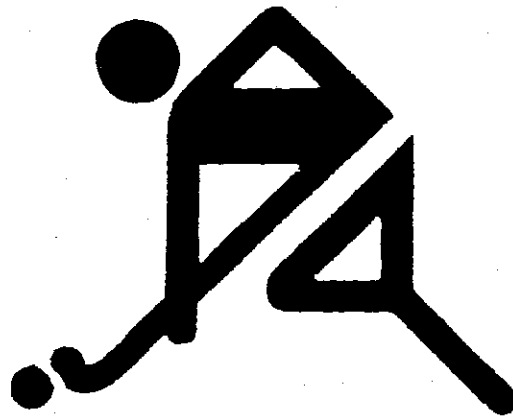

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Well the past year has certainly been a busy one. There is no such thing as an off season any more, and the commitment required from our volunteer administrators continues to increase. Immediately after last years AGM, Brisbane Women's Hockey Association ran a six-a-side mid-week women's summer competition, and a mixed Friday night summer competition. With the demise of the artificial turf at QEII Nathan making summer competitions impossible, it might be thought that we could have an easier off season this year. Not so unfortunately. BWA administrators are heavily involved in the new State Hockey Centre venture at Colmslie, and those who are not, are addressing the issues involved in the reorganisation of our administration to run some of our fixtures at the new complex. At this stage it looks like Divisions 1 to 3 will be played at the new centre along with some junior grades and some veterans' competition. The majority of our players will still compete at Downey Park/Rasey Park next year.

Enormous changes are going on in the hockey community. Some are brought about by outside pressures such as the need to compete with other sports which are professional, and therefore able to command more media coverage. These sports have the financial capacity to pay for advertising and marketing, and therefore have the ability to attract young people to their code. This has made hockey look at better ways to promote our game, and has literally forced us into a National League. The next step is a State League, and plans are well advanced to commence this in 1996. As a result of some forward thinking, Brisbane Women's Hockey Association is well placed to step into this competition. Early this year, BWA organised a new South East Queensland League called the Southern Cross League which commenced prior to the start of the season, and overlapped into early fixtures. This was an Open Competition comprising six teams, the Gold Coast Gypsies, the Ipswich Flyers, the North Brisbane Swifts, the South Brisbane Scorpions, the Sunshine Coast Warriors and the Toowoomba Chill. The South Brisbane Scorpions, coached by Ray Carey, won the inaugural final against the Toowoomba Chill. Major sponsors were Cadbury-Schweppes, and BWA thanks them and all our Brisbane sponsors for their support in 1995. We expect this competition to continue in 1996, and the winner of this Regional League will then go on to compete as the South East Queensland team in the new State League.

One of the most momentous changes to effect our association in the near future is the proposed amalgamation of the Queensland (*Men's*) Hockey Association and the Queensland Women's Hockey Association. This is expected to happen in November this year. It is with some sadness that we will farewell one of the oldest and most successful women's sporting associations in Australia. QWHA has been extremely successful in promoting women's hockey in this state. Should the amalgamation go ahead, BWA wishes the new joint body every success, and hopes that it will look after the interests of the female hockey players, umpires, coaches, and administrators in this state at least as well as QWHA has done in the past. All women in the state, not least of all BWA, will be looking on with interest for the next several years to see how this experiment turns out.

When I started to write my report and looked back over 1995, the first thought that came to my mind was, what a tough year it had been, the second was how little time there was to do everything, and the third was how much was accomplished by so few people.

Brisbane Women's Hockey Association started the year off with a new Secretary, a new Treasurer, and a new Junior President. These three positions are major ones in our association. The three people who took on these challenges will be the first to admit that there was much to learn along the way, and will not mind my saying that having new people in these roles, along with the fact that the Management Committee was under strength all year, as well as the added complication of having to train new office staff, made for one extremely difficult year. We all became stressed at times, our tempers sometimes became a little frayed, and many jobs which we would like to have seen done, remained undone, and jobs for the future. However, everyone pulled together as usual for the good of hockey, we got through the season once again, and with a more settled executive and office in 1996 and a full Management Committee, things can only get better.

To my new Secretary Sue McLean, my admiration for the good natured way you put up with the criticism for not knowing the things we all forgot to tell you were the Secretary's job (failed Clairvoyancy 101 at college did you?). Your sense of humour brought a great sense of balance to the Management, and your no nonsense, efficient approach to the job is much appreciated. Thank you for coming on board in 1995. We are all glad you are staying on for another year - *believe me 1996 will be much better.*

To my new Treasurer Mary Cockings who was a bit of a reluctant starter, congratulations on mastering the finance package on the computer, and my compliments on the meticulous and thorough job you have done on the accounts. The association is fortunate to have you in this position, and we are all glad you too are staying on for another term - *believe me 1996 will be much better.*

To the new Junior President Dianne Marsden, who I am sure had no idea of just what she was letting herself in for, but managed to win all the junior titles in the state, survived the season, and still managed to remember a joke a week, congratulations on the year, - *believe me 1996 will be much better.*

Thank you to the other members of the Management Committee who have done such a wonderful job this year. Lyn Thomas filled the roles of Umpires Convener, Umpires' Steward, and Match Secretary - all time consuming and demanding jobs - and as ever did them with great thoroughness and attention to detail. All the members of BWAH as well as myself and the Management Committee are indebted to you Lyn for your very valuable contribution to our association. Thank you to Jenny Tidey for the many hours you put in as Canteen Steward and on House Committee business, particularly the late hours on a Saturday night, and also for the many other little tasks you help out with to make this association tick. Meg Brodie was responsible for the sponsorships and promotions portfolio, and I am pleased to say that BWAH retained all its

major sponsors in 1995, Inchcape Communications, Schweppes, and Leo Muller Toyota, and was able to bring Streets Icecream on board as a new sponsor. I am sure everyone was pleased with the medals the Streets Sponsorship provided. Marilyn Chatfield was in charge of Player Development and also Tournaments - a double workload - and did both jobs with her usual efficiency and dedication. She was responsible for liaising with our Satellite Coach Kerrie Richards, our Regional Development Officer Sue McLatchey, our Junior Association, and our selectors and coaches, in providing talent identification and development for BWA players. It has been a huge job, and one which will take a few years before the final results come to fruition. Fortunately Marilyn has that great asset, vision, and BWA will reap the rewards of her efforts for many years to come. BWA lost the services of one of our Management Committee Members, Shirley Henderson, due to family commitments part way through the season. Shirley's job was QEII and Redcliffe bookings and allocations for matches and training. Fortunately for BWA, Jenny Heron picked up this responsibility. Thank you Jenny, not only for this job, but also for your work on Records and the Fixture and Grading Committee. The end-of-year results showed just what a good job your committee did with the gradings this year. The Fixture & Grading Committee always comes in for its fair share of early criticism, but usually its decisions are vindicated by results, and 1995 was no exception. This year BWA had two extra people co-opted to the Management Committee. Lesley Schoenwald, as the President of the new BWA Coaches' Association came along and kept us abreast of their activities, and I thank her for giving up her time to keep us informed, and Joyce Proctor, though technically not a member of the Management Committee, attended all management meetings as the Brisbane Social Secretary and Equipment Officer, and looked after us all during our long wearying sessions with the refreshments that kept us going. Once again thank you to the Management Committee for all your work in 1995. I know I demand a lot from you as volunteers. I may not say so as often as I should, but I really do appreciate your help and support. BWA is lucky to have people such as yourselves to give up so much of your personal time for other people for so little reward - you must really love the game.

Of course BWA is a very large organisation, and apart from the Management Committee there are many sub committees and individuals serving in many different roles, all of them important, and all of them necessary to make the association function efficiently. It is not possible to thank all of you personally in this report, however I must mention certain individuals who have contributed beyond the call. Bev Broadfoot on Grounds, Kathy Duggan with the Umpires Board, June Snarski the Time Steward at Downey Park who also rings through all the game results the paper, Caroline Schomberg on House, - thank you - we could not have done without you. Amanda Coleman our new minutes Secretary was the find of the year. Amanda takes the minutes down in shorthand on Tuesday night, types them up on computer and faxes them to me on Wednesday, arranges to have the disk dropped off at the hockey office on Wednesday evening, so I can then fax through any corrections on Thursday, the office then makes the corrections on her disk, prints them out, copies them, and has them in the pigeon holes for the clubs by Saturday. We are pleased she will be staying on in 1996.

Tracey O'Connor is finishing her term as the Junior Secretary this year. The Junior Association will miss her in this capacity as she has done a wonderful job, and much of the credit for the smooth running of any association must go to the secretary. Tracey has filled many positions for BWAHA over the years - she was my Junior Treasurer when I was first Junior President many years ago - and she is always a diligent, cooperative, and pleasant worker. I know Tracey will continue to work for the association in some capacity. I sincerely hope we can entice her onto the senior management before too many more years go by. Meanwhile Tracey enjoy your "retirement".

To our Regional Development Officer Sue McLatchey, who is the only female employed full time in the coaching area in hockey in Queensland, I would like to say what a wonderful job you do for us and how much we appreciate you. I only wish we could afford to pay you what you deserve. We were joined this year by a new administrative assistant, Leesa Byrne who replaced Karen Malowieki. Karen left us at the beginning of the year to become the proud mother of twin sons. Leesa is always pleasant and helpful, and though she knows very little about hockey, has great office skills, and complements our Administrative Officer Kathy Duggan very well. They make a very good team. To Kathy Duggan who runs our office - what can I say. We could not manage without you Kathy. You are truly the wind beneath our wings.

To everyone who has worked for the association in any way in 1995, whether on management, the junior association, finance, house, grounds, judiciary, umpires' board, tours, fixtures and grading, match, archives, development, selection, tournaments, championships, canteen, first aid, technical bench, social and hospitality, fundraising, promotions, publicity and media, hockey shop, or as a coach, manager, umpire, delegate, turf official, or just general dogsbody, please accept not only my thanks, but the thanks of all those people who participated in our game in 1995.

### **SECRETARY'S REPORT**

Having just completed my first year as secretary, an interesting position, a lot of you may well ask who I am, I was not familiar to a lot of the regular faces, and I still have yet to meet many people. Yes, I am a cockroach who has had some experience in sports administration, the limiting factor has been my lack of historical information on Brisbane Women's Hockey Association Inc. Firstly I would like to let the important people, the players, know what a well organised and financially sound organisation they have administering their favourite sport. With the coming of the State Hockey Centre in 1996 all goes

well for future hockey. Granted, there are problems with the condition of the grounds at Downey Park, as they are used all year round, and management are attempting to address the problem, and level the playing fields.

Hockey is alive and progressing with the times. Much has happened this year, I will attempt to give a summary of the highlights of the 1995 season.

## **CHRONOLOGICAL SYNOPSIS OF THE 1995 SEASON**

### **PRE SEASON**

- Planning for the 1995 season began as the 1994 season concluded, in some circumstances even before the season had ended.
- One of my first task after election was the carpeting of the downstairs office. Kathy Duggan and myself used our newly found carpet-laying skills to help make the office a more pleasant working environment.
- BWAH organised two summer competitions. Namely Wednesday night women's six-a-side competition at QEII run by Ian Honour and the Friday night mixed competition at QEII run by John Bowkett.
- For the first time BWAH ran a Satellite program for talented players in the off season - this program paid dividends which can be assessed by the success Brisbane had this year in championships.
- The 1995 Calendar had numerous drafts, before the end of January the 8th edition was printed.
- The Administration Folder (the "Bible" for all BWAH clubs) was organised. Forms, forms and yet more forms were put together, with the date each and every form needed to boomerang back to the Downey Park office. Thanks to Kathy Duggan for her untiring efforts with this task, having to carry me, as I commenced my new employment.

### **FEBRUARY**

- All hockey players were elated by the big announcement, the approval of Government funding for the State Hockey Centre at Colmslie, the designated site, now the hard work really starts, hopefully the turf will be ready for the 4 nation international event in March 1996.
- Commencement of the inaugural Southern Cross Hockey League. Players and spectators welcomed this event, thanks to Ronda Nix - the driving force behind the competition. Congratulations to the North Brisbane "Schweppes" Scorpions who took out the prizemoney, which went towards the expenses of the Brisbane sides to the State Open Championship in Townsville.
- The Coaches Association had its first meeting - a great think tank arena for coaches and aspiring coaches, I am sure there is room for more to attend.

### **MARCH**

- The office farewelled Karen Malowiecki (to await the birth of her twins),



thanks for your assistance to BWA and welcomed Leesa Byrne on board, I am sure, given time, that you will learn who is who, and how the association is organised.

- Division 1 & 2 fixtures commenced, due to the Southern Cross Hockey League points in Division 1 were awarded for Presidents Cup only.

#### APRIL

- Division 3 to Veterans commenced fixtures. Eighty four (84) teams were affiliated this season, which includes one late affiliation to eliminate the bye in Division 9. Therefore there are over 1,000 senior women players in Brisbane.
- A momentous occasion was the opening of the bridge which the Brisbane City Council kindly constructed to enable BWA to have easier access to Rasey Park, I believe it was actually part of their bikeway plans, but hockey will benefit from its construction.
- The Australian Under 18 Championship was held in Sydney, Brisbane was represented with Kirsten Barney, Catherine Clark and Rebecca Richardson with Kirsten being named in the Australian U18 train-on squad.

#### MAY

- Brisbane 1 were the State Champions for the 34th time, having won the Queensland Open Championship in Townsville held over the May long weekend. Congratulations Kelly Free on being named "Player of the Series". Brisbane entered 2 teams in this competition, with the second team finishing 8th.
- A sunny day dawned for the Presidents' Cup matches at Downey Park where the two top teams in each division played off for the right to hold the Presidents Cup for 12 months. Congratulations to the winning teams and to the players who were named "player of the match" - they comprise the *Presidents Eleven*.
- A Brisbane junior development team flew to Darwin to participate in an international competition, the Arafura Games, a valuable learning experience where our girls won the Bronze Medals on offer.
- The compulsory Player Familiarisation Exam was held again for all players from Division 5 to Veterans - time to learn those rules, crowd into the clubhouse to circle some answers and hope to pass, without a little help from friends. Time, I think, to get an "A" pass and therefore I won't have to do it next year, I tried and missed by one point - ho hum!!
- Mary and the grounds committee purchased the super duper mower, players should have noticed that the grass is now mown to a sensible height, better for hockey.

#### JUNE

- The Queensland Veterans Championship was held in Cairns, 3 teams winged their way up to the warmer part of the state, too warm in fact as dehydration became a problem. Nevertheless, Brisbane 1 finished 4th, Brisbane 2 - 8th (having 2 goals scored against them all weekend, losing 3

stroke play offs, will be relegated to Division 2 next year) and Brisbane 3 - 4th. Congratulations to those who were selected in the Queensland teams and to those umpires who gained awards at the tournament.

- The QWHA Umpires Exam papers were done by players from Division 1 to 4 as well as representative players, another exam to pass, what I have to do to play hockey!! I got an "A" this time. Bingo, I won't have to do it next year.
- Brisbane successfully hosted and won the Under 15 Queensland Championship. Ronda Nix was tournament Director and Marilyn Chatfield was the Championship Convenor. A full report in the Junior Section of this report.

## JULY

- July passed by in a flurry of games (some won some lost), many goals scored, whistles blown, cold training nights, rep training - the usual mid season grind when tempers were sorely tested, the frost killed off the grass at Downey and a bit of a dust bowl developed, and Division 2 were getting sick of playing night matches.
- The Australian Under 21 Championship was held in Canberra, on I believe a frozen turf, Nicole McMahon, Chris Sheppard, Kim Parkes, Erin Smyth and Meagan Thomas represented Brisbane admirably, unfortunately Lainie Usher had to withdraw due to injury.
- The Brisbane City Council hoped BWA was going to vacate QEII so they could start the athletics field construction. We struck a compromise, they turned the outer area into a construction (no go area) zone and we continued amid the rabble on the sadly deteriorating turf in the middle.

## AUGUST

- We had arrived at the business end of the season, where teams were jostling for final placings and realising that goals for and against, resulting in that goal balance, was important. After the conclusion of the final round of matches the Minor Premier teams' were presented with their respective shield.
- A highlight of the year is the *Ricoh Dinner*, which was held at the Ridge Hotel this year. Congratulations to Tammy Cole on winning the prestigious Best & Fairest award - the *Ricoh Medal*. Gail Austen, BWA's Patron, provided the audience with interesting anecdotes of her illustrious sporting and business career. A full list of award winners is included in this annual report.

## SEPTEMBER

- Warm weather finally arrived - it was semis and finals time, yes we still were able to play matches at QEII - with great difficulty. Congratulations to St Andrews on winning the last QEII Division 1 grand final and don't worry about the champagne spillage on the turf. The Premiership Trophies were presented at the conclusion of the grand finals, which were hotly contested events - many matches going to strokes. This year the winning

and losing teams were presented with individual *Streets Medals*, thanks to Streets for this thoughtful gesture.

- Brisbane entered 4 teams in the Queensland Under 18 Championship which was held in Toowoomba, during the festival of flowers, late September. Brisbane 1 finishing 3rd, a full list of results is further in this report.

## **POST SEASON**

- Planning and organisation for the 1996 season has already begun.
- The Queensland *Scorchers* will go into action soon, their home turf being in Cairns. Good luck as they do battle in the Australian League.
- Brisbane officials continue to work for the new State Hockey Centre.

As you would be aware BWA has two part-time administration officers who do an exceptional job answering the phone and consequently answering numerous enquires as well as completing the mountain of paperwork which assists in the administration of BWA, my job would be a nightmare without them. Thanks to Kathy Duggan for her efforts, also to Karen Malowiecki who left early in 1995 to await the birth of her twins, congratulation on their subsequent birth and good luck in rearing them, and thanks to Leesa Byrne, who replaced Karen, you are a quick learner and have fitted in well.

Finally, I would like to thank those people who "guided" me through the year, your advice and patience was appreciated, I am always ready to listen to what people have to say in the administration and organisation of their sport.

## **TREASURER'S REPORT**

A budget for 1995 was set in January and we have been able to end the year almost on target. All committees are to be congratulated for their cooperation.

My sincere thanks to the Brisbane Management team for their support and a special thank you to all the clubs for their cooperation throughout the season.

Taking everything into consideration I feel we have had a most productive season.

## **THE STATE HOCKEY CENTRE ASSOCIATION INC REPORT**

In the latter half of the eighties, an *ad hoc* committee, known as the Joint Hockey Committee, consisting of the Presidents of the Queensland Hockey Association Inc (QHA), the Queensland Women's Hockey Association Inc (QWHA); the Brisbane Hockey Association Inc (BHA), and the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association Inc (BWA) was formed to deal with matters pertaining to cooperation between these bodies in relation to the artificial turf which was built at QEII Nathan in 1988. This turf was built as result of mainly federal government funding for hockey, and was given to the City of Brisbane to manage and maintain. The Joint Hockey Committee continued to function over the years, and was responsible for setting the parameters for the hierarchy of use by the various organisations using the pitch at QEII, and also served as a dispute resolution body when clashes of timetables occurred.

With the advent of a Labour Government in 1989 which was promising funding for sport as a spinoff from poker machine legislation, and the dissatisfaction that hockey had with the facilities at QEII (as opposed to the pitch itself), the Joint Hockey Committee took on the role of a lobby group to government to obtain a State Hockey Centre for Queensland, as Queensland was the only state without a major headquarters. A Steering Committee was set up to investigate possible sites and draw up a submission to government which was presented in 1991. The four associations (QHA, QWHA, BHA, BWA) agreed to contribute equally to the production cost of this submission, whilst the volunteer professionals on the committee contributed the cost of their time. It has been said with the benefit of 20-20 hindsight, that this initial submission was too optimistic in its

funding requirements. At the time, it was of the order of cost that the committee had been unofficially advised could be funded. It also addressed a multi-sports complex rather than just a hockey facility. The indications from Government were that single sport complexes would not be considered. This initial submission was unsuccessful, and the Steering Committee was disbanded. It served the purpose, however, of making the Government aware of the needs of the hockey community, and laid the ground for future approaches.

With poker machine money coming in to the government coffers, it was decided in early 1993 that it was a good time to again approach government with the need for a State Hockey Centre. The Steering Committee was re-established. This time more emphasis was placed on convincing the Government of the desirability for Queensland to have a major hockey centre, taking into account the high success rate and popularity of the sport. This submission was presented to the Department of Tourism Sport & Racing in November, 1993, and received a favourable reception. Several months of discussion then took place between the Department and the Joint Hockey Committee, with the government agreeing on 30th March, 1994 to fund a Feasibility Study to a maximum of \$40,000.00 to determine the capital cost and financial viability of the project. The Steering Committee had estimated in their submission that a full feasibility and design study would cost \$80000.00. A compromise was reached, and the feasibility and partial design study was completed for \$62044.00. The four hockey associations (QHA, QWHA, BHA, BWA) provided \$5511.00 each on the assurance of the Joint Hockey Committee that if the project proceeded, and the facility was built, these sums would become loans to the State Hockey Centre.

The Feasibility Study was presented to the Department of Tourism Sport & Racing in July 1994. This document was subject to independent capital cost and financial audit by the State Government before final acceptance. The Joint Hockey Committee was commended by the State Government for the thoroughness and professionalism of the document, and was advised that hockey had set a high standard for all other sports to follow. The Department then recommended the project to the Minister for submission to cabinet, and the Joint Hockey Committee began the anxious wait for an outcome. The announcement by the Minister for Tourism Sport and Racing, R.J. Gibbs MLA, that a grant of \$4.8 million would be approved, was made to the media in late February 1995, to the great delight of all involved. A letter approving the grant, dated 31 March, 1995 was received in early April.

Since that time the Joint Hockey Committee has worked harder than ever on the project. A Project Control Group (PCG), consisting of the members of the Joint Hockey Committee, Jim Quaitie (QHA), Ronda Nix (BWA), Julie Bartlett (QWHA), and Don Hicks (BHA), along with Barry Innes, Principal Facility Development Officer, Recreation and Facilities Development Unit, Department of Tourism Sport & Racing, and the Brisbane City Council nominated representative, Scott Alston, Sport Development Coordinator, Recreation Branch, Department of Recreation and Health, was set up by the State Government to oversee the project. Expressions of Interest were called by the

Department of Tourism Sport & Racing from suitably qualified Project Management firms. Twenty-four firms submitted bids, and five were shortlisted and asked to tender for the project. In early May, 1995, Codd Partnerships were selected as Project Managers, and work on the project commenced.

Regular meetings with the Project Engineer, Brett Codd, of Codd Partnerships, and the various sub consultants have been held. Expressions of interest have been sought and tenders called from suitable suppliers and contractors. The start of work was delayed due to finalisation of the lease with the Brisbane City Council, and some delay in meeting Town Planning requirements. Considerable reorganisation of the original layout had to be done to meet Council requests. A Community Consultation meeting was held with the BCC and residents of the ward to outline the development. Part of the site was zoned Open Space, and consent was required. No objections from ratepayers were received, however, the local councillor and the BCC imposed some conditions on the lease which were resolved after negotiation, and the lease was finally signed on 1st September, 1995. Construction commenced immediately thereafter and is now well under way, which is just as well, as the artificial turf at QEII Nathan was removed mid-September, shortly after our 1995 finals. We look forward to starting the new season in 1996 at our own home, for as well as being the Queensland State Hockey Centre, the involvement by the Brisbane Associations has ensured that it is a Brisbane Centre as well.

Many people have been involved in the effort to get this project started, some much more of course than others. It is true to say that every contribution has been important, and it is appropriate that I thank some of those people in this report. To the Joint Hockey Committee of Jim Quaite (QHA), Julie Bartlett (QWHA), and Don Hicks (BHA) who worked alongside me in my capacity as President of BWHA on the committee, I say a very big thank you for your enthusiasm, cooperation, and sheer stickability in the face of some considerable frustration. Thank you for the many hours you take away from your work to attend to the business of the State Hockey Centre. The energy, good humour, and courtesy you show in your approach to the task has made all we have achieved possible. My thanks also to those previous Presidents of the member associations who served on the Joint Committee over past years, particularly Daphne Pirie, who as President of QWHA, and since her retirement from that position, was a tireless lobbyist for the project.

To all the members of the Steering Committee responsible for the 1994 Feasibility Study, particularly John Giles (Chairman), Keith Nix (Deputy Chairman), Daryl Richards, Keith Holzberger, and Ian Laffan, and those members of the earlier Steering Committee, John Giles, Keith Nix, Daryl Richards, Lou Hailey, Neville Crase, and Bob McPherson, the hockey community is in your debt. We thank you sincerely for your professional input, and the many voluntary hours you have contributed to the benefit of our sport.

To the members of the Bulimba Hockey Association Inc and the Bulimba Women's Hockey Association Inc, thank you for the support that you have given the project. Without your cooperation we could not have secured the site, and hockey thanks you for the foresight you have shown. Change is the



hardest thing for human beings to accept, and your club is to be commended on your progressive approach in recognising that hockey could benefit from a central venue for its State Centre, while you could also benefit by moving away from a basically inner city area to an area of population growth.

Part of the Feasibility Study supplied to the State Government was a draft constitution of the body to receive the grant and to construct and manage the State Hockey Centre. As the four major stakeholders in the project, QHA, QWHA, BHA, and BWA combined to become full member associations of a new association to be known as the State Hockey Centre Association Inc, each with an equal interest. The State Hockey Centre Association Inc was granted incorporation on 27th April, 1995. The body responsible for the setting up of the association, i.e. the Joint Hockey Committee, became the Interim Committee of the State Hockey Centre Association Inc, and as required under the Act, Acting Secretary was appointed by the Interim Committee to act until the first general meeting could be convened. Ronda Nix was appointed to fulfil this role. Since the financial year of the State Hockey Centre Association Inc (SHCA) ends 30th June, the 24th July was selected as an appropriate date to hold the first Annual General Meeting, and this first AGM was held at the BWA headquarters at Downey Park. Jim Quaite was elected Chairman, Julie Bartlett Deputy Chairman, Ronda Nix Secretary, and Don Hicks Treasurer.

The next level is junior and senior development squads organised by our R.D.O. Sue McLatchey. These squads are selected without nominations being called.

The top talent identified players are our satellite squads, senior, junior and sub junior. The satellite program is a direct link to the Australian Institution of Sport organised by Kerrie Richards. Both development and satellite squads run an off-season program and continue to talent identify throughout the season.

We had remarkable success in our first year. Brisbane players were selected in Queensland Under 21 and Under 18, Queensland Secondary Schoolgirls, Australian Secondary Schoolgirls teams as well as selected in Queensland "Best 16" in Under 15 and Under 13 representative teams. Brisbane has triumphed in Queensland State Championships this year winning 1st and 2nd divisions at Under 15 and Under 13 levels. Also the Under 11's were 1st and 2nd Division winners at the South East Southern Cross competition. The Under 18 State Championship were held at the end of September and our 1st Division team finished 3rd, three positions better than 1994.

As with any new portfolio. There is room for improvement, one of the area's we will be addressing is, to monitor and educate the players about the amount of training an athlete should do.

I would like to congratulate Ronda for having the foresight to introduce this important area. Also many thanks to Sue McLatchey and Kerrie Richards for their dedication to Brisbane players.

#### **REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT OFFICER**

1995 saw a shift in the role of this position in BWA. In previous years the majority of my time was focused on school development. This year the focus was more on Coach Education and Player Development. Contact with schools was achieved through Aussie Sport Expo's and various programs as requested by schools. CAPS was again very successful and shows encouraging signs for being even bigger and better in 1996.

## **Coach Education**

There were a wide variety of opportunities for coaches to improve their coaching knowledge and skills. First and foremost, 1995 was the first year of operation of our Coaches Association. This association ran meetings for its membership of 50 (approximately) every five to six weeks to cover various coaching topics/issues as requested by members. These topics were covered by guest speakers, debate, workshops, etc.

Coaches also had access to two Level 0 Courses, two Level 1 Courses, a Level 2 Course, two Specific Skills Clinics (covering Goalkeeping, Dispossession, Passing and Receiving), Saturday morning Mini-Clinics and observation of specialist coaches.

## **The Coach Award Scheme**

This was again a success in 1995 with 49 Encouragement, 6 Recognition and 3 Long Service Awards being given. The list of recipients is as follows:

## **Player Development**

At the top end of our Junior Player Development Program, our Satellite Squad trained under the guidance of Satellite Coach, Kerrie Richards and various invited specialist coaches. One step below them we had our Development Squads which are coached by myself and invited specialist coaches. Then we had our U11, U13, U15 and U18 Representative Teams who attended clinics as part of their preparation for Southern Cross and State Championships. These clinics also provide the players with coaching from specialist coaches.

## CAPS

The emphasis in CAPS in 1995 was ensuring participants were progressing through the scheme through valuable experiences. In 1995 we had four participants who completed their Australian Sports Commission Sports Leader Award. These participants must complete at least 100 hours of work to achieve this. Most of our participants surpass this number of hours well and truly (often just in Step One of the Scheme). We have also had eight participants complete Step Three with many others completing Steps One and Two of the scheme.

In 1996 the emphasis will be growth. We will be targeting clubs to introduce the scheme to prospective participants and co-ordinators to ensure we have a continual increase in the size and quality of the CAPS program in BWA.

Congratulations should go to all CAPS participants for their efforts in 1995, but a special congratulations and "thank you" should go to our CAPS Board Members - Carly Beeston, Wendy Dossetto, Rosanna Pappalardo, Karla Bullock and Sarah Benson. This was our first year of this Board running CAPS in BWA which was a great experience for the participants and a valuable contribution to our association.

In 1996 the CAPS Board and other participants will be running Minkey and Modified at Rasey Park on Saturday mornings, which will be an extremely valuable and worthwhile opportunity.

### Schools

Aussie Sport Expos were held at several southside venues and schools throughout the year targeting all primary school ages.

Various school programs were conducted on request at schools throughout the region with assistance from some club coaches who were very co-operative. "Thank you" to those coaches who have helped with coaching in schools in 1995.

Two after-school programs are planned for last term in 1995. These will be held for Pine Rivers and Bulimba Hockey Clubs, in their respective areas.

### Resources

1995 saw an expansion of our Resource Library to include a wide range of Coaching Videos. These resources are gradually being utilised by club coaches but we have a lot of promoting to do before it's used to its full potential.

Overall 1995 was a successful year for this position in BWA. Our progress is evident in our growth, our improved coaching standards and our players' achievements - e.g. winning the U11 Southern Cross, U13 and U15 State Championships and selections in Queensland Teams. As always however, there is much more that is urgently needed to be achieved in the area of Coach Education, Player Development and growth. With the new State Hockey Centre in operation in 1996 and an obviously concentrated effort required in that area to utilise this facility effectively, I am very concerned about our ability to continue to service our players and club coaches to the same standard we have now, let alone improve on these. For club members to receive adequate assistance in the area of coach education, growth and development of players, BWA needs more than one full time paid employee to work in these areas.

Particularly when the role of this position expands with the "need at the time" to incorporate duties beyond the current role of the position, which is already extensive.

It seems it is time to review the current situation and plan to improve the assistance we provide our clubs in the area of Coach Education and Player Growth and Development.

I would like to thank all coaches in our association for their dedicated efforts throughout the 1995 season, and hope they return in 1996, to take up the challenge of coaching once again.

Congratulations to BWA on such a successful year with their Junior Representative Teams and on running such a large organisation with so few "working roles".

A final "thank you" to all who have supported me in my role as Regional Development Officer. I look forward to 1996 with the hope we can provide an even higher standard of assistance for all club members.

#### **C.A.P.S. REPORT**

CAPS within BWA took on a new dimension this year with the trial of a CAPS Board. The Board consisted of five participants in their final steps of the scheme and they were responsible for running meetings and helping other participants complete their steps. More than anything, this year has been a learning experience for the board which looks set to continue and improve in the coming years. Each member of the board was responsible for one of the following areas.

**Administration** - Activities available in this area included helping the ladies in the BWA office on Saturdays; being involved in the participants own club meetings; and helping to organise the Under 15 Championship and Southern Cross in Brisbane.

**Sports Health** - SMAC courses, taping courses and first aid courses were a few of the opportunities available in this area. There was also the opportunity to talk to qualified sports medicine personnel such as John Thomas at Downey Park and Bruce Oakhill at QEII. It was excellent to see the number of girls who completed hours by attending courses available and it is also pleasing to know that young girls have an interest in gaining knowledge of sports health.

**Coaching** - This season has yet again seen CAPS participants heavily involved in the range of activities available in coaching. These activities included: assisting



and observing the BWA Regional Development Officer, or other accredited coaches at clinics, camps or training sessions; completing a NCAA Level 0 or 1 course; and attending coaching clinics for coaches and / or Coaches Association meetings.

By the end of the season a number of girls had completed their Level 0 or 1 Coaching Course to become accredited coaches. Other participants, who were already accredited coaches, took on the responsibility of coaching their own side. This strong representation of CAPS coaches for minkey right through to the J2 level is a sign that clubs have, and will continue to benefit from encouraging their junior members to become involved in CAPS.

This season was also the first to see CAPS participants coaching at association level, with the Under 11B and 11C Brisbane teams, which went to Warwick and Ipswich, both coached by participants. What an experience?!?

To cap it all off, girls also attended Coaches Association meetings and assisted at minkey and modified skills clinics. It has been a busy year, to say the least, but it also has been a fruitful one, as more and more CAPS participants gain knowledge and develop skills, which will ensure that the number of competent coaches within BWA continues to grow.

**Umpiring** - Another popular area is umpiring and many girls completed hours in a range of activities. They included umpiring weekly fixtures, representative trials and representative competition; observing a badged umpire; attending any BWA umpires board lectures/sessions; becoming a badged umpire and assisting the BWA board with administrative duties such as organising the umpires each week.

**Event and Team Management** - Opportunities in this area included helping representative team managers, managing a club team and attending minkey and modified skills test days at Rasey Park.

Over the past few years, CAPS in BWA has become a training ground for umpires, coaches, administrators and managers. Two shining examples of how CAPS has prepared people for demanding positions are Kerry Chatfield and Sheryl Hockaday. Kerry has done an outstanding job as Junior Umpires Coordinator over the past two years and Sheryl has been equally valuable in her role as Minkey/Modified Coordinator at Rasey Park for the 1995 season.

These are only two of the many CAPS girls who are out at the hockey fields contributing to the success of the CAPS scheme and the sport itself. Let us hope the 1996 season sees the CAPS scheme continue to grow and develop into an even more important part of BWA.

## **1995 ARAFURA SPORTS FESTIVAL REPORT**

### ***MANAGER'S REPORT***

This festival was held in Darwin from 6 to 13 May involving 24 sports, ranging from more traditional type sports like athletics and soccer to lesser known sports such as sepaktakraw. 18 countries and regions from the Arafura Region participated.

#### **Hockey**

The Hockey Competitions for women and men included teams from: Papua New Guinea, Malaysia, Singapore, Sarawak, Brunei, Northern Territory and Hong Kong.

It was an eight team competition for women and a nine team competition for men.

The value of participating in this festival from a player development point of view should not be underestimated. Players were exposed to different systems and styles of play every game and our pre-festival concerns about the "toughness" of our players were put to rest as they met and matched some very strong and professional opposition.

As the festival progressed it was extremely pleasing to see the team's strength and speed of play improve and to watch the versatility of players as they adjusted to the changes both within their own team and the styles of their opponents.

This is only the 3rd Arafura Sports Festival and it has grown remarkably quickly in that time. The future hockey competition will become much stronger as more regions and countries become aware of the value of competing in this festival.

For the future of our players, this festival has given them a taste of international hockey which not only will motivate them but also be another step towards higher representative honours. Having played against this level of competition at this age, these players will be much more confident and prepared for the higher levels of competition in the future.

#### **Gift Exchange**

Each team exchanged gifts with their opposition. Some gave one gift for the team, others gave individual gifts such as badges as well. We gave individual gifts of badges, keyrings and spoons. It would be even better if we could give a plaque or some team gift from "BWHA".

#### **Umpiring**

Attending this festival as our team's umpire, Kathy Duggan has no doubt broadened her umpiring experience, not only umpiring national teams but also

men's teams. Whilst we originally tried to offer this opportunity to an "up and coming umpire", the standard of the festival was such that a high standard of umpiring was required and it was very fortunate we had Kathy on board to do such a great job and represent BWAH so well.

### **Culture**

The atmosphere of the festival was unique from the point of view of having the many different countries and regions participating. Experiencing such a cultural exchange adds to the value of participating in an event such as this. *"This is like a mini-olympics"* was just one of the many comments made that indicates how the players viewed their involvement in the festival.

### **Accommodation**

Staying at the Botanic Gardens Apartments, which were self-contained 2 and 3 bedroom units, was very appropriate as it allowed us the option of dining out or cooking for ourselves. For the younger players in the team, the "cooking for ourselves" became a learning experience in itself!

The apartments were of a very high standard (even if it was difficult to see the floor in some rooms!!!!) and everyone was happy with their living arrangements.

### **Transport**

There was a bus shuttle service available throughout the festival included as part of the festival package. Unfortunately "Darwin Time" seemed to apply to the timetable and we experienced difficulties with transport throughout the festival. We hired a bus for one of our rest days to enable us to sight-see and transport the group more easily. Hiring two nine-seater buses for the duration of our stay would be ideal as this would allow for transport of the group as a whole or allow for people wanting to go in different directions.

### **Rest Days / Sight-seeing**

On the two rest days (apart from training) we were able to include sight-seeing and watching other sports. On our first rest day the whole group toured together to see the Territory Wildlife Park, Crocodile Farm and Jumping Crocs River Cruise. On our second rest day some of the group went to Litchfield National Park Waterfalls and swimming holes and others spent the day watching various sports (or boys ... or boys playing sports!).

On other days, the obligatory shopping trips were fulfilled and some squeezed in a quick trip to the very popular Mindil Sunset Markets.

### **Opening & Closing Ceremonies**

The opening ceremony provided an Olympic Games style beginning to the festival and the players' excitement was blatantly obvious. The closing ceremony provided the opportunity for swapping shirts, etc.

## **The Hosts**

Darwin Hockey Association were extremely friendly and helpful hosts. Nothing was too much trouble and the festival, from our point of view, ran extremely smoothly. Their hospitality ensured that our team remained happy throughout our stay. A special "thank you" to Maurie, Manager of the Hockey Centre, who was extremely helpful and "on call" whenever needed. "Thank you" to Pip March, who was very helpful and patient prior to the festival when we were still struggling to field our team.

## **Our Team**

I would like to thank Kerrie Richards for her efforts as coach of this team. Moulding a team ranging in age from 14 to 24 is no easy task, especially when they only had two trainings as a complete team just 2 days prior to the start of the festival.

"Thank you" to the players who showed a great team spirit and positive attitude throughout the festival both on and off the field, as well as being a very co-operative group.

"Thanks" to Kathy Duggan for her valued assistance throughout the festival with various things that "cropped up".

A final "Thank You!" to BWA for supporting our participation in this festival and therefore making it possible for these players to enjoy such an experience and thankfully experience the success of winning a bronze medal at their first taste of international hockey.

## **Conclusion**

This festival provides the opportunity to develop our players beyond anything we can offer them on a local level or by touring our own country or another particular country. It offers a variety of competition from various countries and regions and the high standard of competition will only improve over time as the festival grows.

In 1995 one of the most difficult tasks was funding the trip and as a result the team membership was based largely on who could afford to go. If we participate in 1997, it would be preferable to be able to select a team from our satellite and development squads without considering financial constraints. To enable this to occur, the satellite and development squads could begin fundraising in the 1995/1996 off-season and continue this as they see fit up until the 1997 Arafura Festival. Ideally, such fundraising could take place to enable the Satellite and Development Program the freedom to participate in the Arafura Festival or any other opportunity which may arise in the coming years.

This tournament is a unique opportunity for players to experience top level hockey and can provide the incentive needed for players to strive to achieve higher goals.

The tournament itself was run superbly and the accommodation was excellent. The only area of improvement would be that a bus was hired for the teams use as the transport was not very reliable. The international flavour of the tournament is very much a part of the off field entertainment and adds a special cultural experience to the games.

The value of this trip can not be understated. I feel that this tournament itself has added a lot of hockey experience and enjoyment to those who went and should be included as a regular event in the Satellite Program.

Special thanks must go to Sue for her hard work in organising this tournament.

## ***PLAYER'S REPORT***

The Arafura Games 1995 was a great opportunity for the Brisbane Development Squad to gain further hockey experience at an international level. It was an extremely well organised tournament, especially in the area of providing for the competitors. For example, the access to food stalls and entertainment was good and the idea of daily food vouchers was very beneficial to all of the team. Most of the sporting venues were situated close together which allowed our team to view a wide range of sports without travelling too far.

Sports Medicine was also provided for all sports, as a number of people in our team did require this assistance. This was well organised and assisted in our well-being during playing time on the field.

The hockey venue was well equipped and suited the needs of a tournament such as this.

Unfortunately, a low note to the games was the transportation to and from the fields, it did not allow for the team to arrive at the venue with the least amount of trouble. The buses were continually late, which cut down the warm up time for our games. However, the transportation to and from the airport was well organised.

Our accommodation at the Botanic Gardens Apartments was an excellent place to spend the ten days in Darwin. The apartments allowed us to prepare our own meals to suit the appropriate sporting diet. There were washing and drying facilities in each unit and we just loved the pool for our refreshing morning and afternoon swims. Some girls did however have slight trouble climbing up and down the stairs with their luggage, but the apartments' staff were willing to assist without hesitation.

From the hockey point of view, the team believes that they have benefited in many ways. Firstly, a lot of friendships were developed during the 10 days between other teams and within our own team. We believe that this is because we had a good time and enjoyed ourselves both on and off the field. From the first game to the last we could see that we had improved overall and began to work really well together as a team.

By attending and participating in this tournament we were able to gain international experience by playing certain Asian National Teams. These teams had histories of playing together for a number of years and due to this we believe that we were able to learn more about particular aspects of hockey. For example, we had to play against a number of different sides which used different systems, therefore we had to adjust and begin to learn how to react and still play our own team game. The team did begin to do this and we learnt how to handle particular systems and due to this a number of people commented, from both Northern Territory and other visiting teams. Everyone was quite impressed at the level of ability in our side especially for such a younger team as compared to the other teams which participated.

Darwin hosted these games really well. They were well organised and we all had an enjoyable time. But, we wouldn't have been able to win a bronze medal without the dedication of Kerrie Richards and Sue McLatchey. Kerrie took her time to watch each individual player and made sure that we each developed or learnt one particular thing during the tournament. She gave each person and the team as a whole, feedback on training sessions and the games. From this Kerrie built upon our strengths and in turn began to improve our individual weaknesses.

Overall Kerrie pulled the team together from a side which was unfamiliar with each other to a side which played together as a team by the end of the competition.

Sue was wonderful, she was always there to do all of the dirty work (washing our uniforms). She made our stay very enjoyable because she organised our day trips and generally she took great care of us.

The whole team appreciated Kerrie's and Sue's effort which they put into the side and we would recommend this trip to any developing hockey player.

## UMPIRES BOARD REPORT

The Umpires Board in 1995 continued to work with the strategies introduced in 1994. Some clubs have embraced the plans to develop their umpires which is very gratifying. Unfortunately there are other clubs who continue to stick their heads in the ground and hope everyone else will carry their umpiring load. Clubs have been reminded throughout the season that penalties will be introduced in 1996 for clubs who cannot supply umpires of the same standard as the grades they play. Although this may sound harsh, clubs who constantly work to develop their umpires like their players are tired of carrying the load for these clubs.

The strategies used in 1995 to help clubs develop their umpires were:

1. A meeting for all Umpires, Team Captains, Coaches and two additional team members who would use the turf venues in 1995. This meeting was conducted by Jan Hadfield and covered the new rules and interpretations for 1995. This meeting was better attended than any held previously, but still fell short of attracting the numbers required to ensure the correct information was held by all clubs. This lack of understanding of the rules particularly at the top level is evidenced unfortunately by the incorrect sideline comments by some club officials and players, perhaps they should make sure they attend preseason talks when directed to in the future.
2. Introduction to Umpiring talks were again offered to all clubs at their clubhouses. Unfortunately many clubs did not take advantage of this service. They continue to think that as clubs they have only to train their players to play. Maybe the penalties introduced in 1996 will force them to realise that you cannot have a game of hockey without umpires and therefore their club must make the effort to train as many people as possible to umpire as well as play. The Board continues to offer assistance to teach these people with club talks, clubs must take up the offer if they want to see any improvement.
3. The Players Rules Familiarisation Paper was again held in 1995. 612 people sat for this paper which covered basic rules and BWA Local Rules. A detailed list of the people who sat and their results are listed later in this report. Congratulations to those people and clubs who assisted this by coming to the exam prepared and accepted it as one tool to improve the umpiring in BWA. To those people and clubs who continue to whinge about doing this easy, 30 minute paper - I think you should consider your input into your association BWA. I don't think it is too much to ask. Thank you to Bella Sim and Mrs McDougall for assisting with supervision of this paper.
4. The QWA Exam was held earlier than expected this year by QWA which created a number of problems for our association. I thank the clubs



for their assistance in advising their players of the change of dates. 276 players sat for this exam, full details of these results are listed later in the report. Thank you to the board members and other helpers who marked both the QWHA exams and the Players Rules Paper, this is a time consuming job and is greatly appreciated.

5. Umpires for Field Testing were again called for, with clubs asked to submit one name if they had three teams or less, and three names for over three teams. Again some clubs used this opportunity to develop their umpires, while the same few clubs failed to take advantage of this. Our initial list for testing was 64, some of these people withdrew due to other commitments during the year. Twenty-nine practical badges were awarded in BWHA this year from this group. I congratulate those people on receiving their badges and hope they continue to progress in the umpiring arena. For those people unsuccessful in gaining a badge this year, they will be advised of the areas they need to work on in the future and we hope they will put their names forward again in 1996.

There have been a large number of people who went to State Championships and who were tested for badges, they do not appear in the table following. A detailed list of badge recipients follow in this report.

In 1996 we are hoping to have an Umpires Panel of State B & C Umpires to assist with testing at Downey Park and other administration work in the umpiring arena. We hope the introduction of this panel will enable the State A's and Australian Badge Umpires on the Board to spend more time with umpires to gain State level badges.

My special thanks to Lyn Thomas who as always carried the greatest load in the umpiring front. Unfortunately in this area you all too often receive for your time and effort, abuse not thanks. Clubs must realise that all officials of our association are volunteers and as such do their jobs for the love of the game. Words and actions of thanks are greatly appreciated and are vitally important in recognising volunteers input. Without our volunteers we do not have a working association. The workload of Lyn is huge and vital to the smooth operation of BWA fixtures week in, week out. We owe her a huge debt of thanks.

To Cheryl Kann whose presents at Downey Park most weeks to test umpires was of great assistance to Lyn and the Board, thank you Cheryl on another job well done.

To Jan, Lindy, Kim, Alyson, Michele and Heather thank you for your time and effort with testing, umpires talks and the dreaded marking papers.

It is with much pleasure that I present my final report as Secretary of the B.W.H.A. Junior Association Inc.

The 1995 season commenced for Management on Tuesday 15th November at our Annual Changeover Meeting where we farwelled the old and welcomed the new. Dianne Marsden moved from Management to President, Tess Cuming and Glenys Chatfield joined Management for the first time. A total of 18 clubs affiliated with 93 teams playing in 12 divisions.
