PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This year, 2023, BWHA celebrates its 90th year, and what an opportunity for us to reflect on the achievements of this magnificent association.

We have grown to an association of over 3,400 registered players, with 7 winter competitions across 31 divisions. This translates to 272 teams from 18 affiliated clubs playing and/or training at 7 different hockey venues across the Greater Brisbane region every day of the week in the winter season. And it does not stop in the summer, when social programs and indoor competitions take over.

But that is not everything that BWHA and its clubs have achieved. We also recognise the huge contribution that off-field personnel provide - coaches, umpires, technical officials, selectors, managers and volunteers and have ensured that there are also development and training programs in place for them, to ensure that all who wish to participate in some form of hockey can get involved and can be trained and mentored. This is also a huge workload for our clubs, and I thank them sincerely.

This year also had its own challenges. Whilst play and fixtures have bounced back, the recovery of Downey Park facilities from the severe flooding event in February 2022 has been slow and hard work. I am pleased to report that the work is now complete and a big thank you for Kath Proctor for bringing our facility back to full function. One major achievement coming out of the recovery work is that we have sent all our historical records (meeting minute books, player registers, photos, newspaper clippings) to the State Library of Qld, where they have been rehoused

(https://onesearch.slq.qld.gov.au/permalink/61SLQ INST/1113i0/alma99184214379902061) and described (https://collections.slq.qld.gov.au/guide/33695/details), and will be kept in perpetuity in their climate controlled and secure archive.

There has not much involvement of BWHA to date in discussions on what the 2032 Olympic legacy for hockey will look like. The BCC election promise for a hockey turf at Downey Park has not been realised, and no support or conversation with BCC has been forthcoming. We will continue to work with Hockey Qld to promote the cause for more hockey turfs in Brisbane to enable us to continue to grow the game.

We are aware that we need to better promote Hockey Brisbane Inc as the joint body of BWHA and BHA – to reassure clubs and members that we already work together in the scheduling of fixtures, events and club days. And to inform them why scheduling club days is not a simple task when we have a disparate number of teams from different clubs across multiple divisions and venues. This will be tackled with more vigour in 2024.

Our streaming of hockey fixtures via briZHockey continued again this year and included streaming and commentary at both PL1 and PL2 games. In 2024 we would like to commence investigating opportunities for training and skilling up commentators.

A couple of highlights for the year that stand out. The 90th birthday cake that was enjoyed by many at the U11 Southern Cross carnival in August was magnificent. And once again we streamed the Awards night to ensure that all in our community, whether in person or virtually,

could join with us in celebrating the achievements of our many players, officials and volunteers.

I would like to thank all the members of my board and to the BWHA staff for their commitment, enthusiasm and perseverance during the year. To all the dedicated volunteers at club and association level – thank you, because without you we would not be such a successful association.

And last but certainly not least, I end my report by sincerely thanking Kath Proctor who has tendered her resignation after 32 years at BWHA. We have worked together for 18 of those years and Kath's support and work effort has been second to none. Thank you.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Efforts to install a synthetic surface at Downey Park have stalled with Brisbane City Council unable to meet its 2020 election commitment for such a facility due to the cost of the 2022 floods. Whilst we acknowledge the blow to the community these floods caused, our inability to grow our sport due to lack of contemporary facilities continues to provide challenges.

Whilst Downey Park would always be our preferred site for an additional synthetic surface in Brisbane, it is recognised growth in and around the inner city is changing flooding patterns and this site may not be suitable without significant investment in an elevated surface. We will continue to look for options and solutions.

With another local government election due in 2024, the Association will approach all parties to seek their intentions to provide facilities for our sport. Members are encouraged to ask similar questions of candidates so our sport and its needs are promoted at any opportunity.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The eighty-ninth BWHA AGM was held on Tuesday 22nd November, 2022. Our 2022 **Volunteer of the Year Awards** were presented to *Larissa Cunliffe-Jones* (Juniors) and *Bron Morris* (Seniors). Service Awards for 10 and 15 years of service to BWHA were presented and new Life Member *Christine Blanchard* acknowledged.

At the end of 2022, planning meetings were undertaken and we looked forward to a "normal" season in 2023. We would be celebrating BWHA's 90th year in 2023. We were still finalising flood repairs and replacements, but all seemed positive for season 2023.

Following the devastating 2022 flood and realising just how close it was to entering the top floor of the clubhouse, it was decided to donate our Archives going back to 1933 to the State Library. This will ensure the safe storage of this information, and once catalogued will be available for anyone to access. We were also advised that we would no longer be able to gain flood insurance, so we have created a Flood Insurance Fund, to ensure we have money to repair and replace when the next flood comes along (hopefully not for many years).

It had been recognised that clubs were looking for a more stable pathway for their talented juniors into Senior hockey, so the possibility of PL4, played on Saturday afternoon, was raised and clubs overwhelmingly supported it. There was enough available turf in Brisbane on Saturdays as BHA often travel to the Gold Coast for Saturday fixtures. Thanks to Di and her committee and Kathryn in the office for working through this process to provide another option for club development.

The BWHA Office closed for it's Christmas break on the 16th December reopening on the 16th January 2023.

The first Council Meeting of 2023 was held on the 24th January and included a full induction for club officials provide by Kathryn Austen This provided explanations and examples of the information required of clubs during the year. Thank you to all the club volunteers who give so much to our sport. A Masters Committee was established to assist with the promotion of Masters hockey in BWHA, thanks to Kellie Roberts who was chair of this committee. The year was going to be busy with many development and representative programs, 90th Birthday celebrations and Turf and Grass competitions.

BWHA has always placed a high level of importance on developing our players and officials. We currently have two dedicated staff members who provide opportunities from Introduction to Hockey to State level training, from U7 to Masters, everyone in BWHA has the opportunity to learn from these amazing women. In fact, we are currently the only association in the South East Corner to have people qualified to run Level 1 and 2 Coach courses. This does not happen by chance, but by the vision of our Board (past and present) and the outstanding staff we have (past and present), thanks and congratulations Amy and Miesh for all the work you do for our members (and hockey people throughout SEQ).

The Rasey Park working bee was completed in January, ready for the JTAS Primary Schools competition held there each February/March. The working bee for Downey Park was held on the 18th March to begin the season and the end of season working bee held 9th September, we thank all clubs for their support in these. Some clubs ask why they should assist with this, there are many reasons, including it is part of the affiliation requirements, grass teams don't pay additional money to play on the grass surfaces, while the Turf players do, clubs are given an opportunity to fundraise each year at Downey & Rasey Park. Thank you, Lesley Bennett, Bron Morris and Kellie Roberts who supervised these.

February saw all our Grading and Fixture Committees very busy, receiving affiliations, organising gradings and then handing on to the Fixture committees to provide fixtures for all divisions for the full season. Thank you to all the members of these committees and the Chairs Di, Lesley, Kellie, Judy. They worked closely with Kathryn in the office to get the draws into the database in a timely manner.

The start of the season was again the joint (Hockey Brisbane Inc) "Gala Day" to celebrate the opening of the season with 5 men's and 5 women's division 1 games all played at the same venue on the same day, a special day for everyone to celebrate hockey in Brisbane. We also showcased some BWHA memorabilia to acknowledge our 90th Birthday and fun activities. Hockey Brisbane Inc is the joint association of BHA and BWHA where we work together to provide shared goals and resources. We currently work together on turf competitions and events and meet with both BHA and BWHA clubs to understand the priority for clubs in

Brisbane. While we are aware that clubs want club days as a priority, while we have different team numbers in divisions across all turf competitions, the ability to achieve full club days is limited by this, not limited by being separate associations. It is extremely disappointing that Hockey Queensland now believe they have the right to determine our future. It seems short-sighted during this time of immense population growth in the South East Corner of Queensland to limit associations to one per LGA, when we should be looking to increase the number of associations and grow our sport across the region. Parents want a sport close to home, hockey needs to provide that option (like soccer and netball) if we want to grow. I would like to acknowledge the work with members of BHA especially my counter-part Kim Rendell, Greg Swann and Ron Marsden who have been heavily involved in HBI and BHMG with me over the past 15 years.

Thanks to Noala and John for all their work to get the fields prepared for hockey at Downey and Rasey Park and to Jan, Clair and Mal who volunteer time to assist. Unfortunately, our biggest challenge continues to be the football boots and organised social soccer groups who believe it is their right to rip up our fields and break our goal nets each week. They pay no money for maintenance or repair and despite our right as lease holder to exclude them, they simply do not care and do not obey directives. We are working with the BCC to try and reduce this impact, but it often feels like a losing battle. We also have many schools use the fields across the year and Taekwon-do use the clubhouse once a week.

The repair following the 2022 floods to the downstairs area of the Downey Park clubhouse allowed the canteen to be re-established down there with better layout and storage. The results were great. Thanks to Carol for all her hard work organising this and to the supervisors Sarah and Tom. We would dearly like a part-time Convenor to look after the Canteens and Bar, doing the ordering, stock control and staffing, so if you know of anyone who may be interested, please let the office know. The Bar initially was staffed by Te'are but she was unable to finish the year off, so a number of others assisted until Bruce stepped in the finish the season. Thanks Bruce, you're a champ. The Sports Trainers Karen and Peter were great at Downey Park, we appreciate your knowledge and capacity to calmly deal with many incidences. Thank you also to Maree who often lent a hand when needed. Lorraine also returned downstairs to the office, while the view isn't as good, she was again more accessible to our members who rely so heavily on her knowledge and kindness. Thanks, Lorraine, for your 10 years of dedicated service to BWHA.

Numbers were down a bit this year across all ages, there may be many reasons for this, the economic pressures, the urge to travel now that COVID lock downs have passed, or changes in work practices. We know all clubs are working hard to re-establish their membership and engagement with their local community.

Our Umpires and Technical Committee continue to work to provide the best officials for our games and development pathways for them. Thanks to Sonya and her Committee for their work, and our Umpire and Technical Stewards for the hundreds of allocations you do each month. Unfortunately, a few PL1 coaches were spoken to about their sideline behaviour and clubs reminded about behaviour expectations in lower divisions. To allow us to continue to provide the best umpire and technical officers we can, we need clubs to ensure all their members, supporters and officials abide by our codes of conduct. There is never a valid reason to abuse or denigrate anyone. If you walk past bad behaviour, then you condone it; your

actions good or bad can change an experience for everyone; be part of the solution, not the problem!

Much time has been spent this year on the proposed "2032 Olympic Hockey Legacy" the proposed placement of drop-in turfs at Ballymore seems such a waste of money, when we are crying out for more turfs in our region. Work is continuing, and we hope a better solution can be found.

We sent teams and personnel to all state championships and regional tournaments in 2023, sending an extra team to the Masters, making a total of 7, which did stretch our numbers at the end due to numerous withdrawals. This however, raised the potential for extra under aged teams in the future. So in 2024 we will send 5 teams to the State U16 and State U14 championships. Noting the change in age groups which will come into effect in 2024. These age group changes at HQ/HA level mean that BWHA will also change its competition age groups in 2024. Thank you to all our Representative Team Coaches, Managers, Umpires, Selectors as well as Amy and Miesh who oversee every program to ensure consistency and equity for all our members.

Our Junior Committee again looked after the largest section of our association. Thanks to Sue Reid who took over the role of Committee Chair to assist with the smooth running of this important area of our sport.

At the U11 Southern Cross we included a celebration of our 90 years, it was great to see Life Members and Sponsors at the event and a cake cutting to share with all the children. It was a special day, where hockey truly was the winner.

Hockey Australia and Hockey Queensland encouraged all hockey associations to support special events in our calendar. This year we acknowledged through our social media and general communications, Men's Round, Women's Round, Pride Round, and the Indigenous Round. A special thanks to the Anno Family who assisted with providing guidance and indigenous artwork to celebrate that round and presented us with mementos and artwork for the clubhouse.

BWHA retained Paul Mills and briZHockey telecasts in 2023. While this is a significant outlay, it provides a unique service to our hockey community. Thank you to Paul for being the driving force behind this and the volunteer commentators who makes themselves available each week. In 2023 we did not use BP as a filming venue due to issues with scaffolding regulations, but we are working through these issues to again film at BP in 2024.

Like many of you I started my involvement in hockey to play (1972), fell in love with the game and then volunteered at club, then association and then state level as an umpire, coach, tech and administrator; laid pavers at the clubhouse with Noala and Denise in the 80's, carpet squares in the downstairs office with Sue in the 90's, and scrubbed toilets and slushed through mud with the best of us during every decade, whatever was needed. I have worked with some of the best female administrators going around and each have taught me something important and unique. I wish BWHA all the best for the future.

TREASURER'S REPORT

While I am the elected Treasurer, the Association's financial administration is currently spread across the staff of BWHA, with only monthly review by both me and the Board of Management.

The audited Financial Statements for the year ending 30 Sept 2023 are at the end of this annual report. The Association was unable to renew its flood insurance in late 2022, following the devastating floods of February 2022. Unfortunately, this was the case for many SEQ sporting organisations as historically most are in flood-prone areas. So, a Flood Insurance Fund account was established (end of year balance \$30k) and we will continue to contribute to it as part of our risk management (noting \$176,222 was receipted in 2023 from our March 2022 Flood Insurance Claim).

Key points:

- Total Income was up (even after normalising for the flood claim "income")
- With the full return to service of our Canteen, sales were up from \$48k (2022) to \$82k (2023)
- Net Profit \$8k (2023), was down from the previous year, largely due to increases in staff and facility running costs

Looking forward, the Board has resolved to migrate our accounting package to Xero to help deliver efficiencies in how we operate as well as provide greater visibility into the financial management of our association. This follows the lead of both HQ and HA who have migrated to Xero over recent years.

BRIZHOCKEY REPORT

The briZHockey contract (with LSB Australia / Paul Mills) for the 2023 season allowed for 22 weeks of coverage (up to a total of 44 games) which was again exceeded due to Paul's generosity including coverage of the PL4 Grand Final for the first time. Highlights of the games were also posted to YouTube and Facebook (both delivered a small revenue stream from advertising).

In 2023, our coverage of PL1 was again sponsored by Joan Pease MP (Lytton) and Bart Mellish MP (Aspley) – who both continue to actively champion women's sport. But in 2023 we also gained a new sponsor, Echelon Automotive (Missenden family) who sponsored the PL2 coverage. So BWHA owes a big THANKS to our sponsors.







Peter Smith returned for 2023 and with some great guest commentators (particularly for finals), contributed hugely to the success of what is delivered for BWHA.

In 2023, we obtained agreement from HQ to film from on top of the technical bench on SHC2 which allowed more games to be covered in the finals. Also, off the back of our contract with Paul, BHA was able to arrange for the live-streaming of their finals – which was a significant benefit to their members.

FIXTURES & GRADING

TURF

In our 90th year, we celebrate not just an historic milestone but also the birth of new opportunity for our player base in Brisbane hockey. Our mission as a committee is to organise and manage a competitive and enjoyable hockey competition for all participants in the Brisbane Women's Hockey Association, and this season we made significant progress in fulfilling this mission with the addition of Premier League 4. In its inaugural year, this division has reshaped the hockey landscape in the BWHA competition offering an innovative solution

to meet the evolving needs of clubs, players, and the broader hockey community. Since 2012, BWHA has witnessed a steady increase in Senior Turf club affiliations, accompanied by growing demand for additional Sunday teams. Recognising the pressing need for increased flexibility, the Premier League 4 (PL4) Division was introduced. This initiative not only catered to the clubs' demands but also fostered competitive balance, providing opportunities for younger players, and supporting the growth of all players, goalkeepers, and umpires. PL4 has also given clubs the opportunity of mixing senior and junior experiences and allowed for a great competition for those looking to develop and giving those still wanting to play Saturday turf an opportunity to do so. In terms of what this has delivered for the competition in its first year, all clubs have provided positive feedback regarding the impact of the division.

Retaining young players in hockey is a top priority for BWHA, these players represent the future of the sport, and their continued engagement contributes to sustained growth. Additionally, nurturing young talent enhances player development, promotes community engagement, encourages a healthy lifestyle, builds a strong leadership pipeline, and fosters diversity in the sport. By prioritizing the retention of young players, BWHA aims to strengthen our foundations for a thriving and inclusive hockey community.

While the season was largely successful, we did encounter a few challenges juggling many different pressures that impact on our fixtures. We moved preference of PL1 from the 3pm & 4.30pm timeslots to a fairer mix of timeslots for all Saturday divisions, as our focus was to ensure all members could benefit from the timeslots. Unfortunately, Club days and requests are not always possible due to the division's sizes, different teams in the men's & women's competition, briZHockey filming & BHA's use of Gold Coast venues. These variables limit the availability for joint men & women days. We however, commit to working with BHA, as we always have to find the best solutions to give clubs the opportunities they seek.

As we move forward into the 2024 season, we are committed to building upon the successes of 2023. The Fixture and Grading Committee will continue to work closely with BHA, BWHA members, teams, and stakeholders to ensure the league's continued growth and success. We aim to address any ongoing challenges and implement improvements based on feedback and lessons learned. Premier League 4 will remain a focal point of our efforts, providing a nurturing ground for young talent.

I would like to express my gratitude to the members of the Fixture and Grading Committee - Jenny Heron & Anna Mehonoshen, whose dedication and hard work made the 2023 season a success. I also want to thank all participating teams, coaches, players, and officials for their contributions to the competition's vibrancy.

Finally, I extend my appreciation and thanks to the office staff who work hard every day to deliver players services in particular Kat Austen who keeps me on track all season.

MASTERS

The 2023 Masters Fixtures and Masters Grading committee's members were Kellie Roberts, Lesley Bennett, Caroline Schomberg and Pam Nitarski.

2023 saw 4 divisions with 6 teams in MM1 and 7 in MM2-4.

As a committee we rely on BWHA masters clubs to be grading their players and teams into the appropriate division, anecdotal feedback is received during and at the end of most seasons which would indicate that this is not always successful.

In the interests of fairness and equity, the committee's aim was to achieve parity as best we could between the teams in each division, without making adjustment or movement to the club affiliations. It was difficult to separate some MM2 and MM3 teams, so the solution put forward was to run the first round as a joint MM2/MM3 competition, at the end of which the top 7 teams would continue the season in MM2 and the following 7 in MM3. Although it did provide a clear line between the two groups of 7 teams, this trial had some problems.

With limited turf available and the competition currently limited to 28 teams, the Masters Fixtures and Masters Grading committees in consultation with the Masters Committee will continue to look to improve the Monday Masters competition.

GRASS

Grass Grading

With only 35 teams nominating for senior grass in 2023, the grass grading committee, consisting of Lesley Bennett, Margie Brown, Lisa Donaldson, Tracey O'Connor, Sarah Sheppard and Maree Whitchurch, was faced with the problem of how to balance the divisions to provide a fair and equitable competition. In previous years, having 8 team divisions led to having to play every available weekend, including masters weekend when many players and officials are away. This year the committee attempted to increase the number of teams in each division, which meant there were uneven numbers of teams in DP1, 2 and 4 all with 9 teams and 8 teams in DP3. There were complaints that the 9 team divisions had too many weekends off, and DP3 teams played too many games. In an effort to make the competition more equitable and build up the number of teams in DP1, the committee decided that it was necessary to have 2 teams from both Norths and Commercial in DP1. Both the Norths and Commercial teams finished in the top 6 which proved that they would have been too strong in a lower division.

Grass Fixtures

The 2023 season ran much more smoothly than 2022, with no rain interruptions or teams affected by waves of illness as had happened over the previous two years. Thanks to the work of BWHA grounds staff the grass was in excellent condition at the beginning of the season and lasted through to the finals. Most club requests for specific times and separation of teams were catered for in the draw. With the spread of clubs through the divisions it wasn't possible to cater for requests to have club days at home grounds in conjunction with the men's teams, as the opposition teams would have to be at a disadvantage by playing away from Downey Park.

UMPIRE & TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

In 2023, the Umpire & Technical Committee had nine dedicated members who also worked closely with the office staff to deliver good outcomes for members.

Rule of the Week - In 2023, a group of our national panel umpires worked on the rule of the week that is published via social media channels. This continues to be a very good way of engaging with our members and continues to be shared widely by many other hockey clubs and Associations across Australia.

Technical Allocations – Jenny Heron again worked tirelessly on the senior turf technical allocations and recruiting new technical personnel and Kathryn Austen, the Competitions, Database & Events Officer, completed the Junior Turf technical allocations.

Umpiring Allocations – Judy Hartnett handled grass allocations and Kathryn Austen continued with the tough job of senior turf allocations.

Mentors / Assessments – Miesh Elmes, BWHA Development Officer, continued to find umpire mentors and assessors to ensure as many umpires as possible could receive feedback and / or be assessed.

BWHA members continue to support HQ, HA, FIH and World Masters events by providing many umpires and technical personnel (both appointed and self-funded). We again congratulate our members who took on positions as Tournament Directors, Technical Managers, Umpire Coaches, Umpire Managers and as appointed Umpires and Technical Officials.

The BWHA Development team and Volunteers also provided access to courses throughout the year to assist clubs develop umpires and technical personnel.

Special Session - July 2023

This focused on how as an Association, we might collaboratively work together to increase umpire numbers / improve umpire experience / elevate the importance of umpires and club umpire development. Every club in our association was represented (58 people in total) and the engagement and willingness to work together to find a way forward was very encouraging. The outcomes are per below.

TURF UMPIRES STEWARD'S REPORT

30 senior turf fixtures were played every Saturday and Sunday this season with PL2, PL3, ML2 and ML3 all having byes in their competitions. This required 60 umpires to be available to officiate these fixtures each weekend, which I would like to thank all of those who regularly or casually umpired during the season. Your contribution to our game does not go unnoticed.

The 2023 season saw the introduction of Premier League 4 on a Saturday afternoon which was a successful addition to our senior turf competitions. This added Saturday division allowed our newer and less experienced umpires the opportunity to umpire Saturday senior turf games which is a preference for many, and also allowed a number of players the ability to play and umpire on the same day which resulted in clubs having an opportunity to add additional umpires to their register this season. While a number of clubs are struggling to fulfill the required number of umpires per affiliated division they enter, the PL4 division became a stepping stone for many umpires looking to further their skills or stay active in the game on the same day as they play.

Clubs need to keep ensuring that they are developing umpires and helping them transition from junior grass, to junior turf, then to senior grass and ML1-3 senior divisions and finally up to PL1-4. While we are very fortunate to have a large number of umpires who want to umpire every week, at times during the season they are injured, sick, have private events to attend or are away at State and National tournaments and their allocations need to be covered by players and umpires who can officiate at all levels by those within your club. We need to ensure our player umpire pool is still engaged in officiating and being able to step in and replace club umpires across all divisions during the year, so keeping umpires engaged in 3-4 allocations a season in the turf divisions will assist clubs in keeping a healthy and able body of umpires each season.

The challenge of clubs just naming all players as umpires or not having enough umpires for all the divisions they affiliate proved difficult to manage again this season and with the combination of turf venues, timeslots and different clubs across divisions, this added to the difficulties presented each week. Thank you to all those umpires who did multiple games a weekend, or even on the same day at short notice travelling from 1 venue to another – this is truly the wonderful umpire culture we have in our Association and I thank you all very much, something that many of our hockey community do not see or appreciate. Your dedication to our sport, those small sacrifices you made every week, is what is really valued in our sport. Thank you for your dedication to BWHA, allowing our players to have an umpire officiate on their game each week and play the sport we all love and enjoy.

This year, some of our most experienced umpires had personal joys in their lives and we missed having them on the field. To Emily, Kate, Kerryl and Tara — congratulations on your new arrivals. With so much valuable experience unavailable this year, this gave our young and upcoming umpires the opportunity to officiate regularly on Premier League 1 games and others the opportunity for promotion up to Premier League 2. These umpires embraced the challenge and we are very proud of their efforts this season. Thank you to our Australian and Level 2 umpires who provided match day support as co-umpires and mentors to the next generation coming through in PL1 and PL2 divisions. Congratulations to the following umpires who completed their first Premier League 1 games this season — Sara Davidson, Madyson Jones, Amy Kopittke and Ashleigh McKeon.

I look forward to working with you again in 2024.

GRASS UMPIRES STEWARD'S REPORT

The senior grass competition at Downey Park this year consisted of 35 teams compared to 36 teams in 2022. Each week 32 umpire allocations needed to be filled (4 divisions had byes). A difference in 2023 was 2 division had more than one team in each division. While turf divisions need to allocate umpires to games involving their own clubs due to differing venues this is avoided at Downey Park. The extra teams in divisions, keeping umpires off games involving their own club and ensuring allocations avoided times when the umpires were playing themselves made the allocation of umpires an interesting but achievable challenge each week.

Most umpires of senior grass games are senior grass players which has been the case for many years. Some clubs did manage to include younger developing umpires in their umpiring lists in 2023 but most of these were fill-ins rather than regulars. So as in previous years the umpires on the park were the same DP 'regular' umpires many of whom have been the regulars for many years. This does lead to consistency but also results in teams having the same umpire regularly. It is a shame that the senior grass competition at Downey Park continues to be an overlooked opportunity for developing umpires. The challenge of finding umpires for senior grass games should the current regulars stop playing and / or choosing to stop playing and umpiring is still a potential concern for this competition.

I would like to thank the clubs for their flexibility to accommodate changes to allocations, sometimes at the last moment when umpiring problems arose. The Downey Park hockey community continues to be supportive, friendly and the atmosphere on the park each week is great to be part of.

I would like to again recommend that clubs consider senior grass on Saturday afternoons as an opportunity to develop their umpires. There are many experienced umpires at Downey Park who can support them on games.

COMPETITIONS: RECORDING & REPORTING (MATCH SECRETARY REPORT)

TURF

This year there were 64 teams from 14 Clubs playing Senior Turf which is 4 less than 2022, and there was also a change in divisions with an extra division (PL4) being added on Saturday making 42 teams, and only 22 teams playing in 3 divisions on Sunday. Grading of teams resulted in Byes being played in PL2, PL3, ML2 & ML3 Divisions.

Modern life with conflicting weekend family and work commitments is causing problems with availability for players for Clubs on two fronts.

First of these problems is that there were quite a number of players who played 3 games regularly and even occasionally 4 games over a weekend, which surely creates an increased risk of injury and burnout to loyal Club Players.

The second problem for Clubs this season was that there were 38 players from 9 of 12 multiteam Clubs who were reregistered in a higher team for playing 3 rounds in the higher team without playing in their registered team.

These current times of rolling substitutions and increased outside family and work commitments should make Clubs think of teams being a squad of 13 or 14 players rather than the basic 11 players which could reduce both the increased risk of injury &/or burnout, and also having players being upgraded for not playing in their registered teams for 3 consecutive rounds.

Many thanks to Clubs, Kath Proctor and particularly Kathryn Austen for their continued advice, encouragement and support.

Season 2023 saw a return of a full season with no major disruptions due to weather or pandemics.

Another mention to all the team managers of each representative team – the lengths they go to in ensuring each task is met to a high standard is incredible. We're thankful for your time.

We are excited to explore taking away additional representative teams in each age group in 2024, which will require even more volunteers than normal.

Without volunteers in these positions, our representative teams struggle to operate as smoothly as they do. BWHA is always seeking nominations from all members and willingly gives support to anyone who would be interested in filling one of these roles in 2024.

Umpires were exposed to Introduction to Umpiring clinics, Turf & Grass Umpires Talks and the Umpire Mentor Workshop as well as many BWHA mentors out on the grounds. Many clubs took advantage of our services regarding umpiring development and held Umpiring Development Clinics, and our representative umpires were also provided a Representative Umpire Workshop ahead of their respective State Championships.

We successfully ran a **Level 1 Coach** course (26 total participants) in conjunction with a **Level 2 Coach** course (14 participants), which included coaches travelling from the Sunshine Coast, Warwick, Gold Coast and Tweed to attend.

Our U14 & U16 Development Camps expanded, with us taking an additional 2 teams away – we were delighted to give 64 players this opportunity.

2024 will be a new and exciting year with the shift in representative age groups, along with a significant change in tournament timings, which provides us an opportunity to revise our current processes and have a fresh approach.

Looking forward to 2024.

DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

2023 was another busy season for the development team at Brisbane Women's Hockey Association.

We visited 9 different clubs during the year to support player and coach development. There were 9 Sporting Schools programs, 12 Hockey 4 Kids programs and we attended 8 Gala Days.

In term 4 we have established a new program called the Term 4 Schools Roadshow. This program gives schools an opportunity to have a free come and try hockey session. So far, we have 10 schools registered. At this program we hand out flyers for our Hockey 4 Kids programs to the participants. We're already seeing great success with this program.

We successfully accredited 26 junior and senior umpires, with many gaining representatives' honours at State, National and International level.

TOURS, APPAREL, UNIFORMS AND EQUIPMENT REPORT

It has been wonderful to have a full year of Representative Tournaments in 2023 after the past 3 years of cancellations due to lockdowns and weather events.

In 2023, 25 teams Represented Brisbane Women's Hockey Association at State Championships and Southern Cross Tournaments, from our youngest U11 players to our Senior Hockey Queensland Championship Team. We continue to see strong numbers of players attending trials in all age groups. At late notice we added a 7th team to our Masters contingent and due to a bye in one division we worked quickly 2 weeks prior to add a 5th U11 team. The sheer joy on the faces of the Brisbane 5 team at the U11 Southern Cross was beautiful to witness and reminds us how much of a privilege it is to have an opportunity to represent your Association.

Apparel

In 2023 an updated Training Singlet was available to purchase by our Representative players. Thank you to Echelon Automotive for their sponsorship of these singlets which reduced the cost to players. These singlets were well received by players. They have increased sun protection and breathability with a more modern design. As our representative players need to update to the next size from the old-style singlets, we will see the entire group wearing these for each of our Junior Representative training sessions. Masters can purchase these singlets if they wish to.

An increased size range in the Anorak Jackets was well received by our younger players.

Requests from Masters Players to look at the BWHA playing socks to increase the calf width and durability have resulted in a change of supplier for 2024. New playing socks have been ordered from Thin skins (Select Sports) and the range of sizes has increased. There may be a very slight change to the shade of the cherry colour however not vastly different. Cost will also increase slightly.

Visor supply continues to be an issue with sizing of the current visors suitable for only the smallest U11 head. A new supplier in 2024 should hopefully resolve this issue.

Shorts continue to be a requested item. BWHA are hoping to reintroduce a shorts option in 2024 pending cost and design. We are working with Grays to develop a pair of shorts available as an optional merchandise item for our representative players.

Increased purchases at the start of the season ensured there was adequate supply of all items during the season even with the addition of unplanned extra teams.

Uniform & Equipment

BWHA uniforms are holding up in style and wear in 2023. The number of uniform needing replacing due to damage each year continues to be in low numbers. As the stock ages, more will be replaced whilst balancing against sizings needed for each age group. Skirts remain an area needing continued larger renewal.

With the late inclusion of the 7th Masters team there was a shortage of the regular uniforms for this team. To navigate this, the Brisbane 1 team were given approval by HQ to wear the

Brisbane Hockey Queensland Championship uniform for the Masters Tournament. These uniforms looked very smart on the Masters 1 players and player feedback noted they were very comfortable and they would be happy to wear in future tournaments. There is only one set of 16 of these uniforms available.

The late inclusion of the U11 Brisbane 5 team saw a similar problem with not enough small sized uniforms. To navigate this shortfall, the old style U11 representative shirts were used. These shirts were limited in sizes and had been held unworn for a few years since the change to the U11 teams wearing the BWHA uniform rather than purchasing a shirt for this one-day tournament. The girls looked great. With limited sizes in skirts and colours each of the U11 teams wore a slightly different combination of the cherry or white shirts, cherry and blue skirts with cherry or yellow socks.

Work is being undertaken to source and replace the Orange GK smocks and renumber to comply with HQ requiring all numbers under 99. We have a number of orange smocks numbered over 100. We are trying to source some Orange Short sleeve smocks which GK's have been asking for.

Thank you to the team managers who provided enormous assistance at uniform fittings and apparel sales mornings held during the season. It's impossible to run these mornings as smoothly as we do without manager assistance.

Each of our representative teams is given a ball bag with 18 balls and 20 markers for training and the tournament. Thank you to our teams for looking after these items. Some teams were great at keeping track of their team's equipment. Unfortunately, a larger than normal number of teams bought back less than half of the balls their team had been allocated. All teams are reminded to please ensure they collect and count the balls after each session or warm up. Whilst at tournaments it does often happen that balls go into areas that are unreachable, ideally the full amount is returned after the tournament or only a small number missing. We are grateful for team support to ensure team equipment is available for the next age group.

BWHA have some wonderful shade tents which are available for our teams to take to Southern Cross tournaments or State Championships (provided no flights required). With all tournaments in the SE corner in 2024 these will be a great option for our teams to provide a central area at tournaments for our teams.

Tours

In 2023, we had a mix of air and bus travel required for our teams. U18's travelled to Cairns, Masters to Toowoomba. The HQC team played in Brisbane, U13's to a soggy rain filled Sunshine Coast and our U15's to a hot Mackay.

Thank you to Travel Associates who assisted with our flight and car hire bookings making the process very smooth to manage for our U18's and U15's. To Maleny Coachlines who transported our U13's and shuttled the group every day between the accommodation and fields. These turned out to be very long days with an adjusted draw due to poor weather.

Our 7 Masters teams were split amongst 5 accommodation venues. Whilst it would be ideal to have a number of teams together at the same level of accommodation, other events on in the city at the time and the sheer number of beds required for the BWHA Masters contingent

continue to make that a difficult proposition. All efforts are made to find similar levels of accommodation for teams and keep multiple teams together where possible.

Similarly in Mackay we were unable to keep the 4 teams together. Proximity to fields is a prime consideration to minimise travel time each day for teams in addition to costs for accommodation and facilities offered.

The decision as to which team stays at which venue is often down to the bedding available at each venue and the male/female ratio of coach/manager officials. At no time is team number a consideration as to which team stays at which venue. As we look to increase teams across a number of age groups in 2024, it is proving difficult to keep all teams at one venue. Work will continue in this space to manage the movement of teams across tournaments from split venues and keeping multiple teams together where possible.

In 2024, all tournaments will be held in the SE QLD corner. All junior teams will travel by bus with Maleny Bus lines. Masters will make their own travel arrangements as is standard for this age group.

With a number of changes to the timings of tournaments and two being held significantly earlier than usual it will get the representative season off to a quicker start than normal. The new HQ age groups will also see no junior players ageing into a new representative age group for this transition year (other than U18's ageing out into HQC age group).

Plans are in place to increase the size of some of our representative groups which will be an exciting addition. To support these plans additional accommodation, uniforms and equipment is being added. Extra teams will require an increase in volunteer assistance for coaches, managers and umpires. We are grateful for all those who offer to take on one of these roles and we will continue to assist them as much as possible with their tournament preparation.

Thank you also to our players' continued enthusiasm and in particular our junior representative player families for their support getting them to trials and trainings. As tour costs continue to rise with cost of living rises, families are continuing to support their young athletes as they compete at this level. Our Masters players enthusiasm for State Championship tournaments is growing and we are thrilled to see our successes continue at these tournaments. The passion for Masters hockey continues to grow each year.

CANTEEN & BAR REPORT

Canteen

2023 was an opportunity for the first full year of the canteen in a number of years. Having negotiated covid and then floods at the start of 2022, we were delighted to have the Downey Park Canteen works completed for the start of the 2023 season.

Work to change the design of the canteen area providing direct access from the canteen to a storage area and cold room made a world of difference for the canteen. With the increased adjacent space this enabled all freezers and the cold room to be in the storage area along with sufficient shelving space. This freed up space in the canteen to allow a greater flow through the canteen itself.

New appliances including a larger cooktop, deeper chip fryer and industrial sandwich press were well utilised during the season and increased capacity to keep up with demand during lunch rushes and post-game rushes during fixture days.

Whilst the footprint of the main canteen remained the same, the space was utilised better, making it easier for staff to do their job. Thank you to John Robinson for his work getting the store room set up for use with the cold room and shelving including adequate ventilation for the cold room and freezers.

With Just Hockey not operating an onsite store at Downey Park in 2023, the canteen was able to set up a small area behind the main drinks' fridge, yet still visible from the counter, to stock a number of Just Hockey items (mouth guards, shin pads, whistles, balls, captain bands, stick grip, visors etc). These stock items continued to sell during the season and were welcomed by players. Anyone needing more equipment were encouraged to visit the Just Hockey Windsor store only a few minutes away. Thank you to Just Hockey for getting stock to us as needed.

Rasey Park Canteen continued to operate in 2023 for our U7/U9 fixtures and the pre-season JTAS competition. Thank you to our canteen staff who spent time at this venue each week. Bacon and Egg rolls and Sausage on Bread continue to provide an enjoyed breakfast option or post-game snack for our visiting families each week.

The canteen had a larger than usual number of new staff in 2023. Thank you to our established staff members Sarah, Tom, Will, Alison and Jemma for their assistance as the new staff members Eve, Isabelle, Bianca, Ruby, Emma, Gabe and Connor learnt the roles. With holidays, illness, university exams, representative commitments and Term 3 school hockey continuing to cause issues with availability for a number of canteen staff members, it will be useful to have more canteen staff available in 2024.

The U11 Southern Cross/Coulter Shield tournament was a massive day for the canteen. With Men's Masters taking on the BBQ duties this year it was an opportunity to concentrate on the canteen offerings. Special items for the day of Pulled Pork Rolls and Yoghurt cups provided different options and were enjoyed by those who purchased them. With a rainy start and finish to the day, cold items were not as in demand as usual, however burgers and chips were in demand all day. Thank you to the hard-working canteen staff, BWHA staff members and volunteers who helped the canteen for the day.

There is a need to have a Canteen Convenor on site during opening days to assist our junior staff members. Hopefully this can be achieved in 2024.

Bar

It was great to have the Bar back as a bar in 2023 after it being our makeshift canteen in 2022. Te Are Wood was our Bar staff member with our thanks. Thanks also to Bruce Carroll for filling in during the final few weeks of the season.

The bar continues to be open to our visitors to the park on a Saturday afternoon. It is a lovely opportunity for senior teams to come together over a few drinks and a snack after games. Offering a good mix of alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages along with packet chips to compliment the full canteen downstairs. With a wonderful view of the entire Downey Park, it's a lovely spot on a Saturday afternoon to watch the hockey action on the park.

Thank you to our General Manager Kath Proctor for keeping the bar stocked each week with the drinks our patrons want.


GROUNDS REPORT

CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

The Junior Committee supports the provision of hockey for juniors in Brisbane from U7s to U18. We work with the BWHA staff to organise, manage, and support the junior fixture competition including grading. This year the Junior Committee membership was seven members plus the chairperson.

The committee met approximately every month to discuss issues relating to all junior divisions.

Thankfully the 2023 season was not impacted by any pandemic or flooding which was wonderful to get a full uninterrupted season.

I'd like to thank all of the committee members for their efforts in 2023 and hope that 2024 sees us continue to build as a committee and have an influence on the successes of the junior ranks within the Association.

2023 Competition

Junior Turf

The number of junior teams competing on a Friday night in the JT1 to JT4 divisions increased from 34 teams in 2022 to 38 teams in the 2023 season and the U13T1 decreased from 7 in 2022 to 6 teams in 2023.

U13T2 played on a Saturday morning with the number of teams also decreasing from 12 in 2022 to 10 for the 2023 season.

Junior Grass

The number of Junior Grass teams was 51 overall in 2023 JG, U13 and U11 competitions. The under 11 age group retained 4 divisions and saw an increase in the number of teams from 29 in 2022 to 31 in the 2023 season.

The U13 competition started as a combined competitions and was then split into U13A and U13B after the first round of competition. There was a slight decrease in the number of U13 teams in 2023. There was a total of 12 teams in 2022 and 11 in the 2023 season.

Unfortunately, there was a decrease in the number of JG teams competing in the 2023 season. 2022 saw 13 teams playing across the 2 divisions however, this dropped to 9 teams across the 2 divisions for the 2023 season. Hopefully this is due to the increase in teams playing JT divisions and not losing players to the sport.

U7 & U9s

The U7 competition involved a total of 15 teams in 2023 and the U9 competition consisted of 26 teams. The U7 and U9 competition is always fun, and it is wonderful to see so many hockey players starting their playing careers in the BWHA competition.

U11 Southern Cross

The U11 Southern Cross Tournament was held at Downey Park on the 5^{th of} August alongside the Boys U11 Coulter Shield. This one-day tournament is a great introduction to

representative hockey for our young players. In 2023 Brisbane entered 5 teams into the competition.

Following the march past we celebrated BWHA's 90th Birthday with a stunning cake.

Thank you to the many volunteers who supported the Junior Committee in delivering a hugely successful day of hockey for the U11 cohort.

Junior Umpires

The 2023 season continued the approach of clubs umpiring their own team games each week. With BWHA allocating the umpires for semi and grand finals. These allocations were based on umpires identified by clubs along with umpires who had undertaken representative duties during the season.

As you are all aware umpiring is always an area where more needs to be done and the junior committee in consultation with BWHA staff is working on ways to improve the mentoring of our emerging umpires but need to rely on clubs in the first instance to provide the support for first umpiring experiences players have and progressing umpires to the next level.

Mel Blanchard undertook umpire discussion early in the season. This is something we hope to repeat in season 2024 and encourage emerging and beginner umpires to attend.

Notes to and forming part of the Financial Accounts For the year ended 30 September 2022

Note 1: Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 112: Income Taxes AASB 1031: Materiality

ASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are brought to account at cost, less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation. The carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the management committee to ensure that it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flow that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The net expected cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts. The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over their useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(b) Inventories

Inventories of trading stock held for future use are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(c) Income Tax

Income derived by the Association is exempt from income tax in accordance with section 50-20 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

(d) Provisions

Adequate provision is made in the Financial Accounts to cover future liability for-

Note 7: Buildings

During 2020 \$554,286 was provided in the Financials for the construction of a new amenities block on Noble Street of which \$498,000 was provided from a State Government Grant, and the balance spent from BWHA funds. The field 10 building is shown in the Non-Current Assets as a "Constructed Non-Financial Asset" with a corresponding "Constructed Non-Financial Asset" shown in the Capital and Reserves — for the amount of grant funds provided. The Building is on land owned by local authorities, leased to BWHA. The BWHA has no right of recovery of this amount in the event of a termination of the lease. BWHA has a recurring 4 year lease, which will continue for the foreseeable future. BWHA is responsible for the maintenance and care of the building as part of the requirements of the lease.

The historical "Buildings at Cost" at Downey Park and Rasey Park are shown as a Non-Current Asset in the Balance Sheet at a written down value of \$56,474, to reflect the original cost to the Association, and to expend that cost by way of a Depreciation charge annually. As the Buildings are on land owned by local authorities, the BWHA has no right of recovery of this amount in the event of termination of leases. BWHA has a recurring 4 year lease, and see no reason for this to not continue.

All buildings that are reflected in the Depreciation Schedule are currently used for activities conducted by BWHA. The depreciation for buildings is set at rates of 2.5% to 5% per annum depending on the expected replacement time period.

An amount is set aside to put towards the cost of a Turf Facility at Downey Park. During the year to September 2023 interest has been added, and the fund balance at September 2023 is \$314,632.

Note 12: Impact of Floods 2022

BWHA was heavily affected by a flood in February/March 2022, the repairs and insurance payout were finalised in the 2022-2023 year. The flood was the biggest since 1974 and effected all buildings and equipment at Downey and Rasey Parks.
