Lyn recalls Mrs Jessop's jelly cake slice and cakes in the canteen at Marchant Park. After moving to Downey Park the Saturday afternoons playing, umpiring, coaching, social Sundays for the opening of the season at Redcliffe, Warwick and Murwillumbah are among her fondest memories.

Sitting at management meetings until after midnight in what is now the Hockey Shop with the westerly winds whistling through the lattice work are also brought to mind.
