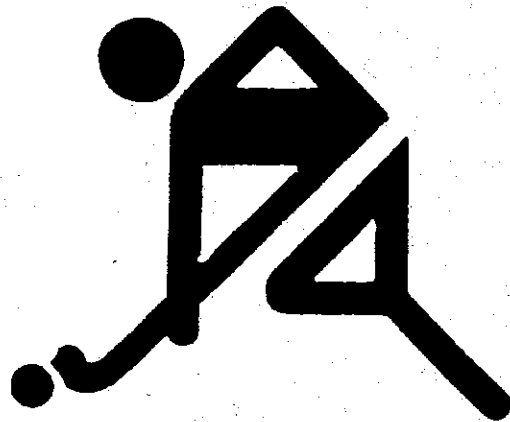

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As I look back over the past year, it is evident to me that BWAHA, like all other entities in the 90's, be they sporting or business, has been struggling to come to terms with rapid and major changes imposed largely from without. The measure of our success in the future will be in how we deal with these changes. While many of us long for "the good old days" when life was lived at a slower pace, there is no turning back, and we must adapt to the fast paced modern world of sport or be left behind. Not all change is progress of course, and we must learn to differentiate between the two to continue to be successful.

Until 1988 all of BWAHA's fixtures were played at Downey Park, making it easy for the administration to keep control, and it was possible for all the officials, coaches, and umpires to organise their weekends so that they could do all of these tasks and still play the game. With the advent of artificial turf and the increase in our junior and senior numbers, our venues now include QEII, Redcliffe, Rasey Park, and Finsbury Park, as well as Downey Park, and if things go as we hope, in the not so distant future there will be a State Hockey Centre at Colmslie. There is also the prospect of other artificial turfs being built in Brisbane, and while everyone acknowledges the fact that more turf time is needed to develop our players, this proliferation of venues is placing enormous strain on the administration, at a time when there is a decline in the number of volunteers.

There has arisen a dichotomy between the needs of the majority of players (who play on grass at Downey Park) and the needs of the elite players (who play at other venues on the artificial turf). Most of the current administration of BWAHA and our women's clubs are still players who play at Downey Park. Our constitution was written for a time when all players played at the same venue, had similar needs, and the same rules could be applied to all. This is no longer true, and one of the major challenges BWAHA faces in a rapidly changing scenario is to confront and address this issue. A new constitution and a new organisational structure is necessary to cope with what are largely two completely different competitions.

It has become very obvious this year that the system we have had in place in the past to communicate with our clubs, i.e. the delegate system, no longer works well. In general, club delegates see very little of their Division 1 and 2 players, and there is a huge communication breakdown. Messages from delegates to the Division 1 and 2 players are slow in reaching their mark if they reach them at all. These elite players consequently have little idea of the workings of BWAHA or how many people give their time voluntarily on their behalf, or of the amount of work that is done by volunteers to enable them to play their game each weekend. We have tried to partially address the problem this year by instituting a direct Newsletter to players. While this is a start, it is by no means the whole answer. What is required is a system that gets the turf players involved in the administration of their own games each week.

One of the biggest problems for our association at the moment is money. One may think money has always been a problem, or at least the lack of it has been, but this is not entirely what I mean. Because of the growth alluded to above, in the past several years we have, by necessity, begun to pay for jobs previously done by volunteers. As examples, our young counter staff in our canteen are paid, we pay our barman, and we have some paid staff in our office. Without these people we could not run our association. There is however a limit to how many jobs the association can fund. If one looks at the list of voluntary officials in the front of this Report (which does not include the Junior Officials or all the volunteer umpires, coaches, and managers), and estimates how much it would cost to pay all of them, the resultant fees for our players would be just astronomical if all were paid. The problem is, with some people being paid but not others, the number of people wanting to give their time voluntarily is dwindling, and then it becomes necessary to pay others to fill in the gaps. It is very much a "Catch 22" situation. We must attract more volunteers as our association grows. The idea of a "Volunteer Coordinator" to recruit and train volunteers as promoted by the government with their VIP Scheme is one which we must urgently embrace if we are to continue to have the personnel to run efficiently. No matter how much money comes into the game in future, there will never be enough to pay everybody - we will always need volunteers who give their time to the game for love of it.

Clubs too must get involved with the VIP Scheme and become more adept at gaining and retaining volunteers. The advent of money into the game at Club level has also had a detrimental effect on the number of club volunteers, with the resultant lack of flow-on of good volunteers to BWhA. As well, top players see themselves as semi-professionals, and demand much from clubs in return for their services. Many players now go where they can get the best deal, and the idea of club loyalty has taken a severe beating. Loyalty to BWhA has become almost unknown, with players offering their services to represent other centres instead of BWhA, even though BWhA has paid their Queensland fees, and organises their fixtures for them on a week to week basis. In sports that are truly professional, "loyalty" is bought by means of a contract. In amateur sports such as our own, that have become semi-professional at the top level, buying "loyalty" is not an option. Dealing with this problem will be a challenge for future administrators at all levels.

Notwithstanding the need for more volunteers, there is one position which in the future must be funded, and that is a full time Executive Director for BWhA. A large association like the BWhA is expected by everyone to run in a professional manner, and a full-time hands-on person is needed. The problem at the moment is that we could not afford the salary without assistance, and the State Government only funds State Associations, not Regional Associations like BWhA, no matter how large they are, and no matter how huge the workload.

There are many issues to be faced in the next few years. It is my hope that the many talented people in BWHHA will rise to the occasion and volunteer for the challenges presented. Even though this year has largely been one of frustration for me in that I did not reach all of the goals I had set myself, there have been some positives. The ASSA administrators course which we ran early this year was a success, the work of the Umpires' Board has been very impressive, and the forming of the Coaches Association is a big plus. I am sure this will be a huge asset to BWHHA in future years. BWHHA's recognition at the Prime Ministerial Women and Sport Awards in March attended by the Hon. Prime Minister, Mr Paul Keating was a boost, with BWHHA receiving a Merit Certificate for Promotion of the CAPS Scheme. Brisbane won the Open State Championship for the thirty-third year under a new coach, Ian Pavitt, after long standing Brisbane coach Jan Hadfield stood down this year. Jan again showed her coaching ability at top level by taking out the Division 1 Premiership with St Andrews.

A major part of my time during the last twelve months has been taken up with the work of the Joint Hockey Committee constituting the Presidents of QHA, QWHA, BHA, and BWHHA. I accepted the role of Secretary of the Joint Committee, and we were very active during 1993/94 in working together to try to achieve what every State capital (including Darwin) has, but Brisbane does not, namely a State Hockey Centre. A submission was put to the State Government in November last year, and as a result a Feasibility/Design Study was commissioned by the State Government to which the State Government contributed \$40,000.00. The work done towards this goal by both the Joint Committee and the State Hockey Centre Steering Committee has been truly onerous, and I thank all concerned, particularly BWHHA's representatives on the Steering Committee, Keith Nix (Deputy Chairman) and Ian Laffan for all their efforts on behalf of hockey and our association. The Feasibility/Design Study was submitted to the State Government in early July, and we now eagerly await the outcome. Hopefully it will be a happy one.

I am sad to see my Secretary Jenny Heron retiring this year. This is one of the most difficult jobs in the association, and Jenny has done it extremely well. I am very sorry to see her go, but understand and sympathise with her reasons. She has nominated for some of the other positions in the association, and I am sure will continue to be an asset to the association and a help to me. Thank you sincerely Jenny, enjoy your "retirement". The other person "retiring" this year is Marilyn Chatfield. Marilyn steps out of the chair of the Junior Association, and has nominated for Senior Management. There would not be a single person in the association who was not of the opinion that the Juniors are losing a President par excellence. You will read of her work in the Junior Section of this report. Congratulations Marilyn on the wonderful work you have done with the Junior Association. It has prospered enormously during your term and you are leaving it on a firm very foundation for the future. We hope to make continued use of your management talents.

Thank you also to my Management Committee for putting up with me and giving your time to the association, thank you to those people who are standing down from positions this year, your contribution has been appreciated, and a sincere thank-you to all those people, too numerous to mention, who so generously donate part of their lives to the benefit of women's hockey in Brisbane.

This year our long standing sponsors Inchcape Office Products (Ricoh), Cadbury-Schweppes, and Leo Muller Toyota have continued to support us well, and I thank them on behalf of BWHHA for their involvement with our sport. We have a new sponsor on board this year -Streets Icecream - and we thank Streets for joining with us in promoting women's hockey, and look forward to a long and mutually rewarding association.

This year the Queensland Women's Amateur Sports Council, with whom we are affiliated, and, from whom we sub-lease our Downey Park fields, voted in a new President, Thelma Crouch, after long-standing President, Mrs Ruby Robinson retired. We wish Thelma well in her new role and Robbie well in her retirement. Many hockey representatives attended a testimonial dinner for Robbie at the Parliamentary Annexe to give her a fitting farewell for her lifetime involvement with women's sport. BWHHA made a presentation at an afternoon tea on Finals Day at Downey Park to say thank-you for her years of voluntary effort on our behalf. Women's sport owes her a great deal, and we may never see her like again.

This year we have received financial support from both the Brisbane City Council and the State Government. We are indebted to both levels of government for their help. We hope that their assistance will continue in order to help us help the community we live in, by providing a healthy outlet for the sportsgirls and sportswomen who choose to play the best game in the world, (and in which we are World Champions) - HOCKEY !

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Tuesday 26th October was the 1993 Annual General Meeting of the Brisbane Womens' Hockey Association Inc. A large number of people including many Life Members were in attendance. Long Service Awards were presented to Jan Hadfield for fifteen (15) years and Julene Grant for ten (10) years service. The new/old executive took their positions and all other nominated positions were announced.

On Sunday 31st October, Management meet with all the workers from different committees and our Life Members for an informal BBQ to thank everyone for their work during the past year. The BBQ was two-fold as it tested out the new flume in the canteen. Thanks to Len Ballantyne for cooking and Joyce Proctor for organising the salads etc.

At the Queensland AGM on 12th November, Lyn Thomas received a Long Service Award for her contribution to hockey in Brisbane. Julie Bartlett attended our Presidents' Cup presentation afternoon and presented Lyn with her badge. BWhA thanks Lyn for all her hard work and hopes she continues for many years to come.

The new management met on 30th November to arrange their portfolios and to start planning for the 1994 season.

BWhA members once again helped QWASC with the annual Lord Mayor's "Christmas in Storyland" and I thank the following clubs for sending along their quota - Easts, Bulimba, Pine Rivers and St Peters.

January was busy with the usual two (2) full day meetings to go through the build up of correspondence and to set the calendar for the year.

The February Council meeting and all clubs received their Administrative Folders and Umpires Convenors Folders to ensure that they had all the forms required for the season. Nomination forms for players, coaches, managers and umpires were distributed for the Under 18 and Open Championships. Twenty-one (21) clubs affiliated with a total of 86 teams. One (1) team dropped out in May and another new team took its place in the ninth division competition.

On the weekend of February 12 and 13 BWhA held an ASSA Course at the Downey Park headquarters. Over forty members from our association participated in the weekend. The information gained on administration was of great relevance and will be of enormous benefit to all who attended.

Jan Hadfield gave a Umpires talk at Downey Park for Division 1 and 2. Members of the Umpires Board visited clubs to give each club individual information to filter through to their members.

The Division 1 and 2 season commenced early in March to take into account fixtures when the Under 18 and Open Championships were to be held. This worked quite well, a few problems were incurred due to the number of players absent for the National Under 21 Championships and these will be taken into account for future fixture organisation.

The Under 18 teams were named and started training for the State Titles and the Southern Cross Championships. The first round of the Southern Cross Championship was held at Brisbane on Sunday 13th March and the second round at Toowoomba

The Open nominations closed on the 8th March and the selectors started the task of selecting four (4) teams to best represent Brisbane.

The Under 18 contingent travelled to Townsville by bus leaving Brisbane on Thursday 29 April and arrived back on Tuesday 3 May.

Kirsten Barney, Rebecca Richard-Preston and Bridie Potter were named in the Queensland Under 18 Squad.

The Brisbane Open teams, coaches and managers were named on Tuesday 26 April and started to train ready for the State Championships at Ipswich on the June long week-end.

Presidents Cup for Division 1 and 2 was played on Monday 16 May with Easts and Commercial playing in Division 2 and Easts and St Andrews in Division 1. Players of the Match Anne-Marie Callow (Division 1) and Kirsten Barney (Division 2) were announced and asked to Downey Park on Sunday 29 May for the Presidents' Eleven photograph.

Fixtures continued to run smoothly, with a few games being played at Rasey Park each week to utilise our new acquisition. The fields were very heavy and some players were having trouble adjusting to the length of grass after the last few years with bare patches on the fields.

Tuesday 24th May, Management met to ratify the Veterans teams and officials, the following week-end the Vets teams started to train.

Sunday 29 May was Presidents' Cup at Downey Park for Divisions 3 to 10 and Veterans. A few games went into extra time with only one game being won on a countback of points. Presentations were held in the clubhouse with Life Members attending afternoon tea. Peter Watterson our Schweppes contact was unable to attend but he sent along Lorrae Carr and Tony De Luca to represent Schweppes. The Players of the Match in each division were presented with a Sports Plus bag and towel. Jack Dale was present and took the photograph of the Presidents' Eleven with Ronda Nix.

The Open Championships were held in Ipswich and the Brisbane teams travelled by private vehicles. All players, coaches and managers acquitted themselves very well. Congratulations to the girls named in the Scorchers and Queensland Under 21 Squads.

We marked the fields on a regular basis both at Downey Park and Rasey Park.

Mr Mick Ahern has now got our ride on mower working perfectly.

Before the start of next season the new bridge from Downey Park to Rasey Park will be completed.

It was a great help this year to get advice from the players regarding holes and other problems on the fields. This enabled the Grounds Committee to rectify these problems as soon as possible.

We have finally got 2 of the hockey fields at Rasey Park level and hopefully can work over there in the "off" season.

The radio active sand has been removed from field 3 and the field has been returfed and top dressed.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our small band of marvellous workers - Peter Costello, Bev Broadfoot, Ted Curtis, Allan Fluerty, John Bowkett, Mick Ahern, Ross Mitchell and John Bigg. Also I would like to thank Queensland Women's Amateur Sports Council (Mrs McDougall in particular) for their assistance throughout the season and a special thank you to Daphne Haas and Don Adams from Softball for allowing us to "potter around" the fields during their season.

In closing I would like to wish everyone a Happy Christmas and a Prosperous New Year.

TOURNAMENT & TECHNICAL REPORT

1994 has been a year where we introduced a new policy with regard to the Technical side of our game for those players, officials and spectators at QE11.

Team officials and umpires were, at the end of last season, asked what could be done to ease the problems faced by them at QE11.

The two main responses were - reducing the number of players and spectators allowed in the dug-out area and reducing the verbal abuse received, to both players and umpires.

This was looked at by the Management Committee and the Umpires Board with the result that is currently in place i.e. 14 players plus 3 officials allowed per team per dug-out, no spectators between the fence and the running track.

Every week the area immediately around the dug-outs has been chained off and the technical bench endeavours to ensure that the dug-outs are not occupied by more than the acceptable number.

Some clubs unfortunately disregarded this and at times became quite abusive towards the official who approach them regarding this ruling.

Clubs are reminded that the people who work this technical bench are volunteers doing a job to hopefully better the atmosphere for their players and umpires.

The umpires also are volunteers and are not expected by B.W.H.A. to be on the receiving end of verbal abuse from over zealous coaches.

The situation is that if Clubs and Coaches are not prepared to follow the guidelines set down for QE11 and Redcliffe and continue to verbal officials, umpires and players from the opposition team, then their presence during games (both in the dug-out area and in the stand) may be refused.

B.W.H.A. has a responsibility to its volunteer workers, its umpires and players and will continue to look to improving their playing environment.

My thanks to all Clubs who provided technical assistance for QE11 and to those members of Brisbane Management, especially Mary Cockings who supervised the Friday evening fixture, who were rostered on weekly to assist in this area.

Hopefully next season will see a more harmonious situation arising on the turf where we work together with the end result being a more professional and efficient hockey fixture.

UMPIRES BOARD REPORT

1994 saw for the first time in many years the BWAHA Umpires Board start the season with a full complement of seven State A or AA Badged umpires.

After receiving a number of complaints about the standard of umpiring in 1993, the board met early in the new year to try to initiate new programs to overcome the many problems being experienced by umpires.

From this meeting the following program was outlined for 1994:

1. A meeting for all umpires who officiate at turf matches. This meeting was conducted by Jan Hadfield. Unfortunately, as in past years, only a few people turned up to this meeting. It is very frustrating when Brisbane is lucky enough to have the best hockey lecturer in the country and clubs and umpires do not take advantage of this. Only 19 of a possible 100 umpires attended.
2. Introduction to Umpiring Talks to be held in each club. Although some clubs were slow to take advantage of this service being offered by the umpires board, eventually all clubs had a talk. The curriculum for the talk was structured to introduce all club players to the basics of umpiring. The feedback from clubs was very positive. I thank all the board members for giving up their valuable time to attend these talks. Each club umpires convenor was left a copy of the talk notes for use within the club.
3. The Players Rules Familiarisation Paper - was introduced to ensure all BWAHA players had a basic understanding of the rules of hockey. This paper was compulsory for players registered in Division 5 to Vets, with failure to sit resulting in suspension. Players who failed the paper on the first attempt were required to keep sitting the paper until they passed. Although this paper was very basic with some of it dealing with BWAHA Local Rules and By-laws, the board felt it laid a base to work on in the future. It was the first time in my life that I have heard concerted discussion about rules on the sideline of fields. A total of 673 players sat for this paper - 5 players gained an A grade pass; 205 a B Grade pass and 463 a C Grade pass. By these figures it is obvious that there are a lot of people playing the game with limited knowledge of the rules that govern it. The board will continue to address this problem in future years. Thank you to Bella Sim & Phemie McDougall and members of Management who helped Lyn Thomas and the the Board members to supervise this paper.
4. The QWAHA Umpires Exam - which constitutionally has to be sat by all players Division 1 to 4 and all BWAHA Representative players. This rule was enlarged to players having to sit each year until they received an A Grade pass (Previously only a C pass was required). A penalty for failing the exam was introduced which made players re-sit the exam until they obtained a pass. Both of these new rules made for some very interesting results. A record number of players sat for the exam. Very few players failed on the first attempt, as opposed to the 30% failure rate in 1993, and

the number of A Grade passes was greater than even the board expected. The board does appreciate that a good theory pass does not necessarily mean better practical umpiring, but again if people at least theoretically know the rules things can only improve.

5. Clubs were advised of their weekly umpiring requirements ie: each club would be required to supply the same number of umpires as they have teams competing. Clubs were also advised of the standard of umpire required for each division they played in. The Board envisages that by 1996 clubs will be able to supply suitably qualified umpires to officiate on matches in the same divisions as they have teams. BWAHA will introduce penalties on clubs who do not have the necessary badged umpires in 1996. Clubs must start to appreciate that supplying the necessary qualified umpires is one of the clubs' obligations in being affiliated with BWAHA. Unfortunately penalties seem to be the only way to do this.

6. Umpires for Testing - each club was asked to submit a list of players to be tested for their practical umpiring badge. Some clubs took advantage of this while other continued to show the indifference of past years. I hope these clubs fully understand what their obligations will be in 1996. The following is a list of clubs, their number of testing candidates and a the number of badges actually awarded by the BWAHA Umpires Board.

The total number of badges awarded in BWAH - 28. The girls who were tested this year were very keen and willing to learn and I strongly encourage them to continue with their umpiring, even if they failed to get a badge this year. A list of the recipients follows this report. Congratulations to these umpires and I hope you continue to strive for higher honours in the umpiring arena.

BWAH continued to support the umpiring front by sending large umpiring contingents to each State Championship for assessment. The exposure of our umpires to this standard of game is very important to umpire development and I hope this practice will continue.

At a higher level BWAH is continuing its great tradition of supplying the best umpires in Australia. Kerry Chatfield attended the Australian Under 18 Championships and has been invited to the 1995 Australian U21 Championship for testing for her Australian Badge.

Michele Arnold and Julie Ashton-Lucy both toured with Australian teams as the team umpire in 1994. With both these ladies achieving such a high standard, the race for the prestigious HEATHER SCRAGGS SHIELD was very tight. This award is given to the umpire gaining the highest representative honour in a year. Michele was the worthy recipient this year.

In 1994 the Board decided to introduce a new award in BWAH. This award was initiated to promote Umpiring as a viable career path. The development of great umpires in Brisbane starts at Downey Park, and for more years than anyone wishes to mention Lyn Thomas has been the guiding force of umpiring at Downey Park. After Heather Scraggs there are very few other people who have given so much to our sport particularly in the Umpiring arena. Lyn's is without doubt the most recognised and respected face at Downey Park and the award for the MOST PROMISING SENIOR UMPIRE was named in her honour - THE LYN THOMAS SHIELD. The inaugural winner was Tracey Hounslow from Norths - congratulations Tracey, I sincerely hope you continue with your Umpiring - the Sydney Olympics are only 6 years away !

Although many new initiatives have been introduced this year, no real benefits will be seen for a number of years. I sincerely hope leaders like Lyn Thomas will continue to be the driving force behind the umpiring resurgence in Brisbane.

To the Board Members Cheryl, Jan, Alyson, Jan, Kim and Jan, and to Michele and Heather thank you for all the time and energy you have given to the board this year. Although your efforts may not be recognised by the majority of players, rest assured your valuable input has been greatly appreciated. I hope all 1994 board members stand for re-election for 1995.

This year saw a changed format for the allocation of umpires with all players, irrespective of level played, being called upon to umpire. For the first time in many years, all clubs were required to supply umpires in direct proportion to the number of teams competing i.e. 5 teams - 5 umpires.

This certainly was a much fairer method of allocation but did not necessarily result in a higher standard of umpiring as many lower grade players had never blown a whistle before. However, with many clubs now organising the coaching of umpires within their clubs and the excellent coaching program run by the Junior Board, we should see a major improvement in years to come.

Turf umpiring still poses somewhat of a problem with a couple of clubs not pulling their weight. These clubs do have players competent of handling this level and, hopefully, they will encourage these players to present for testing in the near future.

I would sincerely thank Bernadette Gotting for coming from Ipswich each Saturday to umpire the 2.15 turf game as, with so many top umpires playing at Downey Park, this proved to be one of the hardest games for which to allot umpires. Once again, late night games at QE11 and Redcliffe posed an umpiring dilemma. Many thanks to those umpires who made a special trip across town to cover these games.

Finally, I would like to thank Kathy Duggan and all members of the Umpires Board for their assistance and June Snarski for her help in cajoling volunteers at Downey Park.

This year BWA Juniors concentrated on "The Year of the Coach". Various coaching clinics and levels were run through Sue McLatchey, our Regional Development Officer.
