at the Lord Mayor's "Christmas in Storyland" pantomime held at City Hall. Hockey was well represented by players from University, Combines, Mt Gravatt Eagles and Brisbane Girls Grammar School and we thank these girls for giving their time.

BWHA Management invited all the association workers to an informal 'roast' dinner and drinks at the clubhouse to express appreciation for efforts for BWHA.

Australia Day, January 26, was the first Management Meeting to draft the calendar for 1993 followed by Sunday 31st to sift through all the correspondence from the off-season.

This year Ronda Nix (President) and myself visited all Division 1 and 2 clubs to discuss how the association could deal with the 'elite' players and to make the girls who play at QE11 feel part of BWHA. These open discussion evenings were well received and the girls asked many questions. Some issues were - Dual Registrations, Fees, Change of fixtures when representative players are absent, neutral umpires for semis and finals, and the cost/format of the Ricoh Dinner. Hopefully all their concerns have been addressed, and there is a better understanding between the players and the BWHA Management.

The February Council Meeting was well attended. All clubs were issued with an Administration Folder containing forms required for the year. Nominations were opened for Open and Veterans players, coaches, managers and umpires and also umpires for the State Under 18 Championship. Trials at QE11 and Redcliffe were well underway for the selection of the Under 18 teams. Affiliation forms for Division 1 and 2 were due in by the February Management meeting.

March started with an Umpires meeting for Division 1 & 2 and badged umpires, to try to solve a few of the problems experienced in past seasons, and the directions for the new rules to be implemented this season. The meeting for Division 3-10 and Veterans umpires was held on March 23. The attendance at both nights was not as high as would be expected, and will be looked into later in the season. Division 1 and 2 registration forms, and affiliation forms for Division 3-10 and Veterans, were due in at the council meeting. This year the Division 1 and 2 season commenced on the 12th March at Redcliffe and continued Saturdays at QE11 and alternate Friday nights at QE11 and Redcliffe until the finals. The Division 1 and 2 season started early because of a decision taken in 1992 not to play Division 1 and 2 fixtures when the Under 18 Championship were played on the May Day week-end.

The Under 18 Southern Cross Championship was held at Gympie on 21.3.93 and QE11 on 28.3.93 with 4 centres participating. Brisbane won the Under 18 Southern Cross Championship.

Grading games were held at Downey Park for Divisions 3 to 10 to coincide with the annual working bee on the week-end 27/28 March to try and get the fields ready before the season commenced.

Twenty-three clubs affiliated with BWHA for the 1993 season. After a team withdrew and a couple of extra teams joining, the association finished with 87 teams. The fixture books were printed and given out to clubs early in the season.

Saturday 3rd April was the first fixture at Downey Park and being the Diamond Jubilee of BWHA a special luncheon was organised for officials, life members and invited guests. Beautiful weather prevailed and the 1993 season started. At the conclusion of fixtures a Karaoke evening was held as part of the Opening Day celebrations.

The Australian Under 21 Championships were held in Adelaide the week of 13 to 24 April and Queensland came first. Congratulations to Lesley Schoenwald (Coach), Eileen Thumpkin (Manager) and all the Brisbane players who participated.

Fixtures for Division 1 and 2 were not held on the 1st May due to the State Under 18 Championships at Gympie. Queensland asked Brisbane to nominate a fourth team to fill the gap in third division. The Brisbane teams came:

Christine Sheppard was named player of the Championship. An Under 18 Development Squad was chosen and Loren Chatfield, Kellie Irwin, Bridie Potter, Marie Ries were selected with Kim Thomasson as coach and June Ballantyne, manager.

Open and Veterans teams were named on Tuesday 27th April and once again Brisbane were asked if a fourth open team could go to Toowoomba. All teams started training in earnest for the June long week-end.

President's Cup for Division 1 and 2 was held at QE11 on Monday 17th May. The Division 3-10 and Veterans were played at Downey Park on Sunday 30th May. Mr Peter Watterson from Cadbury Schweppes, our sponsor for the President's Cup attended afternoon tea, watched a couple of games, and then presented the President's Eleven, made up of the Best & Fairest players in each division, with a T-shirt, cap and soft drinks donated by Schweppes. The winning clubs were presented with their trophies by those Past Presidents who could be with us on the day, or their representatives.

BWHA reluctantly accepted the resignation of Alison Minson from Management in June. Alison and her husband Dennis decided to holiday in England for 6 months, and BWHA wished them all the best. Meg Brodie was nominated and duly elected as the new management member at the July council meeting. Congratulations Meg.

June 12-14 was the Open and Veterans State Championship in Toowoomba. The setting was very professional but the weather was freezing, the wind straight off ice, but this did not deter our players.

VALE - VICKY SPICE 11.3.93

Vicky played hockey for her club Valley from age 11 in 1964 to 1992. She represented Brisbane at schoolgirl level and State Championships as Goalkeeper. Vicky also played Indoor Hockey until March 1993.

Vicky was constantly on Valley Womens Executive for over 20 years as Secretary/Minute Secretary/Social Committee/Umpires Convenor. Vicky also organised the Valley Indoor Hockey Club for 10 years and coached Valley Juniors for a number of years. Vicky became a life member of Valley Womens Hockey Club in 1991.

Vicky was a member of the BWHA Umpires Board from 1982 to 1993.

Vicky introduced a Junior Umpires Panel and was Convenor for 3 years from 1986 to 1988. This was where Vicky gained the most satisfaction - from helping young umpires. That Umpires Panel has grown to-day with up to 50 girls being coached and tested for umpiring each year.

She was also a Brisbane Under 11 Manager in 1986 and 1987.

Vicky was a member of the BWHA Judiciary from 1982 to 1993. She had a fair, reasonable and honest approach on this committee.

Vicky received her Umpires Badges as follows:-State C 1972; State B 1975; State A 1977; Aust A 1983; Aust Indoor 1988.

Vicky was the only woman to hold Australian badges in both indoor and field hockey.

VALE - ELAINE GREEN - 6.9.93

"Greenie" had been involved in hockey since moving to Brisbane in the 1960's, she joined Taxation Hockey Club where she played goalkeeper and coached lower grade teams. She was Vice-President of the club and was given a life membership in 1980.

Over a period spanning more than twenty-five years, "Greenie" made many contributions to the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association. She held the position of Canteen Steward and Match Secretary for more than a decade and was First Aid Officer for fifteen years from 1978 to 1992.

The flying figure on the motor bike, loaded up with her esky of ice and her first aid kit, had only one concern, the excellence of care for her beloved hockey girls.

CLUBHOUSE REPORT

During the past year the clubhouse has had a major upgrade of the kitchen and canteen to Brisbane City Council health regulations. Upstairs, an industrial dishwasher and gas oven were installed as well as stainless steel wall covering, benches and double sinks to BCC standards. Downstairs the ceiling was covered, as well as new cupboards, benches and floor covering. A bain-marie was also purchased for both the kitchen and canteen.

If you have any ideas of how we can attract the hockey players back to the clubhouse - we would love to hear from you. To the "Commodore Girls" - thanks!! Your support, friendship and happy dispositions are simply great - our clubhouse is for all players but you are our best customers.

CANTEEN STEWARDS REPORT

The installation of the bain-marie set-up this year made a beneficial difference to the productivity of the canteen. The workers in the back were able to concentrate on food production while those in the front only served food and handled money. the flow of people and money was more streamlined and less congested.

New larger, better cookers increased the total amount cooked. With chips, for example, whereas last year customers may have had to wait and hence have been deterred, this year all demand was met and more people bought.

The total sales as at 31 August was \$61,490. The total purchases to this date were \$43,126. Thus the progressive profit margin was \$18,364. This however has not had hidden costs such as electricity, gas, maintenance. insurance and cleaning taken from it. The figure compares favourably with the budget estimate of \$12,000 for the whole year.

I would like to commend the workers on their great job. All worked hard and well during the busy times. There was always plenty of tasty food available and the counter girls could serve customers quite quickly by the end of the season. My thanks to them all. In particular I would like to thank Kathy Kenealy for all her behind the scenes work.

GROUNDS COMMITTEE REPORT

The 1993 season was one of the worst on record as far as grounds were concerned.

Abnormally dry conditions and the state of the fields when we started our season added to our problems.

We re-turfed and top dressed the fields prior to starting day but we could only get so much water on the fields to enable us to reap the benefits of all the hard work.

The fields are overused and we do not have the same luxury as Netball that finish in September and their fields have six months to recover.

I feel very strongly that the situation has arrived that both sports (Softball and Hockey) have to look at "resting" two fields per season to enable extensive repair work to be done. We have to look to the future and if we continue to abuse our fields like we are doing we will be in real trouble.

We will be working with Softball during our "off" season to do maintenance work on the fields.

All our nets were spray painted at the start of the season and have held up well. They will be done again in December. The nets are not too bad at Downey Park. We are hoping to get four new nets by next season to enable us to bring the Rasey Park nets up to standard.

Initial layout and continuous line marking of thirteen (13) hockey fields at Downey Park and four (4) Modified and three (3) Minkey fields at Rasey Park. We now have two linemarking machines.

Mowing of the park has now improved with the contractor using a gang mower.

The ball trap was repaired at the beginning of the season. The Morrison mower was also repaired and is now working OK. We purchased a new second hand mower this season.

We also had the assistance of Community Service workers throughout the season which helped us enormously. They will be working on the park throughout the off season.

Q.W.A.S.C. painted and reroofed all sheds on the park. They look beaut.

We have quite a good relationship with the Brisbane City Council Parks Department, and Mrs McDougall from Queensland Womens' Amateur Sports Council is always there to help us, and we thank her sincerely.

I strongly recommend that we should employ a full time grounds person to look after the fields, to enable watering of the fields mid week, as the putting out, watering, and putting away of the sprinkler system is a full days work. Also I strongly recommend another mobile sprinkler for next season.

Sincere thanks to the Grounds Committee and to Ross Mitchell and John Bigg for their advice and assistance. We urgently need more personnel on this committee.

In closing I would like to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. See you all in 1994.

TOURS SECRETARY REPORT

This year for the first time, the travel arrangements and accommodation for our Senior representative teams was done through the BWHA office. Although in theory this appeared to be a sensible idea - in practical terms it was not complimentary to the other office duties performed.

With the association growing continually, the demands on the office are spiralling and unless the office is staffed full-time, this added duty means many other important items are put on hold during the frantic week leading up to the State Championships.

Under 18 State Championship - Gympie

Accommodation was booked for three teams and officials at the Great Eastern Motor Inn - this Motor Inn had previously been used by BWHA and the service received was again of a very high standard. At the last minute a fourth U18 team was asked to attend and accommodation was booked at the Gympie Motel - this was also quite satisfactory. Thank you to Jenny Tidey who assisted with room allocations and final liaison with the motels.

Open & Veterans State Championship - Toowoomba

Five teams and officials were booked at the Raceview Motel and the Holiday Inn. The two motels were across the road from one another and appeared to be suitable for our large contingent. It wasn't until three weeks before the trip that we were advised that some units would contain up to eight people. Although all people had a bed each - the shared use of bathroom facilities was a concern and my thanks go to the players and officials who handled this unfortunate situation well.

All future Tour Secretary's should ensure that no more than four people share a unit if it only has one bathroom facility.

Again a fourth team was asked to attend this championship at late notice. Accommodation was found at the Downsview Lodge - a student accommodation block. Although the accommodation was basic, breakfast and dinner was included. My thanks to Sue Weimers for liaising with staff at the lodge. I was advised all the players enjoyed their time in Toowoomba.

Transportation to both championships was by coach - Brisbane Bus Lines being the company booked. One coach travelled to Gympie with the Under 18's and two coaches transported our group to Toowoomba. One of the coach drivers to Toowoomba had a very unpleasant manner and a letter of complaint was sent to the company on our return.

It is imperative that a Tours Secretary is appointed in future years - so this important area is given undivided attention. With the splitting of the Open and Veterans championships three tours will now have to be arranged.

For the first time this year a touring Physiotherapist accompanied our Senior and Under 18 teams. This answered long standing requests from players and officials.

Although this position was a paid one, Karen Groves who worked in this capacity, truly earned every cent of her money. Karen was treating players before the bus left in the morning, travelled on the first bus to the field, continued working at the field all day, then back to the motel where she continued to work on players until after 11 pm at night. In Toowoomba Bruce Oakhill, one of BWHA's Sports Trainers, assisted Karen for two days and his help was greatly appreciated. All team managers commented on Karen's great work, stating not only her ability to keep players on the field but taking a great deal of pressure off their shoulders.

Karen gave BWHA detailed reports after each tour and recommendations from these will be adopted next year - her main concern was pre-championship instruction on -

- Nutrition
- Stretching
- Hydration
- Warm-up

All injury prevention work.

This has been a valuable innovation by BWHA and should continue. The benefits far outweigh the costs. Thank you to Michael Dalgleish from Dalgleish & Thams for arranging for Karen to tour with us.

QEII REPORT

As BWHA Co-ordinator for Artificial Turf at QE11 and Redcliffe I had four main functions.

- 1. Access Time Ensuring that BWHA had a fair allocation of turf time for fixtures and training throughout the year.
- 2. Training Time Arranging club training and billing of clubs, taking into account club preferences.
- 3. First Aid As a result of the club survey Management resolved to provide a qualified Sports Medicine/First Aid person at all fixtures. This was achieved by drawing up a roster of suitably qualified people.

BUILDING REFURBISHMENT REPORT

Following the direction by the Brisbane City Council Health Inspector in May, 1992 to upgrade our kitchen and canteen facilities or be closed, planning for the upgrade commenced with enquiries to the Management and BWHA Committees on the needs of the kitchen and canteen for the foreseeable future. Plans were then drawn up, costed, and submitted to the Brisbane City Council for approval in August, 1992.

On approval of the drawings, a combined meeting of House, Finance, and management Committees were convened in November, 1992, to determine how much of the work would be done with our financial constraints. Approval was given to proceed with the work, and, to handle specifications and supervision, two firms were engaged.

The architectural work - walls, benches, floors and ceiling, were undertaken by Richard Lonn, Architect, of Bowen Hills. Electrical and ventilation work was undertaken by Lincolne Scott, Consulting Engineers, of Toowong. The project was under the overall co-ordination of the writer.

In all, ten (10) suppliers and contractors were involved, the most significant being -

The work was completed on time and on budget for the start of the hockey season in March 1993.

Significant improvements for the kitchen were the purchase of an industrial dishwasher, six burner gas range, together with fume hoods, and a gas hot water supply for 75°C water. The lining of the walls required removal of the benches, and these were cut and refitted to suit the new layout, and an extra preparation table was supplied. A new lockable cupboard for storage of crockery was provided.

In the canteen, an impervious sloped floor was provided together with wall lining and a drop ceiling to cover waste pipes in the ceiling. A new rangehood was required to comply with the Health Act, and the necessary benches and sinks were provided. The major additions to the canteen were a new Eswood four compartment hot box, a stand for the pie warmer, a boiling water unit for tea and coffee, and fans.

Electrically, the sub-board at the kitchen has been filled, and a new sub-board added for the new equipment in the canteen, with earth leakage protection. It has been reported that our sub-mains are almost at full capacity, so that any further changes to the building requiring significant amount of power will be costly.

I would like to thank the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association Management and the House Committee for the assistance provided during this refurbishment.

UMPIRES CONVENOR'S REPORT

There was a very sad start to the year with the sudden death of long-serving Board member, Vicky Spice. Vicky's contribution to Umpiring in Brisbane was enormous, both as a top-ranked umpire and coach of both Junior and Senior Umpires. As an adjunct to the obituary which occurs elsewhere in this report, I just wish to add on behalf of the Umpires of Brisbane that Vicky's sharp wit, and dedication to the improvement of umpiring in both Brisbane and Queensland will never be forgotten.

This initially left only 2 people on the Board, an entirely unsatisfactory situation. Because of the work done by Lyn Thomas and Kathy Duggan during the year, their names were added to the Board late in the season.

Umpiring has suffered declining credibility and support over several seasons, with the sharpest decline happening since the move to QE11 which of course coincided with the top umpires also moving with the players. Players from Division 1 down are not showing respect for umpires, and this in turn is causing promising young umpires to withdraw from Umpiring Testing and Coaching to the point where a crisis now exists. ALL current Australia and State A Badged Umpires should be prepared to assist in coaching promising umpires, and players, coaches AND supporters should refrain from abusing umpires if the situation is to improve.

A meeting of State A Umpires and Management was held in September to discuss the current crisis situation, and it is hoped that the commitment to improve the situation displayed by the umpires at that meeting will start to see an improvement in 1994.

Lyn Thomas as Umpires Steward has been a tower of strength at Downey Park. It is not generally realised how much work Lyn does in ensuring that all 43 games each Fixture Day have umpires. Thank you so much, Lyn, both personally and from BWHA. I don't know what we would do without you! Thank you also to Kathy Duggan who assisted with testing at Downey Park in the second half of the season. Heather Scraggs and Michele Arnold as QWHA Board Members tested those umpires who were going for their State Badges. Thank you also to them.

Special congratulations to Michele Arnold (Ascot) who was appointed by FIH to officiate at the Junior World Cup in Terrassa, Spain in September. In doing so, she won the inaugural Heather Scraggs Shield for the Highest Umpiring Achievement in Brisbane. The Award is a worthy tribute to Heather Scraggs, Queensland's first Umpire to achieve World Cup and Olympic listing, and who was Brisbane's Umpires Convenor for 20 years.

Special congratulations also to Julie Ashton-Lucy (St Andrews), who was awarded her Australia Badge in Adelaide. Unfortunately, Kim Thomasson (St Andrews) was unsuccessful, but hopefully she will keep trying.

Kerry Chatfield (Valley) was selected to be assessed at the Australia Under 18 Championships for testing for Australia Badge. Unfortunately, Kerry had to withdraw for personal reasons. We hope that she will be assessed next year.

Congratulations also to Kathy Duggan (Ascot) who was awarded her State A Badge and to Lindy Spice (St Andrews) for her State B Badge, both at the State Championships in Toowoomba and to Stacey McQuillan who received a State C at the Under 18's in Gympie. Brisbane awarded State C Badges to Marion Clark (City United), Debra Hannam (Valley) and Tracey Hounslow (Norths) on Grand Final Day. Well done girls, and keep up the good work!

The Junior Umpires Panel is very enthusiastic, and is sending some very accomplished and promising umpires to the Seniors. It is to be hoped that most of these continue with their umpiring.

Michele Arnold set the Umpires Exam this year under a new format - an Open Book Exam! 125 candidates sat for the exam, and it is very disappointing to relate that a considerable number still failed - some of them clearly did not try, which is a waste of everybody's time! Thank you to Kathy Duggan for marking the exam papers. The experiment of conducting the exam totally at the clubhouse was a success and the Board recommends that this continues. The list of results for the Theory Exam and Practical Badges awarded this year follows.

Umpires were again asked to award points for the RICOH Medallists in both Division 1 and 2 this year. This system is not ideal and is generally unpopular amongst umpires.

This year for the first time, BWHA instituted a Technical Bench on Division 1 and 2 matches with each club required to supply a Judge for their own matches, with the idea being that interested umpires be used to gain experience. However this did not eventuate with most clubs sending along a mother or a supporter. For the system to be of any real benefit, umpires of at least Senior Badged ranking should be used. In Brisbane at the moment, however, this is logistically impossible.

I wish to thank Kim, Lyn, Kathy, Heather, Sue and Michele for their assistance during the year, and hope that 1994 will see an improvement in the Umpiring situation.

The Umpires Panel for 1993 was once again of a very high standard with Convenor Kerry Chatfield and Kym Thomasson both holding State A's, Lindy Spice State B and Janet Hill State C. As well as overseeing 82 Umpires on each fixture day, the panel managed to field test over 50 girls for their practical umpiring badges with a record 35 Junior and 5 Intermediate Badges being awarded. This was an onerous task and my congratulations go to Kerry and the panel for an exceptional job.

Selection trials for Under 13 and 15 Representative teams were held on Sunday 28th March with 3 teams being selected in each age division. A training camp conducted by Sue McLatchey (Regional Coaching Director) on Sunday 2nd and Monday 3rd of May was attended by all team members.

The Southern Cross rounds this season were held on 18th April and 9th May in Brisbane and at the Gold Coast respectively. Our 15A, B and 13B teams were victorious in their divisions and Brisbane once again took out the Cup as overall champions.

This year the Under 13 State Championships were held in Mt Isa. Due to the remote location, there were difficulties with both transport and accommodation, however these were resolved and 4 Brisbane teams travelled to the titles by charter flight. Brisbane were successful, winning Division 1, being placed 4th and 6th in Division 2 and 2nd in Division 3. Congratulations to Lauretta Roebuck who was named "Player of the Series", Brenda Bell "Most Promising Player Division 2 - Runner up", Wendy Alcorn, Lauretta Roebuck and Natalie Willims who were named in the Best 16. Congratulations also to our umpires Kim Brown and Ruth Loughnane who were awarded their State Junior Badges.

The Under 15 State Championships were held in Maryborough and 3 Brisbane teams competed. Although we were not successful in winning, our second and third teams were both placed 2nd in their respective divisions. Our first team who had earlier in the season won Division 3 at the Under 18 State Championship were placed 6th in Division 1. Congratulations go to Erin Moates and Rebecca Richard-Preston who were named in the best sixteen, Tracey Hounslow who was awarded her State Senior Umpiring Badge and Cara Mitchell and Saree Williams who received their State Junior Badges.

The Under 11 Southern Cross was held at Downey Park on Sunday August 1st. It proved to be a very successful day with Brisbane finishing first in both A and B grades and runners-up in B grade. An excellent result.

Congratulations and thanks go to all Representative players, coaches, managers, and umpires for a job well done.

During the 1993 season we were fortunate to have our "C.A.P.S." programme up and running. "C.A.P.S." - Challenge, Achievement and Pathways in Sport, is a leadership development program which offers young people the opportunity to learn new skills, develop leadership qualities and provide service by participation in a number of activity areas. Forty young ladies have registered with the scheme and have completed a large number of tasks throughout the season. These vary from simple office jobs such as photocopying to large scale event management. A committee of 12 "C.A.P.S" participants under the leadership of Carly Beeston totally organised the Under 11 Southern Cross Championship. These girls were a credit to BWHA and their clubs for the very efficient and professional job they performed.

Congratulations to the winners of Minor Premierships and Grand Finals, to Norths, as winners of the "The Taxation Shield" for the Best Club and Valley Under 11A the winners of "The Ruby Robinson Shield" for the Best Team Performance. To our junior umpires who were awarded their badges, congratulations. Two umpiring awards were introduced this season, a medal was presented to "The Most Improved Umpire" - Sandra Bullion from B.S.H.S. and the inaugural "Vicky Spice Shield" was presented to Toni Loughnane as the Most Promising Junior Umpire. I hope these awards are the start of very successful umpiring careers.

It takes an enormous amount of time and effort to run an association of this size and I thank all of those who have assisted in some way.

To our Fixture and Grading Committee and Representative Team Selectors thanks for being available when required.

To Mary Cockings and her grounds committee a big thank you. Caring for the fields in such dry conditions must be a very difficult job but you handled it superbly.

To Julie Moates (Equipment Officer) and Penny Clarke (Tours Secretary) our Representative Teams would be lost without you.

Our Time/Umpires Steward Raelyn Toghill for making sure all matches started and ended on time and to David Thomas who took control of QE11 and with it a huge load off our shoulders. Thank you both.

Elaine Mitchell (Match Secretary) joined us this year in one of the most time consuming positions. Thank you Elaine for a very professional job.

Jodi Slade (Minkey/Modified Convenor) and her Committee at Rasey Park have worked tirelessly all year looking after our "nursery" group and must be congratulated for a job well done. To Mrs Irene Stevens who once again looked after the canteen at Rasey Park, thank you, I know the children love to see you every Saturday.

To Kathy and David Keneally and the canteen staff, thank you for keeping us well fed with our Saturday morning specials.

To the Management Committee of Elaine Roebuck, Judy Trewin and particularly Diane Marsden who always made herself available when I required assistance and was a willing helper in the office every Saturday, thank you.

Finally, I would like to thank Marilyn Chatfield (President) and Maureen Fleming (Treasurer) for the help and guidance they have given me in this my first year as Secretary. These ladies give so much of their time to benefit Junior Hockey but have always found that little bit extra to help me when I needed it and I thank them most sincerely.

In November 1992 our budget was drawn up for the 1993 season. One thing we had not taken into account was sending a fourth team to the Under 13 Championships in Mt Isa and so our budget figure for representative officials subsidies was way out.

Once again our main source of income was our hockey gear shop. At the time of writing this report I do not have the final figures and so am unable to give the total profit for the year. My thanks go to Noala Gordon for all the work and time she has put in to make the shop a success. I would like to thank the players for their support once again and hope that they continue their support in the future.

The Rasey Park canteen was not as profitable as last year. This was probably due to the lowering of the age for girls playing Modified and so the number of players was less this year. My thanks go to Mrs Irene Stevens for running the canteen again this year and look forward to her support next season.

The B.W.H.A. subsidy was used as part funding for our Regional Development Officer. The subsidy for our Representative Officials came from general revenue and accounts for the large difference between last years and this years end of season balance.

As the cost of the Mt Isa trip was so high, it was decided to hold a chocolate drive to help offset the cost of the representative tours. All the money raised by each girl came off her fare. A total of \$3881.00 was raised. My thanks go to Mrs Elaine Roebuck for organising this.

Fines were up on last season. I would like to see this greatly reduced next year as most of the fines were for failure to umpire.

Financially 1993 has not been as good as 1992 but we will still be able to invest money for next seasons subsidies for our representative teams and officials and our Regional Development Officer.

My best wishes go to the committee members who are not seeking re-election next season, and finally to the members of our Management Committee and Club Officials go my sincere thanks for your help and co-operation this year.

REGIONAL COACHING DIRECTOR

"CAPS" - Challenge, Achievement and Pathways in Sport

The response to this program has been extremely positive, rewarding and encouraging. This scheme has provided approximately forty participants the opportunity to develop their skills in the areas of Coaching, Administration, Event and Team Management, Umpiring and Sports Health.

One highlight of the year was a visit from delegates from Hong Kong's Sports Development Board and Education Department, organised by Aussie Sport. This group came to Downey Park to see our "CAPS Kids" in action while they where running the Under 11 Southern Cross Competition. The entourage returned to Hong Kong with video interviews of CAPS Co-ordinators and Participants and information about CAPS in an effort to initiate a similar program in Hong Kong. It was a great honour to host these international visitors and a valuable experience for our participants.

Another major news item for CAPS in BWHA is the article that will be seen in Aussie Sport's "ACTION" magazine early in 1994. It will tell the story of CAPS in BWHA so far, along with photographs of our participants, co-ordinators and supervisors involved in the program.

We have many participants who have completed Step 1 of the program which requires at least twenty hours of work; several who have completed Step 2 requiring at least another 20 hours of work; and Kim Brown (Logan) who has completed Step 3 requiring at least another thirty hours of work. Most participants complete far and above the required hours. The dedication, enthusiasm and leadership displayed by these participants is very exciting and encouraging for the future of our sport.

The production of our own CAPS shirts and caps for participants and co-ordinators to wear, to lift the profile of the program and identify those involved, has proven to be very successful and popular.

The regular CAPS meetings were also valuable for those involved as a means of getting to know each other, exchanging ideas and resolving questions.

The presentation nights held at clubs early in the season proved to be a worthwhile exercise in raising the profile of the scheme and increasing participant and coordinator numbers.

Even though the 1993 playing season has finished, CAPS does not stop. Some participants will be continuing their work throughout the National Under 18 Championships at QEII and many will be gaining valuable experience throughout the Indoor Hockey season.

I would like to take this opportunity fo thank the many people who have dedicated their time and effort to make CAPS so successful in 1993. A special "Thank You" to Julene McDonald from Aussie Sport for her constant support, guidance and encouragement throughout the year.

SCHOOLS

After co-ordinating with Greg Browning (BHA Junior Development Officer) on the areas of Brisbane in which we would each be working, specific areas were targeted to concentrate on developing hockey in primary schools.

On the southside, I began with a "pocket" of schools, taking class groups for half hour sessions during school hours. None of these schools play interschool hockey and have had only minimal or no exposure to hockey. The response from both students and teachers was extremely positive. So much so that these schools will be participating in an after school hockey development program planned for fourth term this year and first term in 1994. This will encourage these schools to adopt hockey as part of their interschool sports program and ultimately encourage students to join clubs.

On the northside, I followed up schools that were attended in 1992 as well as several new schools. Thanks to Peter Roodvelt for his advice on the needs of the northside primary schools. One of the more pleasing results was the inclusion of four Mitchelton Primary School Teams into the interschool Minkey games this year, with thoughts of increasing their involvement in both girls and boys in 1994.

A "mini competition" was played between classes at Wellers Hill Primary School at the end of the skill development program. The students were able to try out their new skills in real game situations which they enjoyed of course. The teachers were extremely supportive and enthusiastic with the organisation, umpiring and coaching. It was very successful and worthwhile for all concerned and will be an idea to use in schools where interschool sport is not supported.

One aim whilst coaching in schools is to convince teachers that hockey is not dangerous to learn, and to give teachers more confidence to take hockey sessions with their classes. The positive and enthusiastic (and often surprised!) attitudes of teachers at the end of the programs indicated that this was achieved.

Some club personnel were keen to assist with coaching in schools. Many thanks to Di Roles (Logan), Debbie Fraser and Erin Bruce (Pine Hills), Louise McLachlan (St Andrews) and Sharlene Michaels (Mt Gravatt Eagles). I was pleased with this response for this year and will continue to work on improving club participation in schools in 1994.

An information kit for schools has been completed and is waiting for sponsorship to enable its distribution to schools. This will be a valuable resource for teachers involved in hockey in schools.

A coaching clinic for teachers in the Ferny Grove area was planned for July, however due to injury, this clinic has been postponed. These types of clinic will be a high priority in 1994.

Overall, the school development program has been successful to date and the work involved proved to be very worthwhile - an encouraging sign for 1994.

All Minkey and Modified coaches attended the clinic at Rasey Park and were extremely keen to learn. Feedback from the coaches indicated that this clinic was successful in providing these coaches the guidance they were seeking.

The clinics conducted at South West United and Redcliffe clubs were planned to involve club team coaches and players. Unfortunately the coaches did not attend in the numbers hoped for, however those coaches and players in attendance were keen for similar clinics in the future.

Both Junior Open Clinics were poorly attended except in the Under 11 age group. Those who attended though, were enthusiastic and indicated they found it worthwhile. As a result of poor attendance, these clinics are not planned for 1994.

The Brisbane Team's Training Camp was very successful in developing both our representative players and our representative team coaches. The coaches observed and assisted the "Guest Coaches" in action so that they could follow-up and reinforce those skills covered in their future training sessions.

NCAS COURSES

A successful Level 1 Accreditation Course was held in March with another planned for October. An "Orientation to Coaching" course was held in June and attended by twenty-seven coaches - a great response!

RESOURCES

Many coaching resources are now available from BWHA. Hopefully these will be organised into a library for 1994 for easier access by all junior coaches. This will be continually updated.

Unfortunately the Minkey and Modified Coaching Manual that I am writing was not completed for this season as originally planned. However now that the busiest part of the year is over, it will be finalised for the 1994 season.

COACHING COMMITTEE

This is the first year this committee has been formed. It provided the opportunity for accredited club coaches to have input into coaching clinic programs, dissemination of information and feedback from clubs. Meetings were held prior to coaching clinics to ensure thorough organisation of same. A long term plan for this committee will be looked at in the near future to ensure the BWHA Junior Development Program is as effective as possible. Many thanks to Gina Archer, Sue Torenbeek, Tess Cuming, Cheryl Lennon and John Arundel for their time and effort on this committee.

STUDENTS

Amanda Quinn from Redcliffe Hockey Club spent some of her work experience week with me coaching in schools and assisting with some administrative work in the office.

Bronwyn Maher, a tertiary student completing a Bachelor in Leisure Studies at Griffith University is completing her practical component with us. She is designing several marketing strategies to assist our association to be promoted more effectively.

SEMINARS

I attended two seminars in 1993. One was a Junior Development Seminar in Canberra designed to look at a National Junior Development Policy for Hockey. The other was a Coaching Seminar in Sydney. Both provided a great deal of information in these respective areas which will be passed on to our local junior coaches and players.

HOCKEY SHOP REPORT

It is with pleasure and great self satisfaction that I present the 1993 Hockey Shop report.

Negotiations with representatives of Just Hockey were carried out in January and thanks to the tenacity of Marilyn Chatfield, satisfactory arrangements were finally reached. Just Hockey would again supply stocks to the shop on consignment.

It was anticipated that a move to larger premises would happen. Because the building required renovations costing several hundred dollars, it was decided that the Hockey Shop remain where it is.

The shop opened 'pre season' on a Saturday from 20.2.93, times being 10am - 2pm and on a Thursday night from 4.3.93, 4pm - 7pm. The support was again only fair and again as stated in last year's report more publicity to all clubs is needed very early in the year to make the early opening financially worthwhile.

This season stock supplied by Just Hockey was very plentiful early but slowed to the end of the financial year. A lot of phone calls plus many hours spent in the car collecting supplementary stock to keep orders filled and customers satisfied, also kept shelf stock up.

Local companies kept us well supplied with Sunski visors (our biggest BWHA seller), strapping tape, mouthguards, whistles, cords for whistles, briefs, PVC tape and drink bottles.

During the season BWHA introduced a rule allowing short trainers or short bike pants to be worn under the playing skirts.

Kym Phillips, nee Moss, a former Australian player was able to manufacture and supply these short trainers in all of the colours required by clubs. Originally it was decided that clubs make orders of 10 or more through the shop but with mutual agreement by Kym, individual players could order directly from the shop.

This proved very satisfactory and clubs are asked if they are requiring large orders by the opening of the 1994 season to have them to me allowing at least 2 weeks for the making of the short trainers. Kym also supplied briefs and normal bike pants in lycra and cotton/lycra for the shop.

We traded on 24 Saturdays and 8 Sundays covering grading, fixtures, selection trials and carnivals.

With the closure of the Annerley Just Hockey shop late last year, considerable trade was received from the mens clubs but probably not as much as anticipated.

I made my home phone number available and received many calls from local, country and interstate players wanting equipment. This also resulted in me going to Downey Park for sales outside of trading hours.

Very strong patronage was gained from the Junior Association. The senior women used the shop much more than last season and we also received more sales from the junior and senior mens clubs.

I would like to thank my daughter, Paula, for her invaluable assistance in the shop. I could not have managed without her and I congratulate her for taking on such a responsibility at 12 years of age.

Another thanks goes to Pixie Josiffe who was literally thrown to the lions. Pix helped out on most Saturdays early in the season for many hours longer than originally volunteered (by Robbie).

To Jodi Slade, thank you for keeping Rasey Park supplied with gear. To all of the Brisbane clubs who supplied voluntary helpers. 'thank you', it could not operate without you.

I also thank Kathy Duggan for her terrific help and understanding given to me with faxes and receiving telephone calls and stock outside of arranged times. Thanks to the members of the Junior Association and lastly to my husband and secretary Ken, who put up with all these strange phone calls and with all of the frustrations of me trying for hours (on two occasions, days) to balance the books.

The commission paid by Just Hockey from the sale of stock is a great boost to the funds of the Junior Association, saving much tiresome fund raising. It should be more widely known to <u>all</u> hockey players that the shop is a fund raising opportunity that benefits both junior and senior players.

Talking to volunteers only 50% knew that a commission was paid to the Junior Association. We need to let others know this situations, many understood that Just Hockey received all monies.

Lastly I would like to thank the BWHA Junior Association for giving me the opportunity to operate the hockey shop for the 1993 season.

JUNIOR UMPIRES REPORT

The 1993 season started as quite a shock with 52 applications of junior umpires to be tested. Although we were happy to see such enthusiasm in our junior umpires, little did we realise that meant doing at least ten testings per week to get every applicant tested three times before the 14th August.

After rostering umpires on to games for the whole year - which wasn't easy, the fixtures were changed and girls seemed to be changing teams, but apart from that slight mishap at the beginning of the season everything seemed to be running fairly smooth and was the beginning to a successful year.

This year we had four umpires talks, but due to timing, lack of advertising, and maybe lack of interest, we found them unsuccessful and plan to work on this areas in 1994.

We had a total of 167 people sit for the Junior Umpires Exam of which 131 passed. From our 49 full-year applicants we presented 29 Junior Umpiring Badges and 8 Intermediate Umpiring Badges which is a great effort to these girls/ladies. Girls who were not presented with their umpiring badges are encouraged to apply to be tested again next year - our full support is with these girls.

For the first time, the Brisbane Junior Umpires Panel introduced two elite awards to Junior umpires - The Vicky Spice Memorial Shield, donated by her father Mr Harry Spice, in remembrance of a most dedicated lady to umpiring. It is presented to the most promising junior (U/18) umpire and this year that was presented to Toni Loughnane from Pine Rivers. The second award is a most improved umpiring medal donated by B.W.H.A. which was presented to Sandra Bullion from BSHS. Congratulations to both girls and we hope they continue with their umpiring in 1994.

Next year the Brisbane Junior Umpires Panel want to encourage our already badged junior and intermediate umpires as well as do our usual testing. we hope to have 5 people testing and at least 5 people to coach umpires. The umpire coaches will be helping the girls who have already received their Junior or Intermediate badges and these girls will hopefully be named umpires to umpire our $17A \rightarrow 15B$ age groups. These particular girls will then be coached for at least one year before going to Senior hockey and this will also give our girls a little more confidence in their umpiring before going to Seniors.

Last but not least I would like to thank my three other hardworking and dedicated panel members for their continuous effort and support. I would also like to thank all seniors who umpired junior semi-finals and/or finals - your help is greatly appreciated.

Looking forward to expanding all aspects of junior umpiring in 1994.
